#### COMMANDER'S NARRATIVE SUMMARY

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During the period covered by this report this Battalion was engaged in active patrolling and agressive Small Unit Action throughout the TAOR. Emphasis has been placed on the close cooperation and mutual support of the local Popular Forces in the area.

Company "E" participated in a series of Company and Platoon sweeps that lasted for 17 days north of the Song Trau River, which is now in the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines sector. They distinguished themselves by the number of hard fontacts made with the Viet Cong. They succeeded in inflicting neavy casualties on the enemy with very light casualties to themselves.

In the southwest part of our TAOR, Company "H", which was located on Hill 76, conducted extensive patrolling to the extreme western (left flank) portion of our TAOR. It was here that the greatest success was made in working with the local Popular Forces. The combined ambushes and patrols, coupled with a friendly attitude toward the people, has resulted in making all but two of the eleven villages amenable toward our civic action program. The PF commander located at KY RHU (2) has stated that these activities have forced the VC into the hills, and that they are getting hungry because they have been denied access to rice and other foodstuffs.

On 15 May 1966 the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines was assigned the responsibility for the TAOR north of the SONG TRAU River. As a result of this change in the TAOR, on 17 May Company "E" returned to the Battalion CP area on Hill 69 from its combat sweeps in the northern portion of the TAOR.

Between 18-20 May 1966 Company "G", that had been located in the Hill 69 Battalion CP area, moved to occupy portions of the right flank (north) of the new Battalion TAOR. They were given the mission of clearing and securing the KUONG NHON (2) area north to the SONG TRAU River from enemy incursions, in support of the occupation of these areas by the Fifth Marines Regimental CP and the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines artillery positions. KUONG NHON (2) has been under VC domination for several years. However, Company "G" has changed that with a series of Platoon and Company size operations that have either resulted in killing or capturing VC or VCS, or in driving them out of the area.

In the same time frame, Company "F", which was under the OPCON of the Chu Lai Defense Command, switched places with Company "H", our western and southern (left flank) of the Battalion TAOR. Company "F" has continued "H" Company's efforts in this area by close cooperation with the PFs and extensive day and night patrolling.



On 23 May 1966 Lieutenant Colonel Walter MOORE relieved Lieutenant Colonel Robert H. USKURAIT as Commanding Officer of the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines.

The Battalion CP on Hill 69 has been devoting its time to coordinating the operations in the TAOR, and commenced improvements in the following areas:

- 1. Reorganizing the perimeter.
- 2. Reconstructing the AN TAN Bridge defensive position.
- 3. Relocating the Battalion Supply and Motor Transport area.
- 4. Improving the logistical status of the Battalian.
- 5. Cleaning up and rehabilitating the company billeting areas.

During the latter half of the month this Battalion exchanged a number of officers and men with units of the 7th and 1st Marines. The purpose of this exchange was to spread out the RTD dates among all the units concerned. This resulted in our receiving more combat experienced personnel from these sources.

Progress in May has been noticeable. A great deal of combat experience has been acquired by the officers and men of this Battalian during this time. Heavy stress is placed on the coordination and use of artillery, tanks, and antos in all types of combat operations. This Battalian intends to stress leadership and battle techniques at all levels, maintenance of equipment, and supply discipline. The morale, Espirit de Corps, discipline and unit efficiency of this Battalian is excellent; however, we intend to continue to demand even higher standards in all fields.

Personnel strengths decreased sharply early in the period due to several large transfers directed by the Commanding General, 1st Marine Division, and the Commanding Officer, 1stMarines. During the period, the number of personnel slated to be rotated during February 1967 was reduced from 80% to 48%. At the close of the period, critical shortages were as follows:

# e. Problem Areas

(1) The only problem that exists is in the area of personnel. At the close of the period, the battalion was understrength 7 Marine Corps officers and 175 Marine Corps enlisted.

#### g. Morale, PX and Postal Affairs

- (1) Morale continues to be excellent.
- (2) Post Exchange service has been adequate. This Battalion continues to utilize the mobile PX. Most necessity items are available; however, convenience items are still non-existent. It would be a great help if the exchange could provide its own transportation to the outlying areas regular basis and make ENCLOSURE (1)

(3) Postal Service has been good, with only oncer two minor breakdowns in the delivery system. This organization hopes to obtain a postal sub-station in the near future to provide package mailing service, postal money and stamp service on a daily basis.

#### h. Chaplain's Activities.

- (1) In the month just completed, the Battalion Chaplain has held Catholic Mass on forty-seven (47) occasions (Sundays and weekdays) for a total of 1025 personnel. These were held in the Battalion area and in the field; plus providing Masses for 1/5, 1/11, 3/7 and, on one occasion, the lst Marine Division CP.
- (2) While working with our troops in the field, services were held for the Protestant men on five (5) occasions with a total of Ninety-nine (99) attending.
- (3) The regular Sunday Protestant Worship services were conducted each Sunday by Chaplain Paul W. PEARSON 2/7 Battalion Chaplain.
- (4) In addition, Chaplain Steven L. BRANDT, Chaplain for Headquarters Battalion, 1st Marine Division, was guest preacher at the Memorial Day Service on 30 May 1966.
- (5) Chaplain Robert REINER, Jewish Chaplain of the I Corps area, conducted Worship Service for the Jewish personnel of ours and the neighboring commands on 31 May 1966. It is hoped that such periodic coverage by the Jewish Chaplain will continue.
- (6) Six Memorial Services were conducted for deceased personnel of this Battalion. Chaplain P. W. PEARSCN assisted at two of these.

- a. Routine intelligence processing during May was accomplished by compiling intelligence information received from 1st Marine Regiment, 1st CIT, 9th ITT, Ly Tin District Headquarters and Tam Ky District Headquarters.

#### SECTION IV - S-3

1. General. The normal problems of a newly-arrived organization to the Republic of Vietnan, in addition to the numerous changes in staff personnel were being resolved during the period covered. The Command Operations Center functioned effectively and efficiently, and personnel of the tactical units familiarized themselves with the terrain within the Battalion testical area of responsibility.

#### 2. Operations.

- as Operation Wyoming, conducted 26 April to 1 May 1966, was successful as evidence by TAB A (Combat After Action Report Operation Wyoming) to enclosure (1).
- b. CO, 1st Marine Regiment Operation Order 301-66 assigned this organization new boundaries on the tactical area of responsibility and 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines Operation Order 301-66 was issued (Tab B to enclosure (1).)
- c. 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines Frag Order 6-66 (TAB C to enclosure (1)), initiated Operation Incinerator which was a joint operation with USMC/Regional Forces/Popular Forces and achieved positive satisfactory results. Supporting arms utilized covered rotary/fixed wing aircraft, artillery, anti-tanks, tanks and organizational organic supporting arms.
- d. Extensive search and destroy missions during the hours of darkness and daylight were conducted during the period.

#### 3. Training

a. Training within the compand was limited to one company and H&S Company personnel due to the tractical structure of having one rifle company ENCLOSURE (1)

detached the majorit of the period. Training accompashed consisted primarily of:

- (1) Combat firing.
- (2) Vietnam orientation.
- (3) Lessons learned.
- (4) Care and operation of equipment.
- (5) Utilization of supporting arms.
- (6) Utilization of new equipment.
- 4. Psychological Warfare. PsyWarfare Operations consisted of the following during the reporting period:
  - a. Distribution of leaflets and pamphlets.
  - b. Seventy-one (71) MEDCAP patrols were conducted and approximately 5,000 patients were treated.
  - c. A psy-warfare plane with loudspeaker was utilized. Results were not assessed,
  - 5. The following was the chronological sequence of events within the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines TAOR for the period from 010001 to 312400 May 1966:

010930H - CoG Plt on sweep vicinity BT451033 apprehended 2 VCS. VCS sent to ITT.

OL173: I - CoG squad patrol recd 25 rounds S/A vicinity BT379147 from 7 or 3 VC. Patrol returned fire. Subsequent search found 4 caves which were destroyed.

Oll600H - Sentry on checkpoint (BT465074) observed child with M-26 grenade. Sentry stopped child and took grenade. As sentry took grenade child pulled pin and ran. Grenade not activated; child not caught.

011415H - CoF detached from operational control of 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines and took over air field defense Chu Lai Defense Command.

Oll415H - 2nd Plt of CoH relieved 1st Plt CoC at Ky Phu.

021150 - CoG patrol recd S/A and A/W fire from approx 10 VC from (BT379151), Patrol returned fire, swept area and found several caves. One VC KIA attempting to use grenade on USMC. Caves destroyed.

022128 - CoG ambush (BT492068) recd one round harassing fire. Seamoned area and discovered two males in open between two houses vicinity (BT48 4069). One man identified himself as being from RMK. Other had no ID. Both VCS sent to ITT. ENCLOSURE (1)

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030910 - CoH discovered network of VC tunnels vicinity (BT444026). Destroyed with 15 M-26 grenades and 14 lbs C-4.

031030 - God patrol (BT384112) recd here; regione S/A from est 30 to 40 VC locate (BE389124). Operation conducted in more until 032015 by elements of God and CoE. During operation, event hamlet at approx 1400H vicinity (BT394126), found 2 VC KIA, observed 4 VC WIA. Heavy volume of S/A & A/W fire recd from (BT380114) at 1500H from estimated 40 VC. Air strike and arty mission fired: 1630H at (BT390114) recd S/A fire fr estimated 30 VC in trenches. Air strike called, results unknown. AC rpt 6 VC heading for high ground at approx 1700H violatty (BT388107), arty mission fired. CoE recd S/A fire fr approx 10 VC (BT392106) at 1750H. Arty fired & area swept. VC broke contact at 1930H. USHC returned CP area 2015H. Friendly losses: 1 KIA, 6 WIA. VC LOSSES: 2 KIA (confirmed), 20 KIA (prob), 6-7 KFA (pos), 4 WIA (confirmed.)

031530 - CoH patrol vicinity (BT436024) recall rounds S/A fr unknown number VC vicinity (BT436024). Blocking force fixed on 5 VC fleeing in vicinity (BT437028) resulting in 1 VC KIA.

031530 - CoH patrol located sizable VC base camp vicinity (BT435020). 3 or 4 VC in immediate area fled. Patrol destroyed ground burker capable of accomodating 30 VC. Also destroyed but that would accomodate 15 VC. Captured 125 rounds 7.62mm, 39 rounds .30 cal, 1 log book, 1 notetook, khaki and black PJ uniforms. Will be forwarded.

040853 - GoE apprehended 2 VCS, with documents, that were running toward high ground vicinity (BT402126). VCS were not armed. No interpreters available for tactical interrogation; held lifted to ITT.

040900 - CoE fr position (BT392112) observed 5 VC in open at (BY390095.) Arty mission fired W?VT 2 VC WIA probable. Searched area, negative results.

040901 - CoE checking damage to trench complex vicinity (BT392114) found extensive damage and two male bodies in freshly dug graves. 2 VC KIA probable.

040910 - CoE vicinity (BT592116) recd unknown no S/A fire fr 3 VC. Arty mission fired. VC fled area.

041000 - CoE (BT388100) reed S/A fire. Returned fire, pursuabd blood trail toward BT385106. 1 VC WIA.

041030 - CoE (BT388118) recd 8 rounds S/A fire fr unknown number VC vicinity BT381119. Fire returned, 1 VC seen running from area.

041045 - CoE (BT386124) recd sporadic S/A, AR & MG fire fr unknown number VC at BT379118. Rice captured (approx 1500 lb) in XUAN NGOC (1). Demo being used in area to blow tunnels.

041200 - CoE Observed 6 VC moving toward BT387101. Fired S/A, arty and air strike. Searched area, found nothing.

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041215 - CoE Plt (bT388107). Unknown explosive detection electrically by VC. Area searched and discovered precently vacated.

30 cal MG position and expended brass.

041230 - CoE rpt destroying four tunnels (BT388105) and 1 cave (BT402105)

041310 - CoE while continuing sweep in vicinity BT388108 observed 7 VC at BT387104. Arty mission fired & UH-1E help pursued. Results unknown.

041430 - Member CoH tripped unknown explosive device vicinity BT441040 resulting in two Marine WIA. One MedEvac.

041542 - CoE (BT385105) observed 20 VC well camoflaged on west side of high ground vicinity BT375105. No fire recd from VC. S/A, arty & napalmifired into area. Estimated 2 VC KIA, 8 VC WIA. Searched area, observed several blood trails.

041900 - GoE (BT378102) captured wounded VC nurse with medical kit.
VCC recd shraphel in stemach and leg. Search of area indicated 10 VC
dragged away. Also revealed large underground room (40 ft long, 5-6 feet wide,
4 ft high w/connecting trench). Room also contained two beds. VCC helo
medevac to MedBn.

C41930 - Perimeter defense (BT465074) observed 3 VC moving through ride paddies vicinity BT466074. VC were armed but did not fine. When fired upon VC fled.

050005 - CoE (BT401127) recd 25 rounds MG fire fr unknown number VC. Fire returned, energy position ceased fire.

050900 - CoH (BT448016) recd 10 rounds S/A fr unknown number of VC in vicinity BT449011. Fire returned, VC broke contact.

051000 - CoH 2nd Plt (BT 437010) discovered two large caves. One contained 5 beds, small amounts of clothing, rations, 2 PRC-10 batteries. Other cave and 7 beds, clothing, compass, map of area, diary and miscellaneous documents. Diary & documents forwarded to ITT.

051115 - CoH 2ndPlt (BT 447014) recd S/A fire. Returned fire and pursued. 1 VC fired on & observed fall from tree. Searched area & discovered 1 Chi Con carbine (ser no. E7882). Continued pursuit wounded 1 VC at approximately BT449011. Searched area & discovered second Chi Con carbine (ser no 01232). 2 VC WIA.

O51350 - CoE called arty at trench line (BT391112). 15 VC observed running nor liwest. Pursued through area & observed 2 heavy and 3 light blood stains. Captured 4 VC. One VC carrying bag of .45 cal anno. 1 Thompson nagazine, suit of black PJs. No bodies found. 2 VC KTA (probable), 3 VC WIA (probable), 1 VCC, 3 VCS.

O52300 Ambush fr CoH in position at BT469045 observed 4 VC entering the ambush site. Patrol leader asked one of the PFs if they were VC. At that time the VC ran. A Marine threw a hand grenade; results, 3 female VCS, 1 nale VCS WIA, all evac by helo. Civil Affairs Officer investigating.

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060001 - 1t fr com at BT438018 recd 5 rounds S/A fire fr BT438016. Plt returned here w/15 rounds S/A & 1 M-79, results unknown.

060200 - Plt fr CoE at BT401150 heard movement below its position & threw rocks down hill in direction of noise. A person came running up the slope, Marine yelled HALT and fired one round, resulting in 2 USMC WIA, both evac by helo.

061225 - Patrol fr CoH at BT441020 located 3 interlocking caves & tunnels. Destroyed with 15 lbs of C-4.

061310 - Patrol fr CoH at BT431032 found barricade erected across trail, in the process of removing barricade with C-4 the patrol recd 2 rounds S/A fire fr BT434033. Patrol returned 15 rounds S/A, negative results.

061145 - Patrol fr CoH at BT445029 found 2 105mm rounds. Patrol picked up rounds to be returned to CP by first available transportation.

070600 - CoE commenced its S&D sweep at 070920 at BT398109 & observed 3 VC noving at BT373112. Arty mission called in, results unknown. CoE recd 10 rounds S/A fr BT386102 & returned fire. Arty was adjusted on VC fleeing in 2 & 3-man groups and avenues of escape. At 071015 CoE assaulted the area at BT39711.2 to evaluate arty fire & captured 3 VCS (males) VCS evac by helo to ITT. At 071030 1stPlt CoE, at BT382106, during the SaD, observed 20 VC with packs & weapons proceeding from BT3610 to BT3710. Are was requested with results unknown.

071000 - Plt S&D patrol fr CoH at BT435043 recd 100 rds S/S fr BT428043. Plt returned fire w.100 rds S/A. VC broke contact; Plt pursued & searched area, results unknown.

071210 - Pit S&D patrol fr CoH recd 60 ids S/A fr BT440055 & BT445045. Patrol returned fire w/ 400 rds S/A / Arty & mortar fire were fired on BT445045 at estimated 15-man VC patrol. Pit assaulted village & a Marine desonated a mine of unknown type resulting in 2 USMC WIA. One USMC WIA help evac to MedBn, other USMC WIA continued on mission. Pit captured h VCS who was evac to ITT. Other results negative.

071910 - CoE in defense perimeter at BT396146 recd 9 rds S/A from 2 VC at BT392149. CoE returned fire w/26 rds S/A and 2 60mm rds. Results unknown.

071950 - Merine within the Battalion perimeter at BT468075 recd a hand grenade. Fire could not be returned as Marine was unable to determine where the grenade came from.

080040 -- CoG, on the Battalion perimeter at BT467071 recd 2 rds 60mm mortar & 15 rds S/A fr BT462078, resulting in 2 USMC WIA. Both were treated at BAS & returned to duty. Perimeter defense returned 600 rds S/A, & VC broke contact. Area checked at first light, negative results.

080845 - CoE on S&D at BT405115 recd 10 rds S/A fr BT406096. 2 VC observed heating toward river. CoE fired 20 rds S/A, pursued & captured 1 VC. Second VC swam river & went into cave from which he threw hand granade. Marine fired into cave w/A5. Results 1 VC KIA. VCC evac by helo to ITT. Cave destroyed w/14 1 bs C-A5.

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080915 - CoE, CP group at BT412098 reed 7512ds S/A r BT416095. CP group returned fire w/40 rds S/A. VC broke contact & fled toward river. CP group unable to pursue are to its support mission, Results unknown.

080930 - Plt S&D patrol fr CoG at BT435078 recd 6 rds S/A fr suspected coord 435093. Patrol assaulted village at BT435093, found pumji stakes & a trench line. Pumji stakes were being destroyed when patrol recd 3 rds S/A fr BT439079. Patrol returned fire w/250 rds S/A and 1 3.5 W.P. Area checked negative results.

081000 - Plt 5&D patrol fr CoH at BT435053 discovered a cave which was destroyed with 14 lbs C-4.

081245 S&D patrol fr CoH at BT420051 found a bear trap & a 250-1b bomb. Bomb destroyed in place with 14 lbs C-4 explosives. Bear trap will be dispatched to Blade.

090110 - Flt of CoG in defensive perimeter at BT 498067 recd 10 rds S/A fire fr BT497063. Plt returned fire w/25 rds S/A & 3 M-79. VC was believed to be in tree at reported coordinates, & Marine heard a thud. Searched at first light, revealed no evidence of VC casualty. 1 VC WIA (probable)

090850 - CoE on S&D mission at BT441099 observed 2 VC in known VC op at BT387102, called in arty. One direct hit on area was observed. Unable to search area we to distance of 5000 meters involved. Results 2 VC WIA (prob)

091120 - Plt patrol fr CoG on S&D mission at BT443055 recd 50 rds S/A & AW fire fr estimated 12 VC at BT439059. Patrol returned fire w/ 50 rds S/A, 3 IAWS, 2 3.5 WP rockets and 8 rds 60mm fr CoH CP at BT451039. Results, 1 USMC WIA & helo evac. VC broke contact. Patrol assaulted enemy area but was unable to reestablish contact. VC casualties unknown.

091520 - CoE on S&D mission at BT396147 observed 3 VC in open at BT 38810. Arty fired. Good target coverage; results unknown due to distance of 5000 meters, target area not assessed.

101105 -- CoE in defensive perimeter at BT396144 recd 12 rds SA fr BT388146, fired arty mission. 1 VC seen fleeing north. CoE swept area, with negative results.

#### SECTION IX -- CIVIL AFFAIRS

- 1. This month the Civil Affairs program of 2/5 has been focused around the MEDCAP program. Several MEDCAP patrols have been established to reach the outlying hamlets in out TAOR. There patrols earve a dual purpose in (1) giving medical attention to areas that previously had little or no medical care, and (2) the patrols serve as an entering wedge into these areas.
- Typical organization of a MEDCAP patrol is as follows:
  - (a) One doctor from the Battalion. (b) Two corpsman from the Battalion.

  - (c) One rifle squad for security.

(d) One dention if available

(e) A representative from the Civil Affairs office.

(f) Two or three Vietnamese nucses.

Four or five members of the Popular Forces.

(h) The Assistant Village Chief if abailable.

The MEDCAP patrols were used on a trial basis starting in the middle of the month and proved to be so successful that presently four MEDCAP patrols operate within our TAOR, two weekly and two bi-weeklv.

- The Battalion also has started a program of taking all the excess food from the noon and evening meals to the refugees of Ly Tim District located in Ky Khuong Village.



were requested via the TACP local or Battalion TAC net to the ALO. The ALO relayed the request to the DASC via the TAR #2 (s) net. However, during the displacement of the Command Post, the request was relayed to the 1st Marines via the Regimental TAC net.

2. There were a total of sixteen medical evacuation requests, one of which was at night.

3. All medical evacuations were accompanied by a UH-1E gun ship.

4. The longest reaction time encountered was 40 minutes, but this was due to haveing committments placed upon the med evac helos. The average reaction time was twenty (20) minutes.

. 5. Regardless of tactical conditions, all medical evacuation missions were accomplished. Effectiveness - Outstanding

# (b) Resupply.

1. All resupply missions were conducted as follows: one in the morning, one in the afternoon, and as needed. The resupply was always requested via the H ST net.

2. All resupply missions were performed by two UH-34B, and each mission was performed within its expected time frame.

#### (c) Aerial Observers.

1. Only two AO missions were requested, and these were performed via the Division AO.

2. Once communidations were established, the AO was ready to support us. The AO's were used on one observer : mission and one artillery spot mission.

# (d) Close Air Support.

The only CAS preplanned was two A&E on station. Neither these nor any CAS aircraft were utilized because of a lack of a lucrative target.

7. <u>Intelligence</u>. The anticipated locations and strengths of VC units expected bo be encountered in the objective area are as listed below. The currency of information as received from the 1st Marine Regiment was based on reports received in April 1966.

- The 1-19 LF Company was believed to be located in the day of Auan Ngoc (2). BT 397112. However the scheme of mandwer did not place us in that area until the last day of the operation. Generally the operation, VC contact was minimal consisting mostly of harassing fire with more frequent fire comming from the vicinity of Xuan Ngoc (2) and Xuan Ngoc (1) (BT 395125).
  - b. The villages in the area of operations especially Bich Ngo (3) (BT 344170), Bich Ngo (2) BT 347161 and Duc Bo (BT 370150) were characterized by extensive trench lines, fighting holes and some barbed wire.
  - c. The village of Thach Kieu (2) was surrounded by a trehch with fighting holes approximately every 20 feet. It also had a five strand barbed wire fence around it.
  - d. The weather while not extremely hot did range from 65 to 95 degrees. This combined with high humidity caused several heat casualties during the operation.
  - e. The area of operating was generally a lowland plain bordered on the west by a hill mass which ranged southeast along our route of advance.
  - f. The area was characterized by relatively flat terrain interespect with low scattered hills and dissected by gonerally shallow stream beds and irrigation canals.
  - g. Vegetation ranged from sparse to moderate. Hedgerows in hamlets proved to be a hinderance to movement and visibility. The brush encountered in BT 3813 was similar to density and height to California sumac. Rice paddies were predominant in the northeastern section of the area of operations. However, they had been drained for harvesting and presented no problem to cross country troop movement.

#### 8. Mission

a. Be in position on Hill 69 by L-Hour on D-Day prepared to execute heliborne assault.

- b. On order on D-Day, execute a heliborne assault into LZ ERGLE (BT 335182).
- c. Upon completion of helo assault, conduct search and destroy operations on an axis of advance generally southeast in assigned TAOR.
  - d. Be prepared to reinforce/exploit in the TAOR of the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines.
    - e. Be prepared to conduct County Fair Operation.



- 9. Concept of Operations. On order (approx L-50) land in LZ EAGLE (BT 335182) with the Battalion (-) (Rein) in column, sweeps to the north and northwest portions of the TAOR (along the TAM KY River) on order turn and with two companies abreast conduct search and destroy operations to the southwest in assigned TAOR (See Operations Overlay, enclosure (1)).
- 10. Execution. An initial briefing on the operation was conducted by Regiment on 18 April, another briefing was held on 21 April and First Marines Operation Order 327-66 was received on the afternoon of 23 April 1966.

- 12. Administrative Matters. The Administrative Plan was adequate in all respects.
- a. <u>Supply</u>. Supply support was adequate. Resupply was entirely accomplished by air. The combat load, ammunition and weapons carried by the troops were equal to any situation.
- b. Maintenance. Maintenance of equipment was no problem. Downed equipment was evacuated by air to the LSA and replaced.
- c. Treatment of Casualties and Evacuation and Hospitalzation. Helicopter evacuation was highly effective. There
  were one delays longer than 30 minutes. No land evacuations
  were utilized due to terrain features. None of the casualties
  sustained during the operation were jeopardized by the short
  delay in evacuation.
  - d. Transportation. When required, was timely.
- e. Communications. The command group had 4 radio nets, Battalion tactical nets, Regimental tactical net, Regimental Command net, and tactical air request net, as well as the supporting arms radio nets to utilize for control of the operation. The AN/RRC-25 and AN/PRC-47 radios were utilized on these nets, with excellent results both in reliability and distances covered. Interferences by Vietnamese. VC and U.S. Army units was experienced but generally this interference could be overpowered. No serious communication problems were encountered on Operation Wyoming.

13. Special Equipment and Techniques. None

14. Commander's Analysis. This Battalion accomplished its assigned mission on Operation Wyoming. In doing so, the helicopter landed assault forces maneuvered as planned without initial contact the assualt companies were able to conduct detailed search and destroy operations. The operation was considered timely and effective in that the indigenous of certain areas gave indications that they would welcome an effective gocal government loyal to the Republic of Vietnam. This operation gave assurance to those who would be loyal that Viet Cong dominance over the area is being challenged. Although civic action and psychological warfare was not extensive, it was proper for the area of operation and the duration of the Battalian's stay in the area. No nom combatants were evacuated, medically treated or relocated during the operation. There were several casualities to non combatants however.

#### 15. Recommendations

- a. That further military operations be planned in the same area with a view towards clear and hold operations.
- b. That future operations employ Popular Forces units and Peoples Action Teams.
  - c. That in the way of lessons learned:
- (1) Marines be cautioned to anticipace that high ground and likely routes of ingress into hamlets maybe be mined or booby trapped.
- (2) Women and children in occupied areas maybe or had been armed Viet Cong.
- (3) In addition this Battalian learned from practical application some of the problems of fixing and killing Viet Cong.

1. SITUATION

#### a. Enemy Forces

(1) As currently promulgated by ISUMS and 1st Recon Battalion patrol reports.

#### 2. MISSION

2nd Battalion, 5th Marines will establish and maintain a reconnaisance screen throughout its assigned sector of the Regimental TAOR; will conduct unilateral and combined offensive operations in the Regimental area of responsibility as directed; will be prepared to conduct unilateral and coordinated offensive operations ICTZ as directed: will occupy and defend assigned sector of TAOR; be prepared on twelve hours notice for commitment as a reserve/reaction force prepared for operations throughout the ICTZ or as a general reserve to COMUS-MACV as directed; be prepared to assist in the training of, and rendering support to Regional and Popular Forces (RF/PF); be prepared to provide assistance to Chu Lai Defense Command as directed; and occupy, defend and maintain a roadblock/checkpoint at AN TAN Bridge (BT 498067).

#### 3. EXECUTION

a. Concept of Operations. The 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines will accomplish the above mission with three rifle companies and currently assigned elements in direct and general support.

(1) The rifle companies will be assigned sectors within the 2/5 TAOR. The companies will establish required defensive positions, combat patrol bases and outposts within assigned sectors. Aggressive patrolling, search and destroy, clearing operations and ambushes will be conducted throughout the entire sector during daytime and nighttime priority to the nighttime.

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- (2) Each company will be prepared to assume responsibility for another company's sector in the Battalions TAOR and be prepared for deployment as directed withing twelve hours notice.
- (3) The Battalion's TAOR will be subdivided into three sectors; the security and operations in each sector to be assigned to a given rifle company on a rotating basis. Initial assignment will be made as shown on Annex A. The fourth company will assigned to the Hill 69 complex, again on a rotating basis, for a periodic phase of training, operational and Battalion Reserve status.
- (4) The Battalion Reserve will maintain a readiness posture to be immediately employed in whole or in part, as a helicopterborne force, a mobile strike force mounted on tracked or wheeled vehicles, or on foot capable of being employed any where within the Battalion's or Regimental TAOR.
- (5) All companies will be prepared to conduct unilateral or coordinated operations with RVN armed forces within and beyond the periphery of the Chu Lai T/OR as directed.
- (6) The 3nd Battalion will conduct counterattacks employing all Battalion resources. Normally, counterattack forde will consist of a reinforced rifle platoon or company capable of air or ground lift to a threatened area. Companies will contain penetrations in respective sectors and assist in the destruction of the penetrating force as required.
- (7) In all offensive operations, the policy of pursuit of engaged enemy until contact cannot be reestablished will be followed. However, extreme caution must be exercised during both day and night operations, with particular emphasis on the latter, to avoid a pursuit group being led into a trap. This is a recognized tactic and commanders must be alert to identify it. Unit commanders conducting offensive operations will formulate plans for pursuit intentions and will inform this headquarters as soon as possible in order to effect a coordinated plan to trap VC forces.
- (8) To provide effective coordination of operational and intelligence information between the Battalion and Local Vietnamese Agencies, a Liaison NCO is maintained at the District Headquarters at Ly Tin.

#### b. Company "E"

- (1) Commencing at 151200H May 1966, and as previously directed, coordinate with 1st Battalion, 5th Marines for orientation operations in that Battalion's TAOR for a period of about seventy-two hours or until released.
  - Battalion, 5th Marines, return as directed separately to this Battalion Command Post.

- (3) Upon arrival at this Headquarters, and as directed,, assume the role of the Battalion's principal strike element.
- (4) Be prepared to assume the responsibility of any other company sector within the Battalion TOR.

#### c. Company "F"

- (1) On about 18 May 1966 or when returned to OpCen of this Battalion return to the Battalion Command Post and make preparations to move into the pactor shown on Annex A as directed.
- (2) Coordination with Company G will be effected as soon as possible so that the physical transfer of sector responsibility may be conducted as a smooth transition.
- (3) Be prepared to assume the responsibility of any other Company sector within the Battalion TLOR.

#### d. Company "G"

- (1) On 19 May 1966 or when directed, stand relieved by Company H of duties in currently assigned security and operational sector and occupy sector assigned on Annex 4.
- (2) Be prepared to assume security responsibility of any unit which may later locate within the new sector.
- (3) Be prepared to assume the responsibility of any other Company sector within the Battalion's TAOR.

#### e. Company "H"

- (1) On 19 May 1966, or when directed, stand relieved by Company F of duties in currently assigned operational sector and occupy sector assigned on knnex k.
- (2) The new sector will include the security and defense of the bridge at AN TAN and will require the assignment of one reinforced platoon to that point in relief of a Company G platoon.
  - f. Battalion Reserve. Initially Company "E".
- (1) Conduct operations as directed by this Head-quarters.
- (2) Maintain one reinforced squad on a fifteen minute alert status and a reinforced platoon on a thirty minute alert status.
- (3) Be prepared to deploy anywhere within the Battalien's TAOR as a reserve/strike force.

#### g. Coordinating Instructions

- (1) 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines Operation Order 301-66 supports reference (b).
  - (2) Contact right to left.
- (3) All units are responsible for their own local security.
- (4) All units will enforce the civilian curfew within the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines TOR between 2000H and 0500H daily.
- (5) Companies will conduct a vigorous Civil Affairs Program within assigned sector.
- (6) All matters relating to operations outside the RZ and TAOR and coordination/cooperationswith I Corps advisory teams will be referred to this Headquarters.
- (7) Maximum use will be made of Vietnamese (VN) lisison personnel during the conduct of operations in order to provide identification of friendly forces and as a means of contact with and identification of civilians.
- (8) Operations and all associated activities will be conducted is such a manner as to minimize non-combatant casualties and damage to civilian property.
- (9) Mine fields will be established only with specific approval from this Headquarters.
- (10) Claymore weapons are authorized to be employed by units of this Battalion only with approval of this Headquarters.

#### (11) Rules of Engagement

#### (a) Individual

l Rounds will not be chambered in individual weapons unless contact with the enemy is imminent. The senior Marine present will determine if, in his judgement, this measure must be taken to preserve the lives of USMC personnel. Initiation of any offensive or defensive formation implies imminent contact with the enemy.

2 Magazines will not be inserted in weapons in a camp area during daylight hours unless under attack.

2 During the hours of darkness the sequence of engagement will be:

#### a Challenge.

b If the person challenged makes an evert attempt to avoid apprehension, opens fire or commits any other hostile act, and therefore endagers the life of the challenger, the challenger may load and fire,

<u>c</u> Unit Commanders may prescribe illumination prior to firing if local circumstances allow.

d. The requirement for challenge may be waived by the local commander if required by the tactical situation and friendly forces are known to be not operating in the area.

#### (b) Undt.

2 Supporting arms will not be fired into any populated area except when the infantry commander on the ground personally determines the area to be hostile and that such action is necessary to save Marine lives, and that there is no alternative to such a course of action.

2. All supporting arms missions with the exception of barrages and pre-planned unchserved fires will be controlled by an airborne or ground FAC, forward observer. NGF Spot Team or RVN F observer. All observed and unobserved fires, except barrages will be positively approved at the appropriate FSCC level prior to the use of supporting arms.

3 Hamlets or villages not associated with ground operations will not be attacked without prior warning by leaflets and/or speaker systems or other appropriate menas) even though light fire is received from them.

4 Hamlets and villages may be attacked without prior warning if the attack is in conjuction with a ground
operation involving the movement of ground forces through the
area, and if, in the judgement of the ground commander, his
mission would be jeopardized by such warning.

5 None of the foregoing is intended to deny the application of force against the source of hostile. Thes. Enemy forces engaging friendly troops will be destroyed by utilization of any available means

#### 4. ABMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS

Basically unchanged from current doctrine. Specific changes will be promulgated separately.

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- 5. COMMAND AND COMMUNICATIONS ELECTRONICS
  - a. Unchanged from current doctrine.
- b. Command Posts. Annex A (Operation Overlay). Companies will request approval of recommended changes.

- a. ENEMY FORCES

- (2) An undetermined number of Viet Cong have been known to be operating in the vicinity of Hill 22 (BT432091). This has been reported that the VC have constructed numerous trench and tunnel networks in this area.
- (3) Recently to VC have been reported to have been firing from Hill 22 and from the Hamlets of Khuong Nhon (1) and Khuong Nhon (2) into friendly areas. Khuong Nhon (1) and Khuong Nhon (2) have also been used as a refuge by an undetermined number of VC.

#### b. FRIENDLY FORCES

- (1) Regional Force Company 744 will conduct operations the vicinity of Khoung Nhon (1) and Khougn Nhon (2).
- (2) 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines will provide artillery and HOWTAR support on call.

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- (3) "Sparrow Hawk" available on call from 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines.
- (4) Elements of Co A, 1st Tank Bn provide direct support.
- (5) AT platoon, Co A, 1st AT Bn provide direct support to operation.
- MISSION. 2nd Bn, 5th Marines commence operation to burn concealment underbrush, and to destroy entrenchments and mines on Hill 22. Additionally, to provide Regional Force units blocking support, in their sweeping mission through suspect hamlets of Khuong Nhon (1) and (2).

#### 3. EXECUTION.

- a. CONCEPT OF OPERATION: With fire support from Tanks, Ontos, Artillery and Mortars, a blocking line will be manned to the West of Khuong Nhon (1) and (2), in a line from the Song Trau to the Southeast. A company from 1st Battalion, 5th Marines will block, on the North side of the Song Trau, attempts of the enemy to escape across the river to the North. Another element of 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines will form a blocking force to the East of, and parallel to, RVN Highway Route #1, thus completing a "U" trapping maneuver. RVN Regional Force Company 744 will move into the open end of the figure to execute its searching mission.
- b. Co "C" lst Battalion, 5th Marines. Occupy positions by not later than 010530 near the North bank of the Song Trau from Route #1 to approximate coordinates BT420093 to interdict the river route of enemy escape from the South side of the river.

#### c. Co "G" (Rein)(-)

#### LESSONS LEARNED

#### I. Landmine Warfare:

The enemy we are operating against is well versed and trained in setting1 an array of booby traps and personnel mines. Detection before detonation is the only answer to Eliminating casualties; however, there are certain precautions to be observed which will reduce this hazard.

- 1. An absence of children in the area indicates presence of mines.
- 2. Most of the personnel injured by mines/boobytraps have dropped their guard due to heat and fatigue and are usually in a bivouac type area where the men have taken off their flak jackets to relax. In this situation men tend to group together, therefore complicating the problem. Leaders must be aware of this danger and take positive steps to prevent this.
- 3. Never use any bivounc area more than once and areas which appear to be inviting (shady areas, etc) are those most likely to be mined.
- 4. Popular Forces personnel have proven to be more effective than Marines in detecting mines and booby traps and should be used to the maximum extent.
- 5. A friendly attitude towards the villagers and children has and will continue to be helpful in obtaining information on the location of boobytraps and mines.
- 6. The obvious mine or trap is not the one designed to kill you, the unseen one in close proximity to the obvious is the one to look for.
  - 7. The following are some of the boobytraps recently encountered:
- a. An explosive device placed below a punji pit, designed to detonate when stakes are removed or disturbed. Therefore, all punji traps should be blown in place.
- b. An explosive device (usually artillery round) placed in trees and detonated by electrical means when najority of troops are in the killing zone. Unit commanders must continue to impress on troops the need for keeping spread out at all times.
- c. Explosive device (nortar/artillery rounds) placed in a triangle at ground level and detonated by a trip wire at the point of the triangle. This creates many casualties if the point is in its normal tight wedge formation. Again, keep maximum distance possible between Marines.

#### II. Tacties:

Lessons learned in tactics consist more of a re-emphasis i basiz fundamentals.

1. Automatic weapons and radios must be concealed as much as possible within formations as they will be fired upon first.










- 2. Points and flankers must be well out in front (100 meters) of main body in order to detect ambushes.
- 3. All Patrol members must be thoroughly briefed on all aspects of the patrol.
- 4. Artillery and other prep fires should be utilized on any suspected enemy positions.


#### III. Miscellaneous:


- l. Lost equipment is of a tactical value to the enemy. Personnel must be made very aware of the value of their equipment to the enemy and frequent inspections held by unit commanders. Viet Cong have been killed wearing serviceable Marine equipment.
- 2. Hand grenades should not be suspended on any portion of their equipment. A unit, if allowed to do this, will lose up to 10% of the grenades carried in this manner.













