## B. Commander's Narrative of Significant Events

## 1 April to 10 April

Company E assumed responsibility for the perimeter defense of the An Hoa (AT875475), while Company F moved to the Phu Loc (6) area of responsibility (AT926527) to assure that the road from that position into An Hoa remained open. Company H assumed responsibility for the security of the Nong Son area (AT 824388), and Company G remained in the An Hoa area as maneuver company.

Mines and Booby traps continued to be a problem in the Phu Loc (6) area. While patrolling Liberty Road, Company F apprehended 3 Wiet Cong planting mines and uncovered one punjii trap with the sign, "Good morning, How are you and how do you do" on one of the stakes. Closer examination of the sign revealed that it had been booby trapped with an N-26 fragmentation grenade. The booby trap was blown in place.

Golden Fleece (5-6), 3-4 April, and Golden Fleece (5-7), 6 April were held with Company F and Company H participating respectively. Thirty-two tons of rice were harvested and were taken to Phu Da (1) (AT870489) to be processed. The two companies cordoned off the areas while ARVN, PF, RF and RD units provided security for the harvesters. The presence of Marines in a cordon around the rice harvest area relaxed the Vietnamese workers. Sniper activity was immediately suppressed in every instance, a fact noted and appreciated by Vietnamese officials.

Company H, while operating in the Nong Son area, discovered a cave concealed along a river bank. A C/S grenade was employed, and the cave searched. The action resulted in the capture of 2 VN males flushed from the cave. Later interrogation proved that the two were hard corps Viet Cong.

On 7 April, a platoon CMB patrol from Company H received 10 S/A rounds. Setting down a base of fire, one element of the platoon maneuvered to and swept through the enemy position. After the enemy had broken contact with the Marine unit, the VN civilians living in the area voluntarily emerged from their shelters with all their personal belongings. On their own request, 30 civilians, were escorted to the PF Village at Song Khuong by the Marine unit.

7-10 April Operation Dixie. See enclosure (Combat After Action Report, OPERATION DIXIE).

On 10 April, Duc Duc District headquarters received 4 rounds of 82 HM mortar. Company E then manning the An Hoa perimeter, reacted quickly from a newly established mortar watch in the An Hoa air field tower, accurate enemy coordinates were called in and effective counter mortar fires were brought to bear silencing the enemy mortars.

#### 11-20 April

During this period there were many indications of increased enemy activity throughout the TAOR. Company H remained at Nong Son CMB

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actively patrolling the area. Company E was releived of the An Hoa perimeter defense, by Company G who continued active patrolling of squad, plateon and company size. Company G continued to improve the Ar Hoa defense by relocation of LP's and the laying of protective and tectical wire. Company F remained at Phu Lac (6) combat tase, effectively patrolling the area to counter increased enemy movement.

On 11 April, Company H, reaction quickly to an intelligence report of 3 VC platoons providing security for a high ranking officer from Laos, corered 3 suspected enemy positions with effective 81 MM and Arty missions. Later S-2 reports indicated that one high ranking Officer lai been killed and another seriously wounded. Seven North Vietnamese egulars were also reported WIA.

On 12 april, an Hoa received 6 rounds 82 MM mortar, and apparent attempt to hit the an Hoa ammo dump. All rounds fell short of the target and again, rapid reaction from the mortar watch located in the an Hoa tower resulted in effective counter mortar fire. The enemy aprtar position was well covered and the mortars silenced.

On 13 April, Company H participated in a successful Golden Fleece (5-9) operation in conjunction with C.C.N-1, the 324th RF Obmpany and 2 PF Platoons. The five tons of rice that were harvested had been planted by the VC Farmers association. Prior to the operation, area village and Hamlet Chiefs were sceptical of harvesting VC rice. The presence of Marines, however, made the operation possible and greatly increased the local officials confidence in Marine Corps protection.

Contact with the VC increased during this period throughout the TAOR. At Phu Sac (6), Company F accounted for 5 VC KL by actual body count, 2 VC VIA captives and one weapon, a NAK44. At the same time, Company G, still serving as the maneuver Company, accounted for one VC killed, by body count.

The aggressive spirit of the Marines in 2/5 was demonstrated by two members of Company F, who, although wounded, refused medical evacuation until the completion of their mission. The seriousness of their wounds made later evacuation necessary.

On 16 April, Company E took over as maneuver Company and carried out extensive Company size patrols in the area of known VC activity. Company G assumed responsibility of the An Hoa perimeter.

A successful County Fair (5-15) was held in the Nong Son area on 19 April with Company H, in conjunction with CAC N-1, 324th RF Company and 2 PF Platoons, providing the security. The III MAF Drum & Bugle Corps was a contributing factor to the operation's success.

### 21-30 April

Enemy activity in the TAOR again increased. Mines and booby traps were discovered daily in Liberty Road which for the first time were covered by enemy fire.

On 23 April, a booby trap was tripped by a Company E security patrol. At the same time, the unit took 5 incoming rounds resulting in one USMC KIA. Prior to this incident, the enemy had not utilized mines & booby traps in conjunction with snipers.

Careful and aggressive patrolling By Company F countered and confused enemy attempts to mass while alert convoy and engineer security provided by Company E and Company G, kept VC forces from closing Liberty Road.

On 21-22 April, Company H conducted a 2 day Company sized search and destroy operation through a known fortified VC village (AT792352). While sweeping through the village and destroying caves; the company came under accurate long range sniper fire. The snipers were beleived to have been using high powered rifles with telescopic sights. The snipers were silenced by supporting arms and close air support.

Again in action in the Nong Son area, Company H discovered two caves of substantial size; 1 30 M in length and the other 100 M in length. Search of the caves revealed 1 M-60 machine gun barrel, 3 packs and a Khaki uniform. C-4 was used to seal the caves. A nearby 1000-lb cache of rice was removed by villagers to CAC-1 Hamlet Ninh Binh (3).

Company E relieved Company F at the Phu Lac (6) combat base on 23 April and established OP's on Liberty Road to check increased VC mining efforts. Both Company E and Company F made outstanding use of their armored capability by the utilization of tank borne infantry as rapid effective striking forces.

In example of the increased enemy activity, on 28 April, a Company E squad patrol searching the area around Phu Lac (6) found two new 60 MM rounds concealed in a house. The rounds were confiscated and the 3 inhabitants of the house taken into the S-2 for interrogation.

On 28-29 April, Company G conducted a search and destroy operation east of Liberty Road, On 29 April, Company G made contact with 10 VC with packs, and rifles. Taking the enemy under fire, elements of the lead platoon maneuvered toward and through the enemy position. The action netted 3 VC kills, by body count, 2 K44 rifles, and one VC WIA captured.

On 29 April, a Company H combat patrol operation in the Nong Son area found a VC cave. Search of the cave revealed 20 gas masks, 10 VC packs and a package of Maps. C-4 was used to seal the cave. In later action, the Scout Sniper Team attached to the platoon, saw 2 VC with packs and weapons. The sniper team fired four rounds dropping both VC. Search of the area revealed two confirmed VC kills and 2 VC packs captured.

Improvements were made on the An Hoa defensive positions throughout the month. Marine engineers working with Company E, Company F and Company G, relocated protective wire and put in new tactacal wire. Some bunkers were relocated and all bunkers were rebuilt. Work has been started on a network of trench lines and fighting holes and a new fire plan with effective research.



- d. Narrative Summary: Chargeable strength remained stable. No critical shortages exist in the enlisted ranks. Present critilal shortages in the officer ranks are as follows: 1 Warrant Officer 0130, 1 Captain 0202 and 1 Captain 0402. Currently the battalion stands eight officers below manning level.
- e. Problem Areas:
- (1) Administrative supplies are still in short supply. Fitness report, VA insurance forms for SGLI, ID Cards, ID Tag blanks, and memeograph paper are in critical shortages.
- (2) Office machines, especially typewriters and addressograph equipment are in very poor condition and the time of repair of these machines in excessive. Temporary loan machines are not available. Replacement takes toolong and would completely stop the flow of present administration.
- (3) This Battalion has received two OF 0141's that cannot meet the requirements for that OF. Both were given 0141 MOS's by MCRD Parris Island and reportly were not asked if they could type nor if they had taken typing courses.

## (3) Morale, PX and Postal Services

- a. Morale is considered excellent
- b. The Marine Corps Exchange located in An Hoa provides excellent service and all necessities are available.
- c. Normal Postal Services remain adequate, Mail delivery has improved during the last week of this month largely due to the Division Postal Officer assigning a courrier to deliver all letter mail. If this trend continues the Mail problem will be eliminated.
- (4) Chaplains Activities: Catholic and Protestant services held during the month. Protestant Services totaled 11 with an attendance of 845, two Bible study groups met with total attendence 10. Catholic masses totaled 5 with 242 attending. The Chaplain visited 108 hospitalized personnel, held 60 professional counseling interviews and gave 2 Orientation lectures with attendence of 49. He attended 2 Division Chaplains meetings and practially completed work on the new 2/5 chapel.

## (5) <u>Intelligence</u>:

a. General. Routine intelligence processing during April was accomplished by processing intelligence from the 9th Marine Regement, 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines, 1st CIT, 3rd ITT, Duc Duc District, 1st Marine Regiment, and the 1st Marine Division (G-2). Routine debriefings of patrol leaders were also used.

Patrol debriefing forms from the 1st Recon Battalion and 2nd  $B_{\rm attalion}$ , 5th Marines were used.

Dissemination of intelligence was by spot reports, daily isums, briefings and telecons.

Members of the S-2 section gave 8 hours of classes to the new arrivals in the Bittalion. The classes included orientation of the 2/5 TAOR handling PW's, captured equipment and documents, weapons and VC tacties.

Liaison visits were made to II MAF (G-2), 1st MarDiv (G\_2) and Duc Duc District Headquarters.

Scout teams were employed with the rifle companies throughout the month.

Kit Carson Scouts worked approximately 15 days with the rifle companies during the month.

Psychological operations during the month consisted of 7 leaflet drops and "face to face" distribution by the rifle companies.

Briofings were held daily and as required. The briefings were given by the intelligence Officer, and covered intelligence matters received.

(b) Reports. Spot Reports, Daily Intsums, Kit Carson Scout (Daily and Monthly), weekly special agent reports, psychological warfare report and the reward fund report were submitted.

The S-2 submitted a number of National Agency Checks, Background Investigations, and Certificates of Clearance.

## (7) Special Operations:

- (a) Utilization of mutually supporting squad size patrols and platoon patrol bases in the area of Phu Lac (6), company outpost (AT926527) proved effective in suppressing VC activity and producing a good kill ratio.
- (b) Wide coverage of the Nong Son company outpost (AT814383) was effected through use of platoon (+) and company (-) patrols and patrol bases throughout the area. River patrols aboard a barge were used to recon and suppress VC movement in vills along the bank.
- (c) Squad and platoon sized day light patrols around An Hoa Combat Base (AT8734) provided an effective recon/security screen.
- (d) Ambush patrols, listening posts and platoon size patrol bases were employed daily and nightly, adjacent to each combat base.
- (e) Engineer sweep teams and increased track vehicle patrols were employed daily on Liberty Road, north to Phu Lac (6) and south to Nong Son to prevent Mining and Sniping incidents along that route.
- (f) Company F conducted Golden Fleece (5-6) on 3-4 April, supported by LVTP-5's and Tanks.
- (g) Company H conducted Golden Fleece (5-7) on 6 April.
- (h) Companies E, F, G and Battalion Command Group (-) conducted Operation Dixie, supported by LVTH-6's, LVTE-1's, LVTP-5's, tanks, and ontos.
- (i) Company H conducted Golden Fleece (5-9) on 13 April.

- (j) Company E conducted a two day search and destroy operation in Thu Bon (1) (AT888509), Thu Bon (2) (AT879501), Phu Nhuan (2) (AT897515) and Phu Nhuan (8) (AT895508).
- (k) Company H conducted County Fair (5-15) at Ninh Binh (3) (AT824375) on 19 April.
- (1) Company H conducted a 2 day search and destroy operation at Tu Xuan (2) (AT792352) on 21-22 April.
- (m) Company G conducted a 3 day search and destroy operation east of Liberty Road (AT935470 AT990506).
- (8) Nuclear, Biological, Chemical Warfare and Defense:
  - (a) CS Grenade M7A2 and CS\_1 Grenade M25A2
    - (1) Used to clear tunnels, caves and bunkers.
    - (2) Used during operations and patrols to contaminate caves and tunnels to prevent re-entry and further use by the enemy.
  - (b) A request was made for chemical defoliants to be used along Liberty Road from Phu Lac (6) (AT926527) to An Hoa (AT875475) to end the mining and booby trap incidents in that area.
  - (c) For defense, the Battalion has ordered individual protective kits M5A3, Radiac metals, protective clothing, and a filter unit, gas particulate ABC-M6. An M-3 Riot Control Dispenser and a Mighty Mite Blower (M-106) have also been ordered.
- (9) Command and Control: Lt. Col M. C. Jackson, Jr. commanded the Battalion during the month of April. During the month of April, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment remained ADCON to 5th Marine Regiment, and OPCCN 1st Marine Division.
- (10) Close Combat:
  - a. Combat patrols from the Phu Lac (6) Company outpost, Nong Son Company outpost, and the An Hoa Combat Base made daily contact with the enemy. Marines persuit of the enemy resulted in close combat on numerous occassions.
  - b. Units deployed on Operation Dixie engaged in close combat with VC troops from 7 April to 10 April 1967. (See enclosure after action Report, Operation Dixie).

## (11) Fire Support:

- (a) Battery E, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines, stationed at An Hoa Combat Base, supported 2/5 units in the field during the month of April.
- (b) 1st Plt, 3rd Eight-Inch Howitzer Battery, also provided artillery support during the month of April.
- (c) A detachment (two 4.2" mortars) from Battery W, 2nd Battal n, 11th Marines, located at the Nong Son Company Outpost (AT814383 supported company operations and patrols in that area.

## (12) Air Defense: None

### (a) Combat Close Air Support:

(1) Fixed Wing Support: During the month of April, the 1st Marine Air Wing provided Air support for 2/5 during Operation Dixie. Included was a highly successful air strike on a partially submerged footbridge spanning the Song Thu Bon.

Of 17 close air support strikes conducted during April, 16 were TAC (A) controlled and 1 was controlled by FAC.

- (b) Halicopter Support: All such support was provided by the 1st Marine Division Air Wing. 120 Requests for medevacs were completed during April. The average time for an emergency medevac completion was 30 minutes. Forty-five resupply and administrative helicopter missions were conducted and one sparrowhawk mission was completed for Operation Dixie.
- (c) TAC (A): During April, 31 requests for an Airborne observer were submitted of which 27 were completed. The airborne observer proved invaluable in locating enemy targets for air and arty and confirming enemy kills by supporting arms. Valuable assistance from the Air Force was provided when Marine TAC (A) was not available.

## (13) Logistics:

- (a) During the month of April, there was only one operation involving and S-4 representative in the field, Operation Dixie. No significant problem areas were encountered in supporting the units in the field.
- Prior to the commencement of operation Dixie, a stockpile of essential supplies were collected at the forward battalion distribution point at Phu Loc (6). This proved very effective. Most resupply was conducted by LVT's from the distribution point to the operational area. Use of the distribution point shortened the supply route by several miles, thereby, resulting in more timely resupply.

During the operation, units were required to submit consolidated resupply request by 1400 hours daily. Cooperation was good and resupply was effected promptly.

One priority air resupply was effected to a unit in the field during Operation Dixie. This involved three trips for each of the two resupply/medevac helicopters. This resupply was timely and no problems were encountered.

b. <u>Meter Transport:</u> The most significant problem area is still second and third echelon deadlined vehicles due to the lack of spare parts. The present deadline factor for M422 vehicles is 20%.

Drivers training school was conducted during the month for the M274 mule, resulting in 27 new licensed drivers being added to the rolls. M422 Mighty Mite school was conducted with 19 new licensed drivers added. Safe Driving Lectures were conducted by Motor Transport personnel with a total of 41 in attendance.

The continuing flow of convoys from DaNang to An Hoa has greatly improved our logistical status. Plans are imminent to gravel the surface of Liberty Road which will further improve this units logistical posture.

(c) <u>Equipment</u>: Logistical support to outlying positions has improved with the assignment of three 12 ton Trailers to this unit which augment the 5 housekeeping trucks presently assigned.

Construction is continuing on the new messhall with an anticipated completion date of about 4 May. Five new tropical huts have been completed since the last report. Construction of the new parking apron has also been completed.

Arrival of the water tank and well digging crew are anticipated soon. These will be necessary before the new messhall and shower can be put into use.

(d) Supplies: During the month of April, Battalion Supply supported "Operation Dixie" within our TAOR. During this period, Supply subnitted 20 slit documents, priority 02, of which 0 were completed.

During the period 17 to 21 April 1967, a Supply inspection was conducted of all Company Supply Sections to insure that the proper supply procedures are being followed. Battalion Supply is now in the process of preparing for the FMFPac Supply Inspection and the Division Embarkation Inspection. Both take place in May. Supply has also switched to the Marine Corps Unified Material Management System (MUMS), as of 23 April.

This unit is still not receiving satisfactory support on our Blank Forms and Stationary items.

(e) Engineer: During the month of April the 2nd Plt. Co. "B" 1st Engineer Bn., which is attached to this battalion, has discovered six VC mines, four of which were disarmed, two of which were blown in place.

The engineer platoon has conducted two classes on Mines, Demolitions and Booby-Traps during the month of April. These classes were given in support of the orientation program for newly arrived troops.

Twelve engineer personnel were committed to the field in support of Operation Dixle during the month of April.

During the entire month of April, the engineers have assisted in the emplacement of tactical wire around the entire An Hoa defensive perimeter.

## (14) Communications:

1.60

- (a) Radio Relay: MRC/62 Van is primary unit of Communications. The TRC/15 Van is used to back up the 62. This unit was up more than in the past. The TRC/27 made communication with Bonnie Hero and has been up 95% of the time.
- (b) Generator: Civilian generator tap-in is 90% complete. Division Engineer inspection team inspected 20 KW Generator PV-239.
- (c) Wire: Rewiring of Camp and Perimeter was completed.
- (d) Radio: Radio section lost three radios on Operation Dixie when an AmTrac hit a mine. Replaced all radios damaged; plus 8 new PRC/25 on Special Allowance.
- (e) Message Center: Communication Center handled an estimate of 1200 incoming message and 163 outgoing.

## (15) Civil Affairs/Civic Action:

- (a) General: During this reporting, the main activities in the Civic Action Program have been medical treatment for the Vietnamese. The people were treated at BAS, MedCaps, and a County Fair. The County Fair was held at Ninh Binh (3). During the first 19 days of April, there were no medcaps held. Due to the heavy commitment of the Battalion in the field, security was not available. Also, the Battalion was under 50% strength on corpsman. However, the medcaps and routine patrol to Hamlet and Village Chiefs began once more on 20 April. Since that date, visits have been made to the Village Chiefs of Xuyen Thu, Xuyen Phu, and Son Khuong. Also the Hamlet Chiefs of Phu Da, Thu Bon, My Son (1), My Son (2), My Son (3), Mau Chanh, Ninh Binh (3) and Nong Son. During these visits, much valuable information, such as tunnels, location of explosives, and explosives was turned over to the S-5. Plans are made for weekly visits to these chiefs in the coming month.
- (b) Medical Assistance: The Battalion Aid Station has done a fine job in assisting the Civic Action Program during this month. Both on medcaps and treatment at Battalion Aid Station. The following is a total medical breakdown of the Vietnamese people treated:
  - (1) Xuyen Thu Village: 367 women, 610 men, 529 children, 1506 Total
  - (2) Kuyen Phu Village: 400 women, 597 men, 725 children, 1722 Total
  - (3) Combined Total: 3228

- (e) Public Improvements: Man projects for the Vietnamese have been started and completed during this reporting period. Some of these are: renovation of school at Mau Chanh, new market place at Phu Da, and two new weels atarted at New Thu Bon.
- (f) County Fair Activities: A County Fair was held at Ninh Binh (3), Son Ninh Village, Duc Duc District (AT823373). County Fair commenced 180600H April 67 and ended 200730H April 67. The Duc Duc District Chief arrived with VIS National Police, Local Officials and U. S. Army Advisors. One platoon from the 324th R. F. Company comprising the search force began moving the people to a central location and proceeded to check out the people entering the area. The District Chiefs of Duc Duc spoke to the people of the coming elections. And assured that he would support them. 181230H April 67, the III MAF Drum and Bugle Corps arrived. The people had never seen a band before and it proved to be a real asset to the County Fair. 190900H April 67, visit by the Commanding Officer, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines and S-3, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines. Visits were made to the fair site, the CAC N-1 compound and the market site. It was determined to present to the Hamilet 100 sheets of tin to be used for the market place. Clothing was presented to the refugees, also soap and propaganda handbills were distributed. Movies were shown by the Audio/Visual Team, to approximately 1500 people on the 18th and 19th of April. 500 medical treatments, 150 dental patients with 300 teeth extracted, 1000 Chieu Hoi Leaflets, 1850 magazines and 500 newspapers were distributed. The County Fair is considered highly successful. A Childrens Day Festival was held at Duc Duc District Headquarters (AT864476) 25 April. The III MAF Drum and Bugle Corps put on a show to a highly receptive audience of approximately 1000 people. 750 school kits were handed out inth 500 pounds of rice. The Division Photographer was scheduled to take family pictures, but due to transportation problems, arrived too late. The Audio/Visual Team planned to show films, but due to problems in the projection equipment this was cancelled. Overall, the Festival was still most successful.

## (16) Medical:

(a) Significant Events: There were increased numbers of Malaria cases for the month of April (15 cases).

## (b) New Developments:

- (1) The Company Commanders were informed of the obvious consequences resulting from the failure of Marines to take the weekly Maria pill.
- (2) The senior Corpsman of each Company have now initiated a program where by each Marine is observed in swollowing the Malaria pill, unlike the past when the pill was given to a Marine and his name checked off a list.
- (c) Problem Area: The major problem area during the month of April, concerned the increase in the incidence of Malaria.

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### 6. Supporting Arms.

### a. Air:

- (1) On D-Day a partially submerged Bamboo Footbridge spanning the Song Thu Bon vicinity (GS 9153) was destroyed by two F4B AIRCRAFT. The bridge had been used by enemy forces for night movement across the river.
- (2) Eleven Med-evacs were conducted with an average elasped time of twenty-five minutes from inception to pick-up. Approximately 55 individuals were evacuated without mishap.
- (3) One Sparrow Hawk was launched on D+1 and inserted at (AT 935512). The launch was initiated at 091130H and completed at 091215H. It was preceded by an air prep of the landing zone utilizing two flights of fixed wing aircraft. Eight hundred rounds of 20 MM were expended.
- (4) A TAC (A) was available and utilized during most daylight hours. Excellent support was provided by blackcoat 1 and 11, Dreamhour 21, Lopez 52, 51, 27, 21, and 56, and Deadlock 30.
- (5) A TPQ-10 strike at 100001H vicinity (AT 9853) was highly unsuccessful in that all bombs were duds. Company G in position 1 KM from the target clearly heard the impact of the bombs.
- (6) One AC-47 (Spocky) was utilized and dropped 35 flares. 21,000 rounds of 7.62 MM were expended in support of ground forces.




#### 7. Intelligence.

- a. Enemy strength in the area of operation was carried by 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines as elements of R-20 Battalion, and possible elements of one battalion of the 3rd NVA Regiment. This is the normal operating area of the R-20 Battalion and several solid contacts have been made on previous operations. Captured documents by 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines indicated one battalion of 3rd NVA Regiment possibly in area.
- b. Information obtained from the villagers indicated guerrilla activity of from 5 to 15 guerrillas in the different hamlets. Sightings by villagers of from 30 to 60 Main Force Troops moving from west to east around 1 April through the area of operation. One report from villagers indicated the M.in Force moved back through the area from east to west approximately 3 April. Movement is normally about every 10 days.

There were 11 sightings of 188 VC in area of operation from an OP vic (AT 977501). VC were in groups of 18 to 50. Movement was both east and west.

c. Enemy contacts consisted of sniper type actions with estimated one to five VC each incident. There were 11 booby trap incidents during operation indicating many booby traps and mines in area.





- d. The hamlets in area were characterized by the absence of people and no young men present. All the houses were almost totally destroyed by Arty, etc. The majority of the people seemed to have abandoned the area prior to operation, however, there were new trench lines in some of the hamlets in the eastern portion of area of operation indicating recent enemy activity in area. Signs over trail in Bao An Doug (H) vicinity (AT 987535) written in Vietnamese told the young people to join the VC to fight the Americans.
  - e. The people in the hamlets who were screened for possible information appeared to be satisfied with their environment. They indicated no desire leave the area and prefered to stay in same. The people indicated that the VC have not been in the area in force since TET.
  - f. Routes of communications were foot trails and trails made by LVT's. The streams and rice paddies had no water and did not restrict movement of tracked vehicles. The LVT's on the operations were only partially restricted in their movements by the terrain.
  - g. Psychological warfare consisted of a leaflet drop made on 8 April in area of operation. When units later moved through the area the leaflets were found torn to pieces.

Operation Dixie commenced at 071000H April 1967. Company G (Rein) and the Battalion Command Group A departed the An Hoa Combat Base by means of an armored column in an apparent bi-monthly troop rotation with forces at Phu Lac (6) vicinity (AT 927527). At My Son (1) vicinity (AT 900975) the third platoon (G-3) (Rein) detached from the column and attacked in an easterly direction to seize Objective A.

Upon arrival at Phu Lac (6), Company F (Rein) attacked east to seize Company Objective (1), (Cu Ban 4 vicinity (AT 947430)). The Battalion Command Group A accompanied by a Provisional Rifle Platoon from H&S Company set up a Forward Command Post on Phu Lac (6). Company G (-) (Rein) attacked northeast along the Song Thu Bon River to seize Company Objective (1), (Phu Tay (1) vicinity (AT 955448).

At 071230H a Marine from Company F (Rein) tripped a Mark-2 grenade resulting in 2 USMC WIA (EVAC). G-3.(Rein) seized, occupied, and set up an OP on Objective A. At 071230H G-3 (Rein) OP observed 30 to 50 VC with packs and rifles moving on road in the 9751 Grid Square. Ninety (90) MM HE and an artillery mission were fired on the enemy. Several direct hits were observed resulting in 8 VC KIA (CONF) and 5 VC KIA (PROB).



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Company G (-) (Rein) seized Company Objective (1), and began the attack on Objective C. Concurrently, Company F (Rein) having seized Company Objective (1), began the attack on Objective B. At (AT 958458) Company F (Rein) discovered a tunnel system which was searched and destroyed after using CS gas. No evidence of recent VC occupation was observed. AT 071400H G-3 (Rein) OP observed 29 VC with weapons vicinity (AT 963547) moving northeast. Ninety (90) MM HE and an artillery mission were fired and a squad was dispatched from Company F (Rein) to search the area. Numerous blood pools and trails were observed. Enemy losses were 8 VC KIA (PROB). At 071420H Company G (-) (Rein) vicinity (AT 953544) received S/A fire from (AT 95553). S/A and an artillery mission were returned. A search of the area was conducted without observing any apparent enemy casualties. Approximately 4 hours later 2 VN "Civilians" requested medical aid from this vicinity and were evacuated.

company G (-) (Rein) seized and occupied Objective C without further contact; took up night defensive positions and conducted night activities. Company F (Rein) seized and occupied Objective B with negative enemy contact; took up night defensive positions and conducted night activities. At 071830H G-3 (Rein) OP observed 19 VC with weapons moving to the west vicinity (AT 978517). Ninety (90) MM HE was fired and many direct hits were observed on the enemy. Due to approaching darkness no search of the area could be made at this time. Search was conducted at first light resulting in 8 VC KIA (FROP).

At 080700H Company G (-) (Rein) continued the attack on Objective D with one reinforced platoon supported by armor. Light contact was made and 1 USMC WIA (NON-EVAC) resulted from a Chi Com Grenade rigged as a mine vicinity (AT 967554). Objective D was occupied and searched without further incident. The search element rejoined Company G (-) (Rein) in order to participate in the co-ordinated two company assault on Objective 1.

Upon securing the western edge of Objective 1, engineer mine sweep teams were used to clear paths for the supporting armor. Numerous mines were detected and destroyed in place by the attacking elements. Light contact was made during the sweep of Objective 1 resulting in 2 VC KIA (CONF) from 90 MM HE fire vicinity (AT 99 5535); mining incidents, however, increased. The enemy delay and harassing tactics resulted in 1 USMC WIA (EVAC) when a Marine stepped in a Punjii trap vic (AT 976535) and 2 USMC WIA (EVAC) when a LVTE-1 supporting Company F (Rein) detenated a pressure type anti-tank mine vicinity (AT 976529). The LVTE-1 was damaged beyond field repair. At O81550H a LVTH-6 supporting Company G (-) (Rein) detonated a 20 pound mine vicinity (AT 976533) resulting in 1 USMC WIA (NON-EVAC). The LVTH-6 was repaired in the field after a delay of only 4 hours.

Company F (Rein) and Company G (-) (Rein) took up night defensive positions and activities on the western edge of Objective 1, vicinity (AT 878535) and (AT 976533), respectfully. At 082015H the Battalian Command Post (Forward) vicinity (AT 927527) received sniper fire from vicinity (AT 924523). The enemy was located by means of AN/TPS-21 radar and 81 MM HE was fired resulting in 2 VC KIA (PROB). Night activities were continued without further incident.

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at 090600H the second platoon of Company F, was detached to provide security for the disabled LVTE-1 and the damaged LVTH-6. The tractors were evacuated toward the Battalion Command Post (Forward). Company F (-) (Rein) and Company G (-) (Rein) continued their co-ordinated attack on Objective (1) eastward to Phase Line Cotton. G-3 (Rein) continued supporting the attack by observation and fire, from positions on Objective A.

As the two Company (-) sweep of Objective 1 progressed, the Observation Post, G-3 (Rein) made numerous sightings of VC unit movement toward the south, west in the 9452 and 9552 grid squares. Ninety (90) MM HE missions were fired. Direct hits were observed on the enemy resulting in a total of 12 VC KIA (FROB). The last mission was fired at 091120H. Company E Sparrow Hawk (E-3) located at the An Hoa Combat Base was alerted for employment to block enemy escape routes to the southwest in the 9351 grid square. At 090900H Company G (-) (Rein) captured 1 confessed VC male, age 34, vicinity (AT 984533). No intelligence of immediate value was extracted from the prisoner during interrogation and he was held awaiting transportation to the An Hoa Combat Base. At 090920H a Marine of Company G (-) (Rein) tripped and detonated a grenade booby trap vicinity (AT 984533) resulting in 1 USMC WIA (EVAC). At 091220H E-3 (Rein) Sparrow Hawk landed unopposed vicinity (AT 935512) to block enemy escape routes to the southwest.

The sweep of Objective 1 continued with light contact, but extensive enemy use of mine and punjii obstacles was encountered. At 091305H G-3 (Rein) OP sighted 35 VC vicinity (AT 955531) with weapons moving away from the Sparrow Hawk blocking force to the northeast. A 105 MM HE fire mission was called but was interrupted after 2 rounds due to a Save-a-Plane. When the fire mission was resumed the enemy had fled to the northeast. E-3 (Rein) Sparrow Hawk was given the mission to proceed to the Battalion Command Post (Forward) position. Subsquently, the Sparrow Hawk was ordered to link up with F2 which was still enroute to the Battalion Command Post (Forward) with the 2 damaged tractors. While enroute to the Command Post an E-3 (Rein) Marine tripped a booby trap (M-26) vicinity (AT 928521) resulting in 1 USMC WIA (NON-EVAC). At 091500H Company F (-) (Rein) and Company G (-) (Rein) completed their sweep of Objective 1, with a loss of 4 USMC WIA (EVAC) from anti-personnel mines, and 3 USMC WIA (EVaC) from Punjii Pits. After seizing Objective 1, the attack was continued to to and across Phase Line Cotton after permission to cross to the east was granted by the Commanding General, 1st Marine Division. A search was conducted for a reported tunnel vicinity (AT 003527) without success. The supporting armor was unable to traverse the railroad obstacle due to gradient and numerous mines which were detected and destroyed in place along the embankment. After the search for the tunnel was completed, and the known mines destroyed, the direction of the attack was reversed 180 degrees. Both Companie's (-) swept back along their axis of advance toward Objective 1.



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At 091315H E-3 (Rein) reached the Battalion Command Post (Forward) position and was further neinforced with 3 LVTP-5 s. They proceeded east along route 537 to link up with F-2. Pifteen (15) anti-personnel mines were encountered and destroyed enroute. One of these anti-personnel mines went undetected and was detonated vicinity (AT 941527) by a Marine resulting in 3 USMC WIA (EVAC). At (AT 958528) two cates were discovered, searched, and blown after using CS gas. At 091700H E-3 (Rein) and F-2 linked up vicinity (AT 967525) and took up night defensive positions and activities.

Company F (-) (Rein) and Company G (-) (Rein) swept back through
Objective 1 without incident and took up mutually supporting night defensive
positions on the western edge of Objective 1. C-3 (Rein) remained in a
defensive perimeter on Objective A and conducted night activities. At
092045H a Company G (-) (Rein) squad ambush vicinity (AT 913534) came under
5/A fire while moving into position resulting in 2 USMC WIK (EVAC). Fire
was returned and the area was searched with no evidence of enemy casualties.
At 092230H Company F (-) (Rein) Command Post received S/A fire resulting in
3 USMC WIA (EVAC). Fire was returned and the area vicinity (AT 977531)
was searched at first light without evidence of enemy casualties. At 100245H
the Battalion Command Post (Forward) vicinity (AT 927527) received 1 mortar,
round/rifle grenade.

At 100630H Company F (-) (Rein) continued the attack westward and seized Objective B without incident. Company F (-) (Rein) set in a blocking position as Company G (-) (Rein) swept Objective C and D using the line charges on the second LVTE-1, to the maximum. At (AT 975532) and (AT 972536) secondary explosions resulted, indicating several anti-tank mines. Company G (-) (Rein) met with light resistance during the sweep. G-3 (Rein) continued to support by observation and fire. At 101100H E-3 (Rein) and F-2 returned to the Battalion Command Post (Forward) with the damaged tractors. E-3 (Rein) then returned to An Hoa Combat Base to resume the Sparrow Hawk


Mission.

Gompany F (-) (Rein) maintained their blocking positions as Company G (-) (Rein) continued to sweep from Objective D southwesterly along the Song Thu Bon toward Fhu Lac (6). At 101220H the Provisional Platoon vicinity (AT 925528) observed and took 5 VC vicinity (AT 938520) under fire with 81 MM HE resulting in 3 VC KIA (FROB). The area was searched, blood and pieces of blood stained clothing were discovered.

At 101510H an LVTP-5 supporting Company G (-) (Rein) detonated an antitank mine vicinity (AT 945538). The tractor carrying a M-274 loaded with resupply Napalm for the flame throwers. The explosion ignited the Napalm spewing it over a large area. The LVTP-5 was totally destroyed along with the M-274 it was carrying. The incident resulted in 29 USMC WIA (EVAC) and 1 USMC WIA (NON-EVAC). Company F (-) (Rein) replaced Company G (-) (Rein) as the sweep element and Company G (-) (Rein) followed in trace.

In the absence of further enemy contact and upon receipt of Commanding General, 1st Marine Division's permission to terminate, Operation Dixie was terminated at 101600H. All units had returned to their respective combat

bases by 102000H.

## 12. Administration and Logistics.

## a. Supply

- (1) During Operation "Dixie", the Battalion S-4 had one representative in the field, see enclosure (2). Timely resupply requests were compiled at 1400 daily and radiced back to the Battalion distribution point at Thu Lac (6). LVT's were the primary means for conveyance of resupply items from the Battalion distribution point to the operational area.
- (2) A stock pile of necessary resupply items was positioned at Phu Lac (6) prior to the operation. This eliminated a long resupply route from An Hoa Combat Base to the operation area, thereby facilitating faster resupply and releasing the two standby helicopters located at the An Hoa Combat Base for emergency medevacs and resupply missions.
- (3) Only one priority resupply mission was necessary for the standby helicopters. This consisted of 6400 lbs of ammunition totaling 360 cubic feet of cargo. Two CH-34's were used for four trips per helicopter. CH-46's had they been made available, could have handled the load in one trip.
- b. Maintenance: Normal FM of equipment was accomplished throughout the conduct of the Operation. In one instance an LVTH-6 was repaired in only four hours time after a 20 lb mine had blown the track and destroyed three road wheels. Two vehicles, and LVTF-1 and LVTF-5, were damaged beyond repair.
- c. Treatment of Casualties and Evacuation and Hospitalization: All casualties received immediate First Aid from Company Corpsman. Battalion Aid Station (Forward) consisted of one Medical Officer and two Corpsman, who moved with Command Group "A" for treatment of emergency patients. All Casualties sustained during the operation were evacuated by helicopters. In no

instance was there a delay of more than 45 minutes between time wound was received and patient was hospitalized. A medical assistant was present on all helicopters that were classified as an emergency evacuation. All head wounds were taken to NSA hospital, remaining casualties were taken to 1st Medical Battalion Hospital; both are in Da Nang.

d. <u>Transportation</u>: The transportation of supplies and personnel was accomplished for the most part by use of the LVTP-5's. The Sparrow Hawk, med-evacs and one resupply run were carried by helicapters.

### e. Communications.

## (1) Radio

(a) Excellent use of the radio set N/GRC 125 was achieved during the operation.

(b) Utilization of the remote AN/GRA 39 was required because of frequency overlay.

(c) Three radio sets AN/PRC 25 were destroyed by enemy action and are in the process of being replaced.

## (2) Frequency

(a) Constant interference on the Admin net resulted in a changing of frequency.

(b) The switch to a secondary Admin frequency eliminated the problem.

## (3) Antenna

(a) The use of the RC-292 antenna was needed for constant, reliable communications.

(b) It was noted that there were a few areas within the area of operations where it was difficult to maintain communications unless the whip antenna AT 271 A and the RC 292 were utilized.

## (4) Voice Procedure.

(a) Overall radio voice procedure was good but more training is indicated.

(b) A communication security school, scheduled for the first part of May will increase the proficiency of personnel in communication procedures.

f. Medical Evaluation: The BAS on this operation was necessary however fortunately not needed due to the outstanding Air Support of casualties.

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13. Special Equipment and Techniques: The LVTE-1 was employed to destroy numerous AT/AP mines which literally engulfed that area. No less than 25 mines with a 50 to 60 lb capacity were blown in and around tree lines along the axis of advance. Although itself severly damaged by a large AT mine one LVTE-1, nevertheless, managed to detonate seven additional AT mines with its line charges.

14. Commander's Analysis - The Dixie area of operations is a known haven for the R-20 and V-25 Battalions. Intelligence received prior to D-Day indicated that elements of the 31st NVA Regiment were also operating in the area. The sharp increase in booby trap activity east of the Battalion's outpost at Phu Lac (6) (AT 926528) was known, from past expierence, to be a harbinger of the enemy's return to what has come to be called the VC R&R Center. Plans were devised to enter the area in a way heretofore not attempted in previous operations and with tracked vehicles never before utilized in this locale (e.g. LVTH-6, LVTE-1). The key to the scheme of maneuver was the positioning of a platoon, reinforced with a light section of tanks and two LVTP-5's, on the high ground, vicinity Hill 148 (AT 978502). Surveillance of the entire area of operations is almost totally uninterrupted from this position. An attempt was made to instill a sense of false security in the enemy ranks by conducting numerous large tracked vehicle patrols between the An Hoa Combat Base and Phu Lac (6) prior to D-Day. When therefore, at 1000 on D-Day the Battalion (-) moved north it was hoped that the enemy would not consider the move unusual. It required only 55 minutes to position the platoon (Rein) on Hill 148. Enemy movement in groups of 15-20 not to exceed a total of 100 was immediately apparent. All such groups were taken under fire with 90 MM and 50 caliber MG and, although only 8 bodies could be found during subsequent movement through the area, it is felt that many nore had been killed. Use of . a Sparrow Hawk or Bald Eagle at this time was not indicated since no specific line of movement could be established. Equipment and dress of the enemy forces indicated they were either local guerrillas or members of the R-20/V-25 Battalions. There was absolutely no indication that the 31st NVA Regiment was anywhere in the area of operation. Susequent sightings of enemy forces east of the seems to indicate that he was either aware of the forthcoming operation or had moved in the normal course of events. There are no indications that he moved during the operation. Any such movement would have been detected by the OP on Hill 148, or the 1/26 elements which had been pre-positioned on the northern bank of the Song Thu Bon to cover the left flank of the Battalion (-) move along the river. The two pronged armored movement to the east was rapid enough to have required the enemy to move if he was in the area when the operation commenced. Not until the 2nd day when 25-50 guerrillas were observed moving SW was there any indicated need for a Sparrow Hawk. When it was launched and placed in a blocking position to the SW, the enemy retraced his steps and moved NE back into the area of operations. The presence of numerous AT mines, which damaged two vehicles on the 2nd day and destroyed one on the 4th day of the operation, required that considerable care be taken when moving east of GL 96. 15 AP mines were found in one 1500 meter stretch



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of road between Phu Lac (6) and Cu Ban (2) (AT 950529). Security requirements for these damaged vehicles coupled with a lack of significant contact prompted the decision on the 3rd day to return the sweep force from positions along the eastern boundary of the TAOR to positions in the vicinity of the Song Ba Ren (AT 9653). Il additional mines were located and destroyed during the move. At least 7 of these were AT mines ranging in size from 25-50 pounds of explosive. All were located in openings in tree lines and were unearthed through use of the LVTE-1's line charges. Although care was taken to return via routes not employed on the move east, one pressure type mine exployed under the rear wheels of an LVTP-5 as it cleared the treeline. Napalm, stored in the vehicle for use by the flame section, burst spewing thickened fuel over a large area and numerous casualties resulted. The burned out hulk was later completely destroyed by fixed wing aircraft. The following is a list of observations made during the operation:

- a. The area which was heavily populated prior to Operation Tuscaloosa is now almost completely uninhabited. Signs do exist, however, that large numbers of enemy still traverse the terrain. It seems apparent that the villages east of the 2/5 TAOR boundary are now used as a base of operations.
- b. The OP on Hill 148 was employing the Scout Sniper 20 power scope and could observe the aircraft discipline of enemy in the Valley. On more than one occasion 15 to 20 enemy succeeded in remaining hidden from the AO's view although the OP could observe them and had given the aircraft exact coordinates of their location.
- , c. The entire area was trafficable to tracked vehicles without restriction to the existing road net-work. The placement of AT mines throughout the area is indicative of his desire to prevent free movement therein.
- d. Conditions what they are, the use of an extensive mine/booby trap program of our own would restrict enemy movement as indeed his program restricts ours. (2/5 has suffered approximately 75 booby trap casualties in this area since December). There is little doubt that those affected by such a program would be VC or active VC supporters. Innocent civilians do not frequent the area.

### 15. Recommendations.

- a. That the area of Operations be made untenable for enemy use as either a staging or rest area.
  - b. That employment of gravel mines in this area is strongly recommended.
- c. That no future operations be conducted therein until the results of a USMC initiated mine/booby trap program can be evaluated.





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# AFTER ACTION REPORT "CPERATION TUBGALOOSA"

#### INTELL HIBNOS

Marine Division G-2 and S-2 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines, as 1 Main Force battalion, supported with an unknown number of guerrillas.

Information obtained from villagers and captured documents, indicate that a Main Force company was also operating in the operation area.

Enemy contacts during the first two days consisted of 1-4 VC. On the 26th of January, contact was made with an estimated battalion. The enemy was dug in along the road running west to east in grid squares AT 9652. The contact lasted approximately 7 hours. Enemy S/A and A/W 50 caliber and mortar fire was encountered. The enemy were various colored uniforms, and was well supplied with armo.

The hamlets in the operation area are characterized by trenches and Fighting holes. The main road running west to east has a trench line running parallel to it, along its entire routs.

Very few people were encountered in the operation area. Many of the hamlets are now deserted.

Routes of communication were foot trails, paddy dikes and the road running east to west. The streams and rivers were at low levels and did not restrict movement.

AT 271106H a plateon from Co "G" (Sparrow Hawk) located in the vicinity of AT 914514 had a man trip an unknown type mine. A search of the area was conducted with negative results.

### PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE.

One leaflet drop was made on 270900H in the area bounded by AT 9453, AT 9953, and AT 9450, AT 9950. The drop theme encouraged the enemy to surrender or rally. A Kit Carson Scout was also employed with each rifle company, to talk to any civilians encountered.

- a. Downed Aircraft initiating procedure
  - (1) Initial notification of downed aircraft is normally received by Division DASC/FSCC. DASC/FSCC notifies TACC. If ground force protection of downed aircraft desired, FMAW Operations submits request for security force to 1st MarDiv/COC, to include following information:
    - (a) Priority of request.
    - (b) Coordinates of downed aircraft.
    - (c) Condition of aircraft, crew members and passengers if any.
    - (d) Enemy activity in area.
    - (e) Nearest LZ (if not at actual site of downed aircraft);
    - (f) Call sign and frequency of fire support aircraft at scene.
  - (2) Division passes mission to Regt/Bn nearest location of downed aircraft. Regt/Bn provides to Division for passing to FMAW/MAG Operations, following information:
    - (a) Coordinates of alert force pickup point,
    - (b) Number of personnel in alert force determined by tactical sit (normally a reinforced squad in TAOR, reinforced platoon of 60 men outside TAOR).
    - (c) Call sign and frequency of alert force.
    - (d) Call sign of FAC.
  - (3) Alert force lifted to site. Close Air support aircraft remain in area and CH-46's return to MAG to await retraction of force.
  - (4) Approval and Control:
    - (a) For downed aircraft in TAOR, COC automatically passes request to Regt/Bn nearest site or Regt/Bn initiates procedure.
    - (b) For downed aircraft outside TAOR, COC obtains G-3, C/S or CG's approval before passing request to Regt/Bn.
    - (c) Regt/Bn, or designated unit, maintains OPCON of force, prepared to reinforce if required.
