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Chargeable strengths now are stable due to previous increases to offset February losses. Presently, no critical shorages exist in the enlisted ranks. Present critical shortages in the officer ranks are as follows: 1 Capt 0202 and 1 Capt 0402.

e. Problem Areas

(1) Administrative supplies continue to be in short supply. Certain blank form such as fitness reports, VA insurance forms for SGLI are non-existent. I.D. Cards and I.D. Tag blanks and chains are also needed.

(2) Office machines, particularly typewriters are in poor to unsatisfactory condition, and the time to have these machines repaired is excessive.

g. Morale, PX and Postal Services

(1) Morale is considered excellent.

(2) The Marine Corps Exchange located at An Hoa provides excellent service. Supplies are now greater in quantity due to more frequent resupply. All necessities are available and some luxury items have been made available.

(3) Postal service has improved. The weather problem has been non-existent with the end of the monsoon season. All postal services are available.

g. Chaplain Activities. Catholic and Protestant services were held during the month. Sunday Catholic Services during the month totaled 4 with an attendance of 110. Weekday Catholic services totaled 3 with an attendance of 43. Protestant services numbered 12 with an attendance of 358. Four Holy Communion services had attendance of 82. The Chaplain made 6 hospital visits to 1st Medical Battalion. Four visits were made to companies in the field.

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INTELLIGENCE1. GENERAL

- A. Routine intelligence processing during February was accomplished by processing intelligence information from the 9th Marine Regiment, 2nd Bn, 4th Marines, 1st CIT, 3rd ITT, Duc Duc District, 1st Marine Regiment, and 1st Marine Division (G-2). Routine debriefings of patrol leaders were also used.
- B. Patrol debriefing forms from 1st Recon Bn, were also used.
- C. Dissemination of intelligence was by spot reports, daily intsums, briefings, telecon, SICR's, and a weekly intelligence summary.
- D. Members of the S-2 gave 6 hours of classes to new arrivals in the Bn. The classes included Vietnam History, orientation of the 2nd Bn, 5th Marines TAOR, handling PW's and captured material/documents, weapons and VC tactics. 24 hours of classes were given to the S-2 scouts on map reading, Comm procedures, compass, handling of PW's and material, reporting military information.
- E. Liaison visits were made to III MAF(G-2), 1st Mar Div(G-2) and Duc Duc District Headquarters.
- F. Scout teams worked with the rifle companies twenty days during February.
- G. Kit Carson Scouts worked 20 days with the rifle companies.
- H. Psychological operations during the month consisted of (1) Leaflet drop.
- I. One VC Chieu Hoi turned himself and a weapon into a rifle company at the Nong Son area.

2. BRIEFINGS

- A. Briefings were held daily as required. These briefings were given by the Intelligence Officer or the Intelligence Chief, and covered intelligence matters received.

3. REPORT.

- A. Spot reports, daily intsums, Kit Carson Scout reports(Daily and Monthly), weekly special agent reports, psychological warfare report, and rewards fund reports were submitted
- B. The S-2 submitted a number of National Agency checks, background investigations, and Certificates of Clearance.

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OPERATIONS

The 2nd Bn, 5th Marines conducted two Bn (-) "Named" Operations, numerous Co(-) sweeps and daily recon/combat patrols during the month of February. With the advent of dry weather, Liberty Road again became passable and security was provided for all convoys moving to the An Hoa Combat Base and for Vietnamese Civilian Engineers working to open the road south to Nong Son.

Companies of the Bn were rotated on a two week basis between the Battalions three fixed positions at Phu Lac (6)/My Loc (2), An Hoa Combat Base, and Nong Son. As a result of this systematic rotation all Companies are now familiar with large sections of the 2/5 TAOR. During their respective stays at Nong Son, both Co G and F worked on the reconstruction of existing facilities. 2000 yds of earth were moved in the project. Work on all three levels consisted of the destruction and rebuilding of bunkers, improvement of fighting holes and trench systems; general cleanup to rid the area of rats and other predators, and on the uppermost level, the expansion and improvement of an LZ.

On 1 Feb, the Bn(-) (Rein) participated in the 9th Marines controlled S & D Operation Independence. The Area of Operations consisted of that portion of the 2/5 TAOR WNW of the Song Thu Son. The outstanding results attained (as reported by the 9th Marines) can be attributed to the rapid insertion of numerous helicopter elements and effective use of blocking forces around the periphery of the Area of Operations.

As weather conditions improved and enemy activity increased, the Bn's daily patrol began to make more frequent contact. Numerous small firefights took place in the vicinity of Liberty Road as the enemy unsuccessfully attempted to close the road. Marine casualties from these actions were light; the enemy moderate.

When Operation Faulkner a S & D in Antenna Valley was postponed, the decision was made to run a Bn (-) sweep astride Liberty Road. The purpose of this operation, code name Lanoke, was twofold. 1st to insure unimpeded movement along the road and 2nd, to test the feasibility of moving tracked vehicles across the terrain adjacent to road. Both objectives were clearly attained, and the ability of the Command to control multi-unit operations once again proven. Although enemy casualties were light, Op Lanoke left no doubt that 2/5 units could move with impunity in the central portion of the TAOR. The effects on the civilian populace were obvious.

Increased emphasis on the improvement of An Hoa Combat Base Defenses, i.e. construction of new bunkers, trench system, fighting holes and protective holes, paid large dividends on 25 February when the Base was hit by 35 - 40 82mm/60mm mortar rounds. Counter-mortar fire was rapid and enemy fire silenced within a few minutes. Damage was light. Of the 11 Marines wounded only 3 required Med Evac and none of these was serious. Duc Duc District Hqs sustained 3 PF KIA's and 12 WIA's in the same attack.

The Battalion's first CoC (M-1) was fully formed and equipped by 28 Feb and ready to join their parent unit at Binh Binh (3) on 1 March.

February ended with numerous plans in progress for Company size sweeps into known enemy areas both east and west of the Song Thu Son.

TRAINING

Formal training in the Battalion during the month of February 1967 consisted of:

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LOGISTICS EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLY1. Logistics

a. General. During the month of February there were two operations, Independence and Lanoke. No significant problems were encountered supporting the units in the field. On Operation Lanoke, the LVT's were pre-loaded with supplies thus enabling them to be self-sustained.

b. Equipment.

(1) The most significant problem area is still third echelon deadline of vehicles due to the lack of spare parts.

(2) The housekeeping vehicle problem has been diminished now that they are exchanged weekly. One of the four (4) vehicles is presently located at Mong Son. There is still a need, however, for additional vehicles.

(3) Transportation for supplies into An Hoa has improved tremendously now that Liberty Road is opened. Convoys have been running into this area on a daily basis.

(4) Request for additional heads and living quarters, the construction of a water tower, a shower unit, and a new messhall is pending. At the present time some of the materials have arrived for the messhall. Construction is slated to begin 10 March 1967.

2. Supply

a. General. During the month of February, Battalion Supply supported two Operations within the TAO. During this period supply requisitioned 385 slit documents with 12 completions. Of the 385 documents submitted, 17 were O2 priority of which 2 were completed. On the 20th of this month, a Division Supply team inspected the Battalion Supply Operation. Results: satisfactory with minor discrepancies.

b. Problems. Supply of Blank Forms and Stationary was unsatisfactory.

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COMMUNICATIONS

1. Radio Relay: MRC - 62 Van still primary unit of communications. Down time for IM and generator tuning was at a minimum. The TRC - 15 Van has been down more than it should have been due to bad generator. A new generator has been procured. The TRC - 27 was up most of the time. Replacement parts were available so down time was at a minimum.
2. Generator: Initial work began on tapping into civilian generator. Lack of # 1 cable slowing everything to an extent. Division Engineers assured us that another 20 KW will be given to us in the near future.
3. Wire: Rewiring of camp for a more efficient wire system is well underway. A more strategic placement of hot lines has been instituted. Rewiring and placement of telephones for the defense perimeter is underway.
4. Radio: Very little 1st echelon maintenance has been noted. Proper training has been initiated. Proper technical repair has resulted in the calibration and alignment of the radios.
5. Maintenance and Repair: Lack of repair parts continues to be a problem. Intensive training in all echelons of maintenance is now being conducted.
6. Personnel: Too many of the men are rotating at the same time. Program now underway to trade personnel to Regiment.
7. Operations: All operations were accomplished with little or no problems.

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CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

1. General. The main factor in the Civic Action program during this reporting period has been medical attention for the people. During this period, we have extended our patrol of 9 Hamlets. This brings an increase of three over the last period. These patrols take place on the average of four a week. We also have weekly visits to the Hamlet Chiefs, Village Chiefs, along with District Chiefs of 2 Districts, Duc Duc and Duy Xuyen. We have reached a high degree of compatibility with these people and they have on many occasions informed us of VC activity. On one occasion, a Village Chief notified us of a booby trapped grenade the Viet Cong had planted on the railroad. On another occasion the Village Chief of Xuyen Phu informed the Civic Action patrol of a VC Outpost, that was used for an assembly area for their nightly visits to the Hamlets of My Son (2) and (3). These are two examples of the cooperation and good will that exists between 2/5 and the Vietnamese people in this area. 2/5 plans to have a County Fair in Xuyen Hoa Village, Duy Xuyen District on 13-14 March. This will give us an inroad into this area for future MedCap Patrols.

2. Medical Assistance. The Battalion BAS has done a fine job in assisting the Civic Action Program during this reporting period. The following is a total medical breakdown of the Vietnamese people treated this month:

- (a) Xuyen Thu Village: 281 women, 273 men, 391 children, 945 Total
- (b) Xuyen Phu Village: 102 women, 104 men, 545 children, 751 Total
- (c) Combined Total: 1,696

5. Public Improvements. The refugee hamlet of Thanh My is over - populated. This presents a health problem and this problem was brought to the attention of the refugees by the Civil Affairs Unit. The people have made considerable progress towards the cleaning of the area.

The medical clinic has also been improved due mainly to the help of the Army Civil Action Unit.

6. County Fair Activities. A county fair was held at Phu Da Hamlet, Xuyen Thu Village, Duc Duc District on 16 and 17 February. The county fair was highly successful and another is planned for Xuyen Hoa Village, Duy Xuyen District, during the month of March.

At 010600H 2nd Bn(-) (Rein), 5th Marines Command Grp, Companies E and F OTCOM to the 9th Marines for Operation Independence.

At 011750H CoH(-) perimeter defense (AT 927528) received 4 rds S/A fire from vic (AT 929522) resulting in 1 USMC WIA; fire was returned with S/A and M-26 and 106mm, area was checked at first light; unable to locate any sign of enemy casualties.

At 020830H a Plt S&D from CoH (AT 924517) discovered a M-26 Grenade rigged as a mine; mine blown in place.

2/5 (-) (Rein) continues to participate in Operation Independence.

At 021700H, Co H perimeter defense (AT 925528) received 5 rds S/A fire from (AT 933523), returned fire w/90mm and M-26 fire observed 3 enemy flee to the East carrying a body.

030001H 2/5 (-) (Rein) continues to participate in Operation Independence.

At 032030H Co H/Plt/CB, (AT 926528) received 200 rds S/A fire from an approximate enemy Fireteam at (AT 932523). Returned 500 rds S/A and 1 90mm; enemy broke contact.

At 032100H Co H/Plt/CB at (AT 914516), received 2 rds of 60mm and 20 rds S/A, returned 15 rds 81mm; at same time heard movement in the wire. Threw 4 M-26 grenades. Squad searched lines unable to establish contact.

040001H 2/5 (-) (Rein) continues to participate in Operation Independence.

At 042030H Co H(-) CB (AT 926527) picked up 5 enemy in the open with TPS-21 located (AT 920532); fired 8 rds 81mm in area, searched area at first light, unable to find any positive indications.

At 042135H a Sqd Ambush from Co H observed 3 enemy at (AT 904526) and called in 81mm with good coverage. Unable to check area because of distance and mission.

At 042230H Co H(-) CB (AT 926527) received one rifle grenade and 10 rds M-26 fire from vic (AT 927525); fired 81mm illum, unable to observe enemy. No further fire received.

At 051100H a Sqd road sec from Co H (AT 908805) received approx 50 rds M-26 fire from wood line vic (AT 913503). Returned fire w/SA and called in 81mm. Searched area found 3 fighting holes and evidence enemy had withdrawn to the Southeast; unable to reestablish contact.

At 052130H, Co H/Plt/CB (AT 926527) enemy threw 1 Frag grenade into perimeter resulting in 1 USMC WIA (Non-Evac). Returned 4 rds 60mm illum; searched area at first light unable to reestablish contact w/enemy.

At 060910H, Co G/CP area, (AT 820387); while giving instructions on the M-72 (Law) Marine instructor was trying to collapse wmn w/live round inside it. Weapon exploded resulting in 1 USMC WIA (Med Evac).

At 061600H, Co H/Sqd/SP (AT 895515) found a Vietnamese woman on trail with an 8" steel punji spike in her ankle. Corpsman treated woman and called a Med Evac.

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At 071000H, Co H/Plt/SP (AT 908504), received approx 1,000 rds S/A and A/W fire from an estimated enemy Sqd (Rein) (AT 908501). Returned 200 rds S/A and 81mm; enemy broke contact and fled to the west. Unable to pursue due to tactical mission.

At 071600H Co G/CB (AT 824388). Tail assembly from an expended M-72 (Law) projectile exploded when Marine dropped assembly on ground. Results: 4 USMC WIA's (Non-Evac), all were treated in Company area.

At 080145H, Co H/CP area (AT 926527). A Vietnamese woman was brought to CP area by her family and was treated by Corpsmen for a puncture wound under her arm. Med-Evac at first light.

At 081430H Co H/Sqd/SP (AT 917512). Point man tripped a M-26 Frag grenade mine. Results: 3 USMC WIA's, all Med-Evac.

At 081935H Co H/perimeter area (AT 926527) received 3 rds S/A fire from (AT 928522). Returned 1 (Law) and 20 rds A/W fire. Enemy fire ceased.

At 091245H, Co H/Sqd/SP, (AT 918514) discovered two punji pits mined w/M-26 Frag grenades; punji pits were destroyed along w/M-26 grenades.

At 091200H, Co H/Sqd/SP, (AT 918518). VN male of military age attempted to run from patrol, VN was apprehended. VN did not have ID card, found a VC flag about 50 meters from his home. VN forwarded to S-2.

At 091330H Co H (AT 915515). Marine w/defensive position fired on VC sniper. One round struck 2 VC. Priority Med-Evac requested and completed. Investigation conducted.

At 120700H Co G reported OPCON to 2/4 for Operation Stone.

At 121200H Co F Recon patrol (AT 859378) received 5 rds S/A fire from rear and left flanks vic (AT 858380) resulting in 1 USMC WIA. Returned 20 rds S/A fire and 7 rds 60mm, secured LZ and requested Med-Evac.

At 121315H Co H/Plt/SP (AT 934524) received 2 rds S/A fire; returned 20 rds S/A fire and 4 rds 60mm.

At 121450H, Co H/Plt/SP (AT 933520) observed 5 enemy with weapons moving North East. Fired 20 rds S/A and observed 1 enemy fall. Searched area (AT 940523) and discovered pool of blood. Area looked as if 1 WIA (VC) had been dragged off.

At 121925H Co F(-) CB (AT 872368) and Whiskey Btry 2/11 on OP (AT 814383) observed estimated 50 cal MG fire approx. 50 rds from vic either (AT 885385) or (AT 879391) at Med-Evac helo lifting off from Co F(-) position. Arty missions were called on both suspected enemy positions, the former with 4 WP and 20 HE and the latter with 55 HE rds. Enemy MG ceased fire. The helo did not sustain any hits.

At 131100H Co H/Sqd/SP (AT 930520), discovered 1 M-26 Frag grenade mine set with trip wire. Mine was destroyed in place.

At 131815H Co H(-)/CB (AT 928527) observed w/20 power scope two enemy w/packs and weapons, (AT 930508). Fired one 90mm HE rd resulting in VC KIA (prob). Searched area and found drag marks.

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At 131835H Co H (-)/CB (AT 928527) observed w/20 power scope six enemy in grey and khaki uniforms w/packs moving SW (AT 931506). Fired one 90mm rd; observed one enemy crawling; fired second 90mm rd; enemy disappeared. Estimate 2 VC KIA (Prob). Searched area; found evidence that 90mm round had impacted at above enemy coordinates.

At 141220H Co H(-) (AT 908495). Marine set off C-Ration type mine resulting in one USMC KIA (Non-Evac).

At 150830H Co H/Sed(+)/SP for road sweep at (AT 911503) rec two rds S/A fire from (AT 905504). Returned 10 rds S/A fire; unable to search area due to mission.

At 151245H Co H/Plt/CP (AT 914514) apprehended 12 year old boy inside wire attempting to steal rifle. Turned over to the S-2 section for action.

At 160915H G/Plt(-)/SP for road sweep found booby trapped cannonball (AT 905475). Blown in place by Engineers; had a secondary explosion.

At 160955H E/Plt(-)/SP for road sweep (AT 911480) received 4 rds S/A fire. Saw movement in hedgerow and returned 20 rds S/A fire and 2 rds M-79. Enemy fire ceased; continued MSN.

At 161330H (AT 909491) Java Man 6, Java Man Delta 6, and driver were ambushed by 5 to 6 enemy (AT 905491). At 161350H a plt from Co H was dispatched to the area; proceeded to escort ambushed party to Thu Lac (6) (AT 926527). One USMC KIA (the driver), and 1 USMC KIA.

During night of 16 Feb 67, an unk size enemy force destroyed railroad bridge (AT 908481) with explosives. At 170915H Co H Plt (-) SP w/road sweep confirmed and submitted damage report. At 171013H Plt (-) and Vietnamese bulldozer dispatched from An Hoa Base to build by-pass for wheeled traffic across river. At 171158H dirt by-pass completed.

At 170505H Co E(-) set-in blocking position vic (AT 865485) and commenced County Fair Operation 5-13.

At 170950H Co H/Sed/SP found two M-26 booby traps with trip wires (AT 935525) and (AT 935524). Both were blown in place.

At 171200H Co G changed CP/CON from 2/4 to 2/5. (Returned from Grn Store)

At 180630H - 181130H Co H (-) S&D moved to blk pos vic (AT 949514) for subsequent sweep, Hamlet La Thap (1) (AT 947516). 180720H Plt rec 25 rds S/A fire from 4 VC (AT 936511); ret 100 rds S/A fire, enemy fire ceased. 180740H H Plt (AT 948514) rec MG, A/W fire (AT 947517). Ret 200 rds S/A, 4 M-79; continued to move to blk pos. Marine stepped on or triggered unk exp device; 1 KIA, 2 MIA, wounded Sed leader triggered another device that exploded two ft above ground wounding five more Marines. Med Evac (3 MIA & 1 KIA). 180900H Co H (-) swept La Thap (1) while gongs sounded warning. Found one pack w/enemy documents; one detainee (sent to dist HQ). 181040H rec approx 200 rds S/A, A/W fire (AT 947518); ret 600 rds S/A and A/W fire, 10 Laws, 12 M-79, 3 3.5. Enemy fire ceased. At this time H-3A (AT 945524) observed w/binoculars 4 men (AT 944511). 1 man Blond caucasian wearing light blue uniform and sam brown belt; other three orientals wearing white, khaki and black PJ's. Fired 24 rds 81mm; observed enemy run into trees and fall. Searched area w/no further contact.

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At 181023H County Fair Operation 5-13 terminated Co F(-) conducted return sweep to An Hoa.

At 190830H, Co H/Road Sweep/2 Sgd and Eng (AT 912509) found one 81mm WP round buried in road w/pressure time detonator. Destroyed mine in place and continued sweep.

At 192255H Co H (AT 926529) received 10 rds S/A fire from vic (AT 927522). Returned 20 rds 60mm, 20 rds 81mm and 5 rds Illum. VC fire ceased.

At 201053H Co E Bald Eagle was alerted for possible insertion (AT 956425). At 201255H Bald Eagle was inserted. At 201550H mission completed. 109 bags of rice, approx 2 1/2 tons were delivered to Duc Duc District. 201550 Mission completed unit extracted and returned to An Hoa.

At 201530H 2nd Plt AT's w/Plt(-) Co H returning from An Hoa to Thu Lac (6) observed 2 VC attempting to bury a mine in Liberty Road. Open fire on enemy with 50 rds 30 cal. MG. VC attempted to escape. One VC seen to fall. AT's with light sec tanks and sgd from H 2/5 searched area and found 1 VC KIA w/back, AK47 and documents. AT's personnel attempted to blow mine without success, units continued mission after marking mine and leaving a security element with it.

At 201800H Co H SF and Eng moving to destroy mine observed 3 VC attempting to remove body at (AT 910490). Opened fire resulting in 3 VC KIA's (conf). Co H moved a Plt w/Tigers into area to clear area and search for any more enemy. Engs destroyed mine. Search of area revealed no further signs of enemy in the area. Units returned to base 4 VC KIA's (conf).

At 211605H Co H convoy security (AT 920517); head of convoy received approx 10 rds S/A fire as they rounded a curve vic (AT 920513); returned 100 rs S/A fire and 10 rounds 60mm mortars into treeline. Search treeline and found 3 wounded VN teenagers (2 Boys and 1 Girl). Investigation showed wounded VN were hit by stray rounds while standing behind treeline from which enemy fire came. No weapons found. Wounded brought to BAS and evac'd to USOM Hospital.

At 220345H Co E (AT 912515) received 50 rds of S/A and 25 rounds automatic weapons fire from vic (AT 913514) resulting in one USMC KIA. Req routine Med Evac at first light. Returned 500 rds S/A and 5 rds 60mm mortars. Percuted ECFB-4 to vic (AT 913514) and set ambush. No contact made. Patrol returned to CP. Med Evac completed at 220715H.

At 220500H Co F (AT 881399) req. one Emerg. Med Evac for L/Cpl SPRAGUE P. 210 5807 USMC; diagnosis - food poisoning. LZ for Med Evac was secured and marked with flashlights. Med Evac was completed at 220630H. En surgeon journeyed to Mong Sen to investigate cause.

At 221000H Co E (AT 938532) S-2 scout with Co E patrol found 2 booby trapped Chi-com grenades. Booby trapped grenades were blown in place; marked tree 3 1/2 feet off ground with a 2" slice.

At 221915H Co H CMB (AT 889487) received 10 rds S/A fire. Returned 50 rds S/A fire. No further contact.

At 231115H Co H CMB (AT 889487) received 20 to 30 rds S/A and A/W fire from treeline resulting in 1 USMC KIA. Med Evac was requested. Returned approx 200 rds S/A and A/W fire. Checked area.

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At 231300H Co H CMB (AT 884477) spotted 3 VC with weapons crossing rice paddy. Took VC under fire with 200 rds S/A fire. Searched area after completion of 1 USMC KIA Med Evac. At 231320H patrol spotted 1 VN fleeing from vic (AT 891488). Detained 1 VN and forwarded to BnCP. Med Evac completed at 231340H. Searched area without further contact.

At 231500H 2nd Plt, Co B, 1st AT Bn convoy (AT 915511) detonated mine between lead Ontos and 2nd vehicle resulting in no USMC casualties and no vehicular damage. Visually checked area. Indications were that detonating device was by electrical command. Mine estimated to be 16 to 15 lb charge. Visually checked area and continued mission.

At 231610H 2nd Plt, Co B, 1st AT Bn, convoy (AT 916510) detonated mine to the rear of last Ontos in convoy resulting in 1 USMC MIA (Med Evac). Ontos Commander transferred to 6X6. Visually inspected area. Detonating device unknown. Continued mission.

At 231945H, Co E CMB (AT 928528) observed 10 VC crossing Song Thu Pon river, south to north in 5 boats. 2 VC per Boat. Took VC under fire with 67 rds 81mm HE and 14 rds 81mm illum. Initial volley was direct hit. Four boats destroyed in water; one blown onto north bank where a major secondary explosion destroyed it. Minor explosions observed in other 4 boats. Tracers and S/A continued to explode for approx 15 minutes resulting in 10 VC KIA (conf).

At 240130H Co E, BA (AT 919518) observed 2 armed VC crossing rice paddy into treeline. Took VC under fire with 20 rds S/A and 4 rds 60mm. Due to tactical situation and darkness could not search area.

At 240945H Co F Plt CMB (AT 829354) received 15-20 rds S/A fire from west. From 3 VC. Flushed VC from tunnel complex at vic (AT 830351); returned 50 rds S/A, 7 rds 60mm and searched area for 30 min; detained 1 VN. Captured ID cards, medical supplies and 1 tablet with Chinese inserts. Tunnel complex blown in place. Called arty mission on VC route of egress. Pursued VC. Detainee and captured material forwarded to CP. At 241255H received 10 rds S/A from west. 2 VC from vic (AT 828358). Returned 35 rds S/A and called air on station. At 241310H ordered Air Strike. Searched area for 20 Min. and found indication that enemy fled west into tree line. Continued mission.

At 241830H Co E para vic (AT 925525) rec. 5 rds sniper fire from vic (AT 932524). Ret 25 rds S/A fire and searched area; no evidence of enemy casualties. Results 1 USMC MIA (Non-Evac)

At 242230H Tanker with Co E (AT 925525) fell from tank during relief of watch and suffered a deep head laceration. Emergency NRC Med-Evac requested. Completed at 242335H.

At 252310H 2/5 CP area, the Air Strip and Duc Duc District Headquarters received approx 35-40 rds of 81/82mm and 60mm mortar fire from vic (AT 849479). Results: 11 USMC MIA's (3Evac). Duc Duc sustained 3 FF KIA's and 2 MIA's. Returned counter mortar fire on VC posn and routes of egress, 105 rds (105), 8 rds (155) 38 rds (81mm HE). Results: Direct hit on 1 VC mortar position.

At 260930H 2/5 CP area 2 60mm duds were found approx 50 meters SW outside of perimeter as a result of 252310H mortar attack on posn. Flown in place by Eng.

At 270735H a security patrol for road sweep tripped a M-26 time booby trap.

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Results: one USMC MIA Med-Evac. Co H & G continue to participate in 2/5 S&D Op Lenoke.

Co G, Co H and elements of Co E continue to participate in Operation Lenoke.

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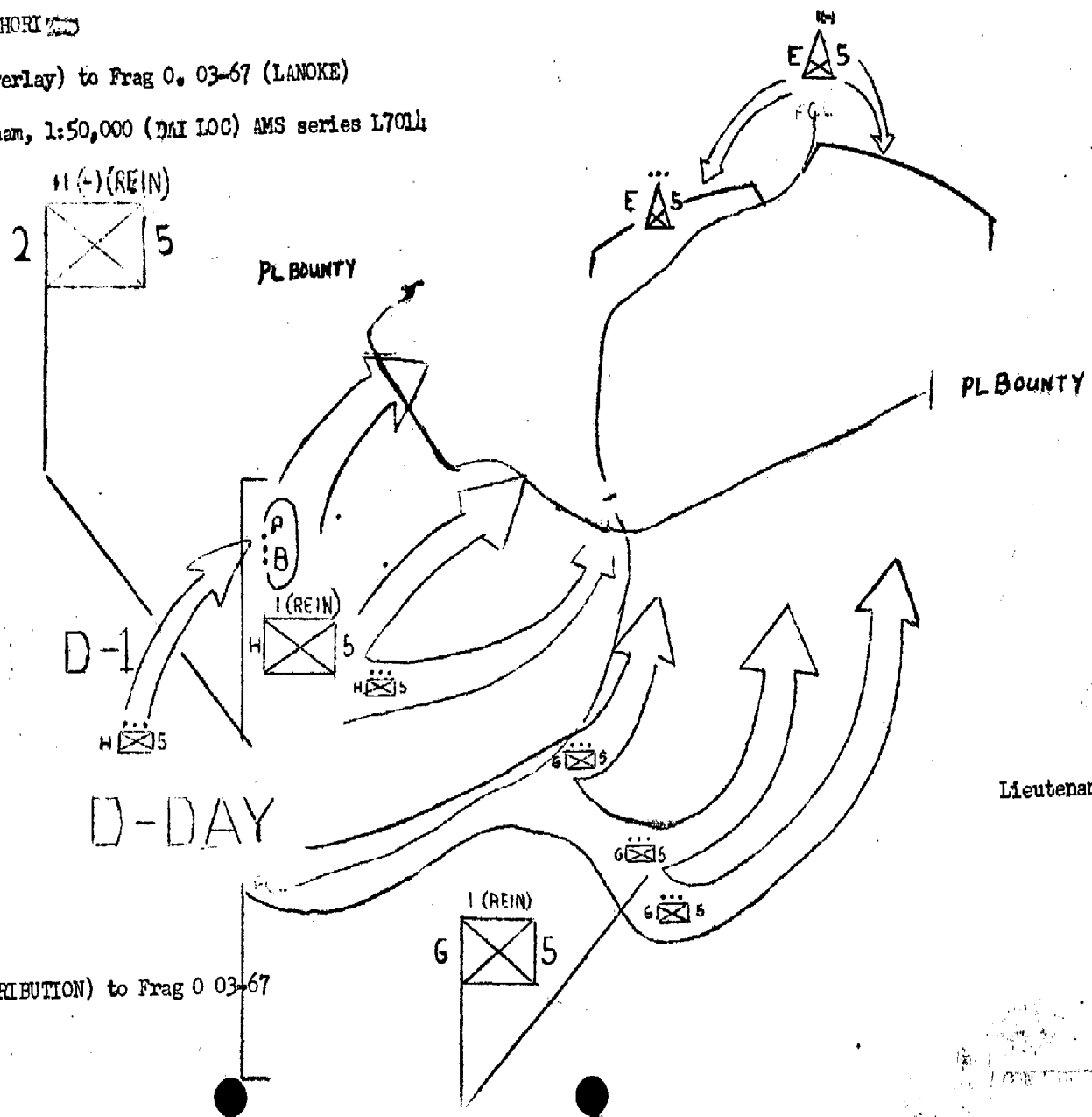

(2) Helicopters were employed throughout the conduct of the Operation. 29 lifts were required to move the Bn(-)(Rein) into the operating area. Two helos were on a 24 hour standby at AN HOA to supply logistic support for the field units. Resupply was controlled by the HST Team.

(3) Medical Evacuation. Two helos were on 24 hour stand by at AN HOA. All requests were made via TAR-5 and no difficulties were encountered in providing assistance within a matter of minutes

b. ARTILLERY. Btry E (Rein), 2nd Bn, 11th Marines, located at AN HOA, provided direct support to the Battalion. The majority of missions were fired against small groups and/or individual enemy snipers. Most missions were observed although on occasion the enemy was not. When surveillance was impossible one volley normally suppressed enemy fire. In an effort to draw attention away from the intended LZ's, a prep was fired into Antenna Valley vic. (AT695370).

c. 1st Recon provided recon support in and adjacent to the area of operations.

d. Det, 3rd SP Bn - direct support.

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- e. Det, 3rd Engr Bn- direct support.
- f. Det, Scout Dog Plt - direct support.
- g. HB team, 244th Psy War Co - direct support.

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h. Det, Coll and Clr Co, 1st Med Bn - direct support. This unit was established at AN HOA and handled all casualties evacuated from the field

7. Intelligence

a. Enemy strength in the area of operation was carried by the 2nd Bn, 5th Marines as 1 Main Force Battalion (V-25), elements of the R-20 Battalion, the Q-14 Company and local guerrillas.

b. Information obtained from the villagers, captured documents and PW's indicate:

(1) A Main Force CP area in the vicinity of (AT820482), unit designation unknown.

(2) The Q-14 Company was in the operation area.

(3) Some NVA were operating in the operation area.

c. Enemy contact consisted primarily of sniper fire. Contacts were made with one to thirty troops, using S/A and A/V fire. Contacts were broken quickly by the enemy and they withdrew most often to the Northeast. The uniforms worn by the enemy were black, green, and khaki.

d. The hamlets in the area were characterized by trench lines and fighting holes. Many small tunnels 10 to 15 feet in length were found. One extensive tunnel complex was located at (AT864514). This complex was 1 to 1½ kilometers in length. Fighting holes were spaced approximately every 10 meters along the surface of the tunnel.

e. Very few people were found in the hamlets in the operation area. Some of these people desired to relocate to DUC DUC District Headquarters, and the remainder indicated a desire to remain in their hamlets. The people appeared to be in good health. There appeared to be substantial food available. The area was reported by the villagers to have been under VC control for the past two years. The peoples sympathies were toward the VC and not the Americans. The predominate religion was Buddhism.

f. Routes of communication were foot trails and paddy dikes. The streams were at low levels, and the paddies were drying allowing for unrestricted movement. Portions of the terrain are open and allow for good observation and fields of fire. All of the routes offer good ambush sites.

g. At 081100H Co H located in the vicinity of (AT869519) while crossing a rice paddy found an unknown type of booby trap with trip wire. The device was blown in place.

At 081230H Co B located in the vicinity of (AT868502) found an AP mine with a pressure type device. The mine was blown in place.

* h. Psychological Warfare. Two Kit Carson Scouts were employed with Co E to screen the detainees and talk to the civilian population.

8. Mission. 2nd Bn(-)(Rein), 5th Marines, in coordination with 2nd Bn(-)(Rein), 4th Marines and OPCON to the 9th Marines, conducts Search and Destroy Operations in that portion of the DUC DUC area bounded on the North by the SONG WU GIA, on the East by the SONG THU BON and on the West and South by the 1st MarDiv TAOR boundary, to locate and capture or destroy enemy forces, supplies and equipment therein

9. Concept of Operations. Commencing at L-hour on D-day, 2nd Bn(-)(Rein), 5th Marines and 2nd Bn(-)(Rein), 4th Marines land by helicopter assault into designated HLZ's and attack East and Northeast in assigned ZOA's. A feint toward the Antenna Valley will be initiated by a pre-L-hour prep of potential LZ's in that area. Prior to D-day, Recon elements will be inserted into Recon Zones North, West and South of the objective area to provide surveillance and, on order, ambush on avenues of approach and egress from the objective area. Designated blocking forces will establish and maintain blocking positions along the SONG WU GIA and SONG THU BON, as directed and, on order, be prepared to shift blocks to insure sealing of the objective area. CAS will be employed as needed. Direct support will be provided by direct support batteries, reinforcing Artillery and organic 81mm Mortars located with blocking force units. Concentrations on avenues of approach and egress from the objective area will be pre-planned in support of the major operating and Recon elements. Additional direct fire support will be provided by tank and Anti-tank units located with blocking forces. Casualties will be initially evacuated to detachment collecting and clearing Company located at the BAS AN HOA.

a. Company E (Rein). Commencing at L-hour on D-day land in LZ DOVE (AT799496) (See enclosure 1). Uncover LZ and establish blocking positions. On order, be prepared to continue the attack to the East and Northeast.

b. Company B (Rein). On order, be prepared to follow Co E into LZ DOVE and attack to the Northeast in assigned ZOA.

c. Company A (Rein). On order, be prepared to follow Co E into LZ DOVE and attack to the Northeast in assigned ZOA.

d. Company F (-). Establish blocking positions NLT L-hour, D-day along East bank of the SONG THU BON from GS (AT920530) to (AT670500)

e. Company H (-). Note: Although not initially scheduled to participate, Co H(-) was later given the mission to block along the East bank of the SONG THU BON in conjunction with Co F (-).

10. Execution. The Battalion was alerted for Operation INDEPENDENCE on 29 January 1967 and preliminary planning began. On 31 January 9th Marines Operation Order 1-67 was received and the Battalion published its' Operation Order that same day. The Operation commenced at L-hour (011000H Feb 1967) as scheduled with the first elements of Company E landing uncontested in LZ DOVE. Insertions continued smoothly without enemy contact and all units were in the LZ and deploying by 011215H. The Operation progressed smoothly with scattered light to medium contact throughout the Battalion ZOA.

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Originally scheduled for 5-8 days, the Operation continued until 090900H February 1967 (8 days). The following is a Chronological sequence of events outlining the Battalions action throughout the course of the operation:

010600H, 2nd Bn(-)(Rein), 5th Marines with CoA, CoB, 1stBn 1st Marines attached chopped OPCON to the 9th Marines.

011000H, Co E and Command Group commenced helo insertion into LZ DOZE (AT 799498) (See enclosure 1). Landing was unopposed and zone was secured by 011035H.

011000H, Co F in blocking positions along eastern side of SONG THU BON from GS (AT8659) to GS (AT8851).

011105H Co B commenced helo insertion into LZ DOVE; lift complete at 1130H.
011215H Co A commenced helo insertion into LZ DOVE lift complete at 1230H.

011230-H, All companies moving to assigned objectives along phase line Alpha (See Enclosure 1).

011335H, Co E located several small and one large unused cave vic (AT805464). Caves destroyed by Engineers.

011335H, Co B directed air strikes on enemy bunkers and trench system at (AT 802460). An AO reported one bunker and most of trench line destroyed.

011340H-011430H, Co A conducted a search of TAN PHUA (1) (AT8047) and HUU CHANH (1) (AT8148). Several punji pits and freshly dug trenches were destroyed. One 35 year old returned w/Chieu Hoi pass. 90 detainees were taken for screening. One, a female, attempted to stab a Marine in the back.

011430H, Co's A&B reached assigned objectives along phase line Alpha. Unit locations at this time were as follows: Co A (AT807480), Co B (AT831471), Command Group and Co E (AT814770).

011510H Co F blocking position observed 3-4 enemy in dark uniforms and carrying weapons moving along the west bank of the SON THU BON vic (AT864497). Arty was used on area with unknown results since water barrier prevented search.

011750H The Bn(-)(Rein) established night perimeter defensive position as follows: Command Group and Co E (AT820482), Co G (AT807477), Co B (AT832374). Co F remained in original blocking positions.

011855H Co B, (AT835472) received 3 rds S/A fire from (AT836470). Returned 7/5 rds S/A enemy fled South.

012220H Co B patrol received S/A fire while moving into ambush site (AT829470). 1 USMC KIA. No further contact.

020730H Companies A and B continuing Search and Destroy Operations in assigned ZOA.

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020800H Med Evac completed for USMC KIA from 012120H action two Refugees and 6 detainees evaced to AN HOA collection point. Helicopter received S/A fire while leaving Co E LZ (AT833473). Security force returned 100 rds S/A, 6 M-79 rds and searched area (AT799471) picked up one male, age 40. No futher contact.

020830H Co A, 3rd Flt, (AT815487) picked up 2 Viet males one with womens ID Card forwarded to CP.

020940H Co A, 3rd Flt (AT819485) found 3 caves in dikes caves approx. 10' feet long, 4 feet high, and 4 feet wide. Caves destroyed by demolitions.

020950H Co A Flt destroyed 1 250 lb bomb (AT825485).

021005H Co F blocking position received 5 rds S/A fire from 2 enemy; returned fire and directed Arty fire on target (AT876514) with excellent coverage. 24 105 rds and 2 WP expended. Estimated enemy WIA.

Refugee collection point established HANH DONG (2) (AT861493). DUC DUC District notified to provide boats to evac refugees.

021330H Co F, (AT890512), observed 1 enemy (AT890513) moving along river bank; threw weapon in river when he spotted Marines. Enemy captured after chase. Pack, 3 carbine type mag., 2 CHI COM Grenades taken. Enemy evac to ITT.

021300H Co B (AT848478) apprehended 1 male, age 30, no ID Card; evac to rear.

021400H Bn CP with Co E, commenced sweep from (AT820482) toward new position (AT839488).

021530H Bn CP picked up 3 suspects, ~~evac'd to AN HOA Base~~ east.

021530H 2/5 (-)(Rein) chopped OPCON of Co F to 2/5 (Rear). Co H w/Flt. Co F OPCON to 2/5 (-)(Rein), established blocking position in conjunction with Operation INDEPENDENCE along Eastern bank SONG THU BON River GS (AT8750 to GS AT9052).

021600H Co B (AT860495) received 250 rds S/A, A/W fire from estimated Platoon enemy (AT861497). Returned 600 rds S/A, A/W fire 10 M-79; 5 LAWs, directed air strike unable to search area due to river barrier.

021620H Co B (AT857494) reported friendly Arty 105 WP rd fired in support of Co B fell in Co E position 5 USMC WIA.

021615H Co A (AT51501), received 50 rds S/A, A/W fire from AT847495. Returned 200 rds S/A, A/W fire; 1 enemy KIA (Conf).

021620H Co B-1 (AT852486) spotted 5 enemy in tree line (AT850492). Opened fire with 400 rds S/A, A/W fire, 12 rds 60mm. 1 enemy KIA (Prob).

021700 established perimeter positions for local night activities. Bn CP and Co E (AT839488), Co A (AT845496), Co B (AT855440).

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021700H Co A (AT845496), received 3 to 5 rds S/A fire (AT848543). Observed 1 enemy fall across paddy opened fire with 50 rds S/A, A/W fire. Observed enemy fall, 1 enemy KIA.

021715H Co E (AT839487), received 75 rds S/A, A/W fire from estimated 15 enemy (AT821485). Returned 350 rds S/A, A/W fire, 10 M79, 3 LAWs, 2 3.5 in called air strike with napalm and bombs; observed 5 enemy fleeing South. 2 enemy KIA (Conf), 3 KIA Prob, 6 WIA Prob unable to effectively search area due to darkness.

021745H Co A (AT846495), received 350 rds S/A, A/W fire, from (AT850497). Returned 1200 rds S/A, A/W fire, 5 3.5 and 22 M-79 rds, 10 LAWs, directed Arty mission on enemy position. 3 enemy KIA (Conf) (bodies dragged away) 2 KIA (Prob), 2 USMC WIA Med Evac.

021750H A CP received 5 rds S/A fire. 1 USMC WIA. Returned 50 rds S/A A/W fire; enemy withdrew no further contact.

021800H Bn CP (AT837487) Marines digging position found approx (3) lbs medical supplies and documents; items forwarded to AN HOA Base.

022230H, received 9th Marines Frag 0 nr 1 to Op O 1-67. No change, continue Search and Destroy operation as planned.

030830H Med Evac helicopter received several hits from enemy ground fire forward of Co A, position. Co's A and B were directed to cross Phase Line Red and proceed to Phase Line White. Co B, directed air strike on possible enemy positions before crossing river. 47 Vietnamese were screened; 3 detainees to be evac'd to rear for interrogation by ITT; remaining Vietnamese were released.

031120H Co A, 1st Plt (AT847496) received 3 rds S/A fire while crossing river. Suppressed enemy fire with 60mm mortar fire and continued to cross; no further contact. Search of area vic (AT815409) resulted in finding 5 Vietnamese hiding in bushes, ages 16 to 50, with ID Cards, 1 gas mask, military clothing and boots; moved to Bn CP.

031255H Co B, (AT855496) received 10 rds S/A fire. Returned 50 rds S/A and continued mission. Throughout the day sporadic S/A fire was received from small units of enemy in the Battalions ZOA with the enemy fleeing the area as soon as Marine fire power was brought to bear. Numerous Vietnamese were picked up in the area, these were screened and several were evac'd to the rear for interrogation by ITT personnel. The majority were released. The largest contact was made when Co B, (AT856502) observed approx 20 armed enemy in green uniforms, with camouflaged material on their backs setting up a ambush position. An air strike was directed against the hostile action, 4 enemy KIA (2 by air) and 4 WIA.

031345H Co B at (AT864503) spotted 3 VC with camouflagage and fired 200 S/A rds and 40 60mm. Called air strike. Saw 2 VC fall, 1 VC fled North.

031500H Co A at (AT847508) found 1 VC KIA in bunker. Canteen & cover (1 VC KIA).

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031515H Co D observed 3 groups of 40 uniformed VC fleeing toward Northwest into treeline. Airstrike called involving 10 aircraft employing bombs, napalm, rockets and 20mm. AO reported good coverage on target resulting in 8 VC KIA (Conf) by napalm. VC fled into treeline vic (AT854508). VC hit again by air; Co A moved into search area; swept and found 2 VC KIA's by air strike. Killed one VC that fled, found extensive tunnel complex submerged with deep fighting holes, some entrances submerged in water. Many caves also found. Searched area & Destroyed caves & bunkers. Village almost destroyed. Found 6 CHI COM Grenades (11 VC KIA).

031730H Co E (AT957501) received 25-30 rds S/A fire vic (AT856497) as re-supply helo came into LZ. Returned 400 rds S/A and A/W, 5 M-79, 1 LAW. Helo's used LZ as enemy fire ceased. Operating forces established night positions.

040800H Co D continued S&D operation. Command group, Co E and Co A holding positions.

040900H Co A (AT863512) found village containing tunnel complex 10-12 ft. underground. Tunnels generally follow hedgerow and treeline; roots seen to reinforce tunnels wide enough for 2 men to stand abreast, 4 to 5 ft in height. In some areas there was about 2 ft of water. Platforms built on top of air holes could have been for breathing or fighting; many entrances capable of holding 8 to 10 men. Entire complex could hold approx a Pn used C-S gas; extensive search of caves with no contact with enemy. Attempted to blow some of caves. Many punji traps and foot traps containing 50 cal rds. Found 1 sidewinder missile; EOD notified.

At 051200H Co A (AT17525) found camouflaged cave in river bank, under water entrance. Cave approx 3x4x4 found 2 VC hiding in cave. Medical package and black PJ's; turned VC over to Vietnamese officials and continued to search river bank.

At 051345H Co E (AT884514) reported Bn CO helicopter received 1 rd S/A fire from vic (AT880515). Returned 50 rds S/A fire and 12 60mm. No further fire received.

At 051530H Co A (AT867528) assembled 200 refugees who were screened by DIA ICC Officials and directed to vic (A76512). Boats used to evac to DUC DUC Headquarters.

At 051530H Demolition Team from engineers arrived Bn CP. Destroyed cave and tunnel complex.

Located following tunnel and cave complex during days activity (AT864514) 1 to 1½ KM in length, runs from 4 to 6 feet in height 8 feet underground reinforced in places with 3 in bamboo poles. There were entrances about 15 meters and protective holes within huts connected to trench lines. The tunnel ran in NE direction for 200 meters and made 90 degree turn to the left and cont'd 500 meters back to the right in NE direction. Tunnel in places was large enough for man 5 feet 8 inches to walk upright. There were some portions of the tunnel, water made passage impassable and in other NE areas of tunnel there appeared to be diggings. Excavated dirt from tunnel works was scattered behind various huts. No attempt was

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made to reinforce sides and ceiling of lower portion of tunnel. When demolitions were used to destroy parts of tunnel that were freshly dug, secondary explosions were heard on two occasions. Several caves were estimated to be 15 to 20 feet in height. No attempt was made to enter caves at certain points because of suspected booby traps. Numerous entrances had large punji stakes on floor. On previous day while searching for tunnels 1 bamboo snake was killed near entrance sustaining the suspicion that many snakes might be in cave and tunnel complex. It is believed that the complex discovered and destroyed is only a part of the entire complex. (AT051600) 1 VC was killed in explosion. 1000 lbs of C-4 was used to destroy entrance and tunnel complex and is est. that 1/3 of the complex was destroyed. There were indications that part of the tunnel was used for an aid station or hospital, some medical supplies, gauze and cotton were found. Also found with 1 VC KIA was a rifle that was destroyed during explosion.

At 051550H Co A 1st Plt (AT870523) Marine walking down trail stepped in Punji trap. Marine treated, Med Evac not required.

At 051735H Co B (AT890518) Swept hamlet GIANG HOA (2) hamlet lightly fortified with several small bunkers and fighting holes, detonated 1 CHI COM grenade mine, destroyed 3 fighting holes and 2 fighting bunkers.

At 051715H Co A (AT867523 to AT863525) found evidence of new punji traps in area, found 2 VC hiding in cave. Search of river produced 3 sunken boats and 6 caves w/underwater entrances. Caves destroyed, found cache of Medical supplies in house, gas mask and Sundry items buried in floor. (AT863535) old man indicated mined gate, trip wire detonated and produced large secondary explosion on other side of gate. 6 VC indicated by PF's put aboard helo 40 men, 100 women, 117 children turned in as refugees.

At 051800H Division Engineers (AT864514) while demolishing tunnel complex found 1 VC in tunnel. (late entry) 1 VC KIA (Conf)

At 060040H Co F (AT877521) received 20 rds S/A fire from estimated 2 VC in treeline. Returned 200 S/A and 10 M-79 rds.

Activity for 06 February. Co B Rn Reserve with 1 Plt security for refugees, 1 Plt security for Engineers, and 1 Plt security for CP. Co A in blocking position along PL White. Co F attacking North in ZOA. Co H(-) providing position east of SONG THU PON.

At 060300H Co E (AT863510). 5 VC approached perimeter and were taken under fire; Blood trail indicated 1 VC KIA (Prob). VC left ID card and VC gas mask.

At 061200H Co B (AT877512) reported all refugees evacuated across river to DUC DUC Headquarters.

At 061210H Co B (AT877512) picked up 1 Vietnamese with CHIEU HOI pass. Vietnamese approx 25 years old forwarded to USA.

At 061400H Co E (AT873528) VC spotted leaving tunnel carrying weapon and crude pack; fired 10 rds S/A and destroyed tunnel resulting in 1 VC KIA.

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At 061400H Co A (AT868526) while searching Village, PF's found 1 Vietnamese boy hiding in cave (age 7). Boy had 1 gas mask, clothing, 3 note books and 1 map. PF believe note book to be of military value. PF's state boy is son of VC. Boy forwarded to CP by helo.

At 061500H Division Engineers (AT864516) completed destroying tunnel complex 2,940 lbs C-4 used.

At 062150H Co H (AT905525) received heavy volume of A/W fire plus a number of rifle grenades, knocking out radio. Illum from 81mm continued throughout night. Co H (-) was in block DSM.

At 070915H Co E completed sweep of village MY BINH (AT864542) without establishing contact with the enemy. Co's E and A to continue sweep of assigned areas and complete search of area.

At 071245H Co E (AT865542) received 5 rds S/A fire from due East of position. Did not return fire due to the proximity of friendly forces. 1 USMC WIA non evac. 071415H Co E (AT877524) conducted prep fire. 60mm HE rd landed short of target, 50 meters from tube and 500 meters from target. resulting in 1 USMC WIA Non Evac. Info on ammo malfunction as follows, 60mm case H, M-49AZ/with fuse M525/let MA1-361-F-1/charge 1/E1.1.

At 071445H Battalion continued S&D Operation in ZDA. Direction of attack to the east. 071515H on order from higher Headquarters direction of attack was shifted to northeast. Co's A and E establish a blocking positions vic MY HIEP (3) (AT983544) 1 Plt Co D commenced patrol along Northern edge PL White vic (AT887524) to the east through built up area (AT913533). Co H remained in blocking position.

At 071820H Co B (AT874520) received 100 rds S/A and A/W fire resulting in 1 USMC WIA. Returned 10 rds 60mm, 300 rds S/A and A/W, 18 rds 105mm Arty and air strike; enemy unit ceased fire; no further contact.

At 071630H Co B 2nd Plt (AT887526) spotted 4 to 5 armed VC; took VC under fire; pursued to hamlet (AT901528) found 1 VC KIA in hut with fresh head wound. Scout dog found hiding tunnel and flushed 1 VC from it. VC refused to halt and was taken under fire resulting in 1 VC KIA. Patrol pulled 1 45 year old male from tunnel and detained, flushed 1 VC from tree line into rice paddy. VC refused to halt and was taken under fire resulting in 1 VC KIA; 16 to 20 years old dressed in black PJ's. 3 VC KIA

At 080405H Co B (AT877520) defensive position threw grenade at movement in front of lines. 3 USMC returning on ambush patrol were hit by fragments resulting in 3 USMC WIA non-evac.

At 080700H FET stand-down commenced. Began withdrawal to extraction area.

At 081100H Co H (AT880509) 3rd Plt received 15 to 25 S/A rds from 7 VC; returned 10 to 15 rds S/A resulting in 1 VC WIA.

At 081141H Co A (AT869519) while crossing rice paddy found booby trap, device rigged with trip wire; blown in place.

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At 081230H Co B (AT063502) found 1 AT mine with pressure type device; blown in place.

At 081340H Co A (AT061512) searched area of tunnel complex. Majority of tunnels were destroyed. A few entrances remain, the connecting tunnels, however seem to have been caved in.

At 081610H Co A (AT046490) received 70 rds S/A and 1/W fire from est 10 VC, resulting in 2 USMC KIA with multiple wounds. Requested emergency Med Evac. Returned 220 1/W and 175 S/A, 20 M-79, 10 60mm and 24 rds 105mm HE. Enemy broke contact and retreated to the west.

At 081620H - 090000H Units conducted night activities preparatory to extraction and termination of the Operation. Nothing of significance occurred during this period.

At 090800H Helo extraction of 2nd Bn., (-)(Rein) 5th Marines commenced.

At 090900H Operation INDEPENDENCE terminated.

At 091100H During extraction of last elements of E/2/5 helos received SAF from western edge of LZ vic (AT041505). One helo was hit and sustained minor damage, no casualties. 1/S run on suspected enemy position.

At 091130H 2/5(-)(Rein) chopper from 9th Marines. 1/B 1/1 chopper to parent unit at that time.

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12. Administrative Matters. No administration plan was issued by the Battalion.

There were no difficulties encountered in the administration of casualty reporting.

a. Supply. An HST team was attached to handle the resupply requirements of the units involved. There was an HST team with each Rifle Company and one team with each of the two ~~Battalion~~ CP's. The resupply requests were handled by the HST team with the company via the Battalion CP in the field to the HST team at AN HOA.

Two H-34 helicopters were used for resupply but had to return to DANANG for refueling after about three resupply runs. (See paragraph 15)

b. Maintenance. There were no maintenance problems encountered.

c. Treatment of casualties and evacuation and hospitalization. Initial treatment of casualties was administered in the field by the unit Corpsman and either returned to duty or evacuated by helicopter to the Collecting and Clearing Platoon at AN HOA. Serious injuries and cases requiring surgery or lengthy medical care were further evacuated to the 1st Medical Bn. or NSA Hospital in DANANG. Total casualties evacuated to the 68C Flt. were 51 Marines and 53 Vietnamese. There were several casualties taken directly to DANANG when the evacuating helicopter was low on fuel.

d. Transportation. All transportation during operation INDEPENDENCE was by helicopters and except for normal delays from the requirement to refuel by going to DANANG, there were no problems.

e. Communications. Primarily, all radios utilized were AN/PRC-25's TACP and FAC teams used AN/PRC-41's as well as AN/PRC 25's. During the operation the use of the RC 292 was not necessary due to the exceptionally fine reception with the use of the whip antenna and tape antenna. Regimental tactical and admin. nets; all company tactical nets. Battalion tactical and admin nets were established during the operation. In addition to these nets, air, artillery and the HST established nets. The only interference noted on established nets occurred on the Battalion Tactical net. Atmospheric conditions were considered the cause.

f. Medical evaluation. The helicopter support for medical evacuation and medical resupply was excellent throughout the operation. No, serious problems were encountered. Medcaps were held in several hamlets whenever the tactical situation permitted during the operation.

13. Special Equipment and Techniques. A preliminary field test was conducted during Operation INDEPENDENCE using a pair of "Wire Rudders" for locating underground tunnels, structures, and for metallic objects. Several sets of "Wire Rudders" were delivered to 2/5 fwd. Command Group on the seventh day of the operation. The Reserve Company received a detailed explanation and demonstration and were issued two sets of wire rudders for employment during the remainder of the operation. Remaining two companies were issued two sets of rudders each, via resupply helicopters on 8 February. In that the operation terminated at 090900H Feb., these companies had little opportunity to employ and field test the wire rudders during Operation INDEPENDENCE. Company B, 1/1, did receive and use the wire

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rudders during the last day and a part of Operation INDEPENDENCE. Based on a verbal report of the Company Commander, Co B, 4/1, the following interim conclusions are submitted:

a. With a minimum of training, the average Marine can quickly become proficient in the use of the rudder.

b. Rudders were instrumental in locating tunnels and appeared in several instances to indicate direction of the tunnels.

The minimum time available with the wire rudders prior to the conclusion of the operation precluded use of the rudders to locate multi-leveled tunnel systems and tunnel slope. In anticipation of extensive future utilization and testing, additional wire rudders have been requisitioned for use by all maneuver elements of the Battalion.

14. Commanders Analysis. The kill ratio and the large number of PW's taken in this Operation is indicative of the results which can be obtained if an area is completely sealed off. The rapid insertion of the 2nd Bn(-)(Rein), 5th Marines into an area South of the LZ for the 2nd Bn(-)(Rein), 4th Marines, forced the enemy to move in a Northerly direction since he was blocked on the West by CIDG personnel from THUONG DUC SP Camp and on the East by the SONG THU BON itself and 1/5 blocking forces on its eastern bank. In so doing, the enemy repeatedly made contact with Marine forces to the North suffering heavy casualties. His attempts to move back to the South were blunted by 2/5's sweep to the North and Northeast and again he suffered heavy casualties. Helicopter support and fire support coordination were excellent throughout the conduct of the Operation. The Scout-dog again proved an invaluable asset in flushing VC from well concealed positions and in locating tunnel complexes.

Of special interest is the fact that enemy fortifications west of the SONG THU BON were positioned to meet an attack from the Northeast. By landing SW of these positions, 2/5 completely negated their effectiveness. In most instances the fortifications were well constructed and showed that detailed planning had gone into their positioning.

Preliminary field testing of Wire Rudders indicated that they assist in locating under ground fissures; further testing on future operations, however, will be needed to determine their complete applicability to the location of caves and tunnels.

The ease with which Co's A and B 1/1 assimilated themselves into the 2/5 combat structure is indicative of their high state of training and proved the feasibility of the interchange of units without the loss of combat effectiveness. Both companies are to be commended for a job "well done".

All indications pointed to long term occupancy of the area of operations by enemy forces. Although civilians in the area were not openly hostile and appreciated medical treatment given at BAS and C&C there is little doubt that the VC infrastructure therein controls most of the inhabitants activities. A successful R&D program can only be prosecuted when the VC hold is broken. In line with the above, I plan to conduct future operations in the area.

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15. Recommendations. It is recommended that in future operations utilizing the AN HQ1 Base, that sufficient AWGAS, pump and filters be placed at this location to refuel helicopters used for resupply and evacuation.

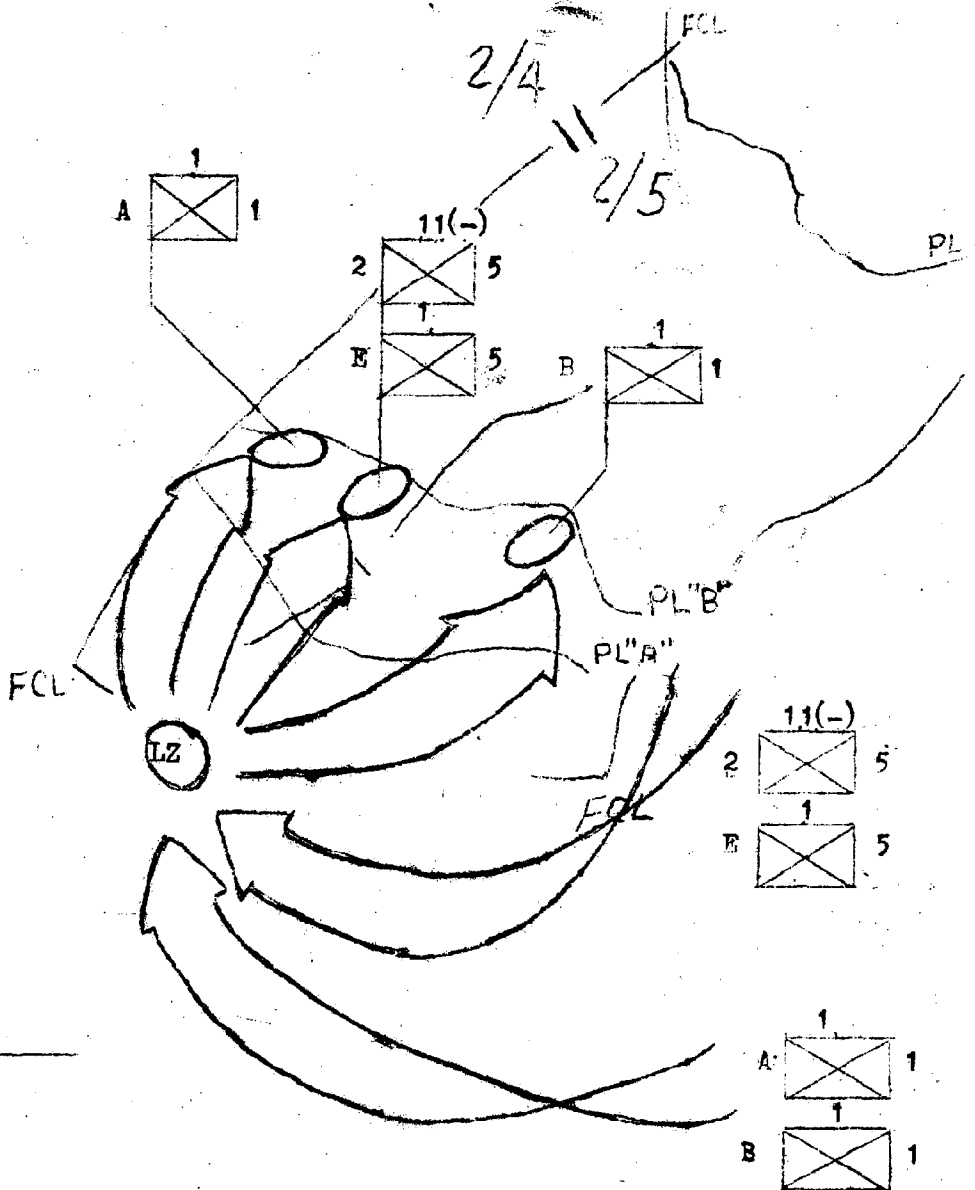
This will eliminate the requirement for helicopters to return to the DANANG area to refuel and the delay involved in support of the operation.

1. Reference (a) establishes definitions to be used in preparation of COMUSMACV'S US COMMANDERS DAILY SITUATION REPORT (SITREP)
2. Reference (b) offers further guidance in SITREP reporting and reaffirms the use of the definitions in reference (a).
3. Reference (c) directed that any additional unilateral or service sitrep requirements imposed upon III MAF should be addressed separately from reference (b).
4. The FMFPAC HISTREP utilizes the types of operations defined in reference (a) with the following exceptions:
 - a. AMBUSH operations are distinguished from general SEARCH AND DESTROY AND CLEARING operations and recorded as a separate action.
 - b. Only the function of GUARD AND ESCORT operations related to squad and platoon size security patrols is recorded.
 - c. SECURING is considered to be a phase rather than a type of operation and as such no attempt is made at this time to record SECURING operations.
 - d. SEARCH AND DESTROY and CLEARING operations conducted by squad and platoon size units are recorded under the single heading of COMBAT PATROL.
 - e. SEARCH AND RESCUE operations are not considered statistically significant and are not recorded.

5. Report forms to be used at the Division level for HISTREP input have been designed at this headquarters and will be promulgated by separate correspondence. Work sheets for the use as desired at the Regimental and Battalion level, will also be provided. In order to insure consistent reporting it is mandatory that the definitions contained in enclosure (1) be utilized in filling out these forms. While an attempt has been made to pattern these definitions after those contained in reference (a) so as to avoid dual reporting, at the lower echelons, it must be clear that they apply only to HISTREP input and should not influence reports required by other headquarters.

DEFINITION OF GROUND ACTION DISSCRIPTIVE TERMS USED IN THE FMFPAC HISTORICAL REPORT (HISTREP)

1. SEARCH AND DESTROY (S/D): An offensive operation conducted for the primary purpose of seeking out and destroying enemy forces, installations or resources. In search and destroy operations there is no intention of remaining in the area to establish security.
2. CLEARING (CLR): An offensive operation conducted for the primary purpose of clearing enemy forces from an area with the intention of maintaining friendly forces in that area to establish security.
3. AMBUSH (AMB): An offensive operation conducted from a concealed position for the purpose of surprising and destroying enemy units moving through the area.
4. COMBAT PATROL * (CMB): A platoon or smaller size SEARCH and DESTROY or CLEARING operation.
5. RECONNAISSANCE PATROL (REC): A patrol which has the mission of securing information concerning enemy strength, disposition, or installations within a specified area.
6. SECURITY PATROL (SEC): Patrols conducted to protect installations, limited areas, cargoes and shipments, or specific projects such as rice gathering operations.

* Field units may use the terms SEARCH and DESTROY and CLEARING for reporting squad and platoon operations so as to satisfy report requirements imposed by other headquarters, however these actions will be recorded in the FMFPAC HISTREP under the single heading of COMBAT PATROL.
