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B. Commander's Narrative of Significant Events

General: On 1 May, the 2/5 TAOR was radically changed. The Phu Lac (6) area bordered on the north and west by the Song Thu Bon, on the south by the Railroad Track and grid line 49 and on the east by grid line 98 and the Railroad Track was assigned to 1/7. The area north and west of the Song Thu Bon, excluding the coal mine complex at Nong Son (AT815383), was assigned to 3/7.

As a result of this change, during this period, major attention was focused on security of the An Hoa Combat Base (AT875475) and the pacification of the Antenna Valley.

Unnamed Operation 1-12 May

2/5 conducted a 12 day Battalion (-) Unnamed Operation in the Antenna Valley in support of Operation Union (1). Company E, Company G and Company H were committed. A brief resume of the operation follows:

2 May - Company G moved overland from a blocking position on the northern edge of Antenna Valley (AT894400). Company H moved one platoon into a blocking position in Ninh Binh Valley (AT839356). While in that position the Company G platoon observed VC in a tree line (AT840348) and took them under fire killing one and wounding another. The VC were carrying packs and a hammock.

Company E took up a position at the western end of Antenna Valley (AT858405) preparatory to beginning a sweep east through the Valley.

The Company H platoon blocking force observed 4 VC (AT835353) and called in a 4.2" mortar mission with negative results.

Company H (-) moved to the blocking position on highground on the southern edge of Antenna Valley (AT887382).

3 May - Company H, still in blocking position (AT887382), observed 5 VC with packs and weapons and called in 105 mission resulting in 2 VC KIA (Prob). Company H observed 10 more VC (AT870394) and called in another 105 mission resulting in 3 VC KIA (Prob).

A Company G platoon in blocking position (AT893399) received 10/15 rounds small arms fire. The Marines returned the fire and swept through the enemy positions. The action resulted in one VC KIA and the capture of one cartridge belt with 30 cal. machine gun ammo.

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Company E began the sweep to objective 1 (AT885395) making light to negative contact. After setting in for the night at (AT887397) Company E received 100 rounds small arms fire. Small arms fire was returned, but a sweep through the area conducted at first light yielded negative results:

4 May - Company G swept the northern edge of the Valley from (AT893399). While Company E and Company H held their respective positions. During the movement east, a lead element of Company G was ambushed by 15 VC. The platoon returned fire and swept through the enemy positions. The action resulted in 1 VC KIA (Conf), 15 detainees and the capture of one cartridge belt and 2 ChiCom grenades.

Company H (-) observed 8 VC from its position on the highground south of the Valley road and called in a 105 mission. A Company E platoon in the vicinity of the strike swept through the area of the mission finding bloody clothing indicating 1 VC KIA (Prob). Eleven detainees were picked up during the sweep.

Company E swept to objective (AT907392) receiving light sniper fire throughout the day. During the sweep caves were located, searched and blown. While continuing to move down the valley, Company E received 30 rounds small arms fire. Fire superiority was quickly gained and the enemy positions swept. The action resulted in 1 VC KIA (Conf) and 3 PW's.

A Company G resupply chopper received 50 rounds of small arms/automatic weapons fire. The incoming fire was quickly suppressed by Company G ground forces, however, a search of the suspected enemy positions yielded negative results.

All units set in Company Patrol Bases and conducted night activities, with negative contact.

5 May - All companies maintained their Patrol Bases; Company E (AT889398); Company G (AT916377) and Company H (AT887385).

A Company E platoon, while patrolling back to the west (AT870397), received 100 rounds automatic weapons fire. Fire was returned and the suspected enemy positions swept with negative results.

Company H observed 5 VC (AT867393) from their Patrol Base on the high ground, and called in a 105 mission which resulted in 3 VC KIA (Prob). Company H later observed 8 VC (AT866393) and called in an additional 105 mission. A sweep of the area resulted in the discovery of 5 VC KIA (Conf) with indications of 2 VC KIA (Prob).

The Company E platoon, while continuing its' patrol received light sniper fire. Fire was returned and the area was swept. During the sweep,

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several caves were discovered. The caves were blown and a large secondary explosion was noted.

Company G observed 8 VC with weapons (AT921408) and quickly deployed one platoon in an enveloping maneuver. The Company G unit took the enemy under fire and accounted for 2 VC KIA (Conf). Later, a Scout Sniper Team attached to Company G observed 2 VC (AT914395). The snipers took the enemy under fire accounting for 1 VC WIA.

All units returned to their original patrol bases to conduct night activities.

6 May - Company E and Company G continued the attack to objective 3 (AT926380) and objective 4 (AT928365/935366); Company H maintained position.

Company E received sniper fire from (AT918399); returned fire and swept the area with negative results.

Company G spotted 5 VC (AT920370) and called in a 105 mission and an airstrike. A Company G sweep through the area of the attack revealed pools of blood indicating 3 VC KIA (Prob). During the sweep, 7 detainees were picked up.

Company E again received sniper fire from (AT907374). A 105 mission was called and the area immediately swept through with negative results.

7 May - Company I and Company G continued the attack east in the Valley toward objective 4 (AT935366) and objective 5 (AT938367).

Company G observed 3 VC (AT919365) and quickly took them under fire, quickening the pace of the attack. The Company easily swept through the enemy positions killing 1 VC (Conf) and capturing a Tompson Sub Machine Gun. Other equipment captured included .45 Cal ammo, M-14 pouches, a rain coat, a first aid kit, rice, a whistle, a cartridge belt and miscellaneous papers.

Company H observed 5 VC (AT910392); a 105 mission was fired resulting in 3 VC KIA (Prob).

Company G observed 1 VC (AT912364) and took him under fire. The action resulted in 1 VC KIA (Prob).

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2/5 was ordered by CG, 1stMarDiv to assume blocking positions (AT9135-AT9237) while 1/5 and 3/5 continued to sweep west toward the eastern end of the Antenna Valley. 2/5 units were already deployed in the general area of the designated blocking position and continued to operate in that area.

8 May - Company E and Company G remained in the general area of the blocking position (AT9135-AT9237) and continued to work from Company patrol bases. Company H remained in its original position.

While on a sweep, a Company G patrol came under sniper fire (AT917355). The Marines returned fire and swept the area with negative results. Minutes later, Company G again came under sniper fire (AT912354). Again Marines returned fire and swept through the suspected enemy positions with negative results.

Company G received fire from (AT923366); returned fire and swept through the area. A large tunnel complex with spent .30 Cal ammo casings in it was discovered. CS gas grenades were used and the cave was searched and destroyed.

Company H observed 3 VC (AT869394) and called in a 105 mission resulting in 2 VC KIA (Prob).

Company E received fire from (AT925415); called in a 105 mission and swept the area. Pools of blood and drag marks indicated 2 VC KIA (Prob).

2/5 received orders from CG, 1stMarDiv to assume new blocking positions at (AT970368) and (AT960354). Company H was to remain in the same position.

9 May - Company E & Company G moved from Objective 4 and Objective 5 to Objective A (AT952365) with Company E continuing to Objective B (AT962367) and Company G continuing to Objective B (AT960360). Company H maintained position. Command Group Alpha joined Company E for the move.

Company G and Company E had reached Objective A when orders were received from CG, 1stMarDiv to return to original positions.

Company E returned to hill 90 (AT913367) for the night and Company G took up positions to Company E's south. Both companies conducted night activities from these positions.

While moving back to hill, Company E spotted 12 VC occupying Company G's former position. An artillery mission was called in and Company G swept through the area of the strike and found 2 VC KIA and indications of 3 VC KIA (Prob).

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10 May - Company E and Company G continued to move west down the Antenna Valley toward objective 6 (AT887375) and objective 7 (AT885371). Company E, while sweeping the valley, received 12 rounds automatic weapons fire from vic (AT920372). The Company E Marines returned fire and drove through the enemy positions. The action resulted in one VC KIA.

Company G observed 2 VC with one weapon (AT904370) and took them under fire. Sweeping through the enemy positions, Company G discovered one VC KIA.

Company E continued the attack to the Nong Son Combat Base and Company G continued the attack to the Company H southern blocking position (AT839356). Company H (-) moved off the highground to Objective 8 (AT862402).

11 May - Company E operated with squad and platoon (-) patrols around the Nong Son position and Company G operated around the southern blocking position in Ninh Binh Valley. Company H operated around the vicinity of Objective 8.

Company G observed 2 VC with weapons (AT834373) and took them under fire. The search of the area yielded negative enemy kills, but a cache of 25 lbs. of rice and 30 gals. of water were discovered in a small cave. The provisions were confiscated and the cave destroyed.

Company F moved to objective 8 and relieved Company H which returned to the An Hoa Combat Base.

12 May - Company F established a Patrol Base in the western end of the Antenna Valley (AT874402) and worked the area with extensive squad and platoon sized search and destroy patrols.

Company E remained at the Nong Son Combat Base and Company G worked the Ninh Binh Valley area.

On the evening of the 12th, and on order of CG, 1stMarDiv, Company E and Command Group Alpha returned to the An Hoa Combat Base and Company G moved to, and assumed the responsibilities of the Nong Son Combat Base.

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1-10 May

Although heavily committed in a Battalion (-) operation, 2/5 Marines continued to operate in other areas of responsibility around the TAOR with effect.

On 1 May, reacting to an intelligence report from CAC N-1 at Ninh Binh (3) (AT825375), Company H, positioned at the Nong Son Combat Base (AT823388), successfully utilized 81MM illumination, xenon search lights and a privately owned high powered scope to locate a group of VC moving near CAC N-1's position. An 81MM fire mission was called on the enemy resulting in 7 VC KIA (Prob).

A closer rapport between 2/5 Marines and local Vietnamese inhabitation seemed to grow during this period. On 5 May, 2/5 Civil Affairs and 29th Civil Affairs representatives visited CAC N-1 and GVN officials located at Ninh Binh (3) (AT825375). The visit included the inspection of the new, enlarged Free Market area that was constructed by the villagers in conjunction with the CAC unit. The construction was supervised by the Ninh Binh (3) Hamlet Chief.

Another indication of the Vietnamese growing trust in 2/5 Marines was the increased influx of accurate intelligence reports. On 9 May a Company F platoon sized patrol investigated a Vietnamese civilian report that the VC were planting mines in the Phu Da (1) area (AT867492). The patrol discovered and destroyed a VC bunker containing 8 M-16 mines.

VC activity increased around the An Hoa Combat Base. On 9 May, intelligence reported 100 VC in the vicinity (AT887482). An artillery mission was called in on the suspected enemy positions and swept through by a Company F patrol at first light. Although the number of VC kills was unknown, later intelligence indicated that the mission had discouraged a VC attempt to overrun CAC N-2 at Mau Chanh (2) (AT888473). At the same time that the CAC unit was being threatened, a VC public address system was set up south of Mau Chanh (2) (AT896476) and broadcast to the inhabitation of that village. The presence of CAC N-2 in Mau Chanh, however, has reduced VC activity in that area.

11-20 May - Following the securing of the operation, Company H was relieved in place in the western end of Antenna Valley by Company F, and returned to the An Hoa Combat Base. Company G returned to the Nong Son Combat Base and Company E accompanied the Battalion CP to An Hoa.

Company F continued company and platoon size operations in the western end of Antenna Valley making minor contact and several sightings indicating that Antenna Valley is still "Indian Country".

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Further indications of enemy activity in the Antenna Valley were registered by Company G, while working out of the Nong Son Combat Base. On 14 May, a Company G platoon combat patrol/patrol base received enemy fire on two separate occasions during the day. In the first action, the platoon received 10-15 rounds S/A fire from an estimated 3 VC (AT878393). Fire was returned and a 105 mission called in. The enemy fire was suppressed; a sweep through the area resulted in no indication of enemy casualties. Two hours later, the Company G unit received 50 rounds S/A fire from two high powered weapons suspected to be BAR's (AT879596) and (AT875394). The superiority was gained by the Marines, silencing the enemy weapons, but again a search of the area yielded negative enemy casualties.

On 15 May, in response to orders from CG, 1stMarDiv, Company E was chopped OPCON to 1/1. As a result of the chop, Company F was moved from its position in the western edge of the Antenna Valley to the An Hoa Combat Base. Company E remained OPCON to 1/1 until 17 May.

The newly constructed market place at the Free Market Hamlet of Ninh Binh (3) (AT8237) was officially dedicated on 17 May. Major Ham, Duc Duc District Chief officiated the dedication ceremony which was attended by 2/5 and Army Advisory Staff representatives. 800 Vietnamese turned out for the dedication, a testimony to the work being done by CAC N-1, stationed in Ninh Binh (3).

On 16 May, A Company G platoon combat patrol received 3 rounds S/A fire from 6 VC (AT825335). The unit immediately gained fire superiority and swept through the enemy positions. The action resulted in 5 VC KIA's (Conf) and the capture of 1 ChiCom grenade and 15 rounds of 30 Cal ammo.

On 18 May, Company F launched a highly successful search & destroy operation in the eastern edge of the TAOR in the vicinity of Alligator Lake (AT965485). On the evening of the 18th, three enemy were sighted (AT980478). A platoon was deployed in the attack. While maneuvering in the attack, 15-25 more enemy with packs, helmets, light gray uniforms and weapons were sighted in the vicinity of the first three. The Company continued the attack, while highly effective supporting arms fire, including 81MM mortars, 155MM guns, was brought in the enemy positions. The action resulted in 10 enemy KIA (Conf) and 5 Enemy KIA (Prob). Further search of the village netted 38 detainees and 3 PW's, as well as miscellaneous equipment including 4 packs, 4 uniforms, 4 cartridge belts, 15 ChiCom/M-46 grenades and 4 documents. The effective use of supporting arms coupled with a spirited and tactically sound attack, enabled Company F to achieve major success without suffering one Marine casualty.

Setting up the Company (-) in the vic of Phu Lac (2) (AT981475), and a reinforced platoon with attached 81MM's on the high ground vic (AT994490), extensive activities were conducted. Leaving the reinforced platoon on the high ground.

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Company F (-) continued the attack east on 19 May. Shortly after moving out, the lead element spotted 3 VC with packs and weapons vic (AT999480) and took them under fire, firing 5 rounds S/A. The accurate Marine rifle fire resulted in two enemy KIA (Conf), testimony to the high caliber of Marine's rifle marksmanship training and the individual Marine's ability to use his skill in combat.

The Company F platoon swept through the position and captured 3 ChiCom grenades, 2 clips of M-1 ammo and two packs with military gear and documents, the weapons had been removed. Questioning of the local villagers revealed that 5 main force VC had moved through their village prior to the Marines coming in. Company F continued the attack to the east.

While sweeping the area, Company F discovered 3 VC KIA's stuffed into a hastily constructed grave (BT000480), increasing the number of KIA's (Conf) from 10 to 13 (Spot Report 181800H).

On 19 May Company E was chopped OPCON to 7th Marines by CG, 1stMar Div in conjunction with Operation DuVal and remained under the 7th Marines operational control until 25 May. The loss of Company E necessitated the return of Company F to the An Hoa Combat Base, securing a highly successful operation.

20-31 May

In spite of increased Marine activity in Antenna Valley, VC continued to be an ever present threat. On 22 May, Company G, located at the Nong Son Combat Base, worked two platoons in the western end of the Antenna Valley in counter rotating patrols. One platoon (AT879398), received 30 rounds S/A fire from 3 VC (AT877395). The other platoon working in close proximity to the first (AT875394), immediately deployed one squad through the sniper position. The squad was able to maneuver into the enemy positions before the enemy knew they were there. The action resulted in 2 VC KIA (Conf) and captured equipment including 1 US M-14 rifle SN-113655, 1 SR-5, SN-k7747, 1 cartridge belt, 7 full M-14 magazines, 10 rounds 7.62 short, 3M-26 grenades, 1 ChiCom grenade and miscellaneous documents.

CAC N-2 was probed weekly for the first few weeks of its existence, however extensive and aggressive combined patrolling suppressed enemy activity near Mau Chanh (2) (AT888472). On 22 May, while departing Mau Chanh (2) position, CAC N-2 heard two Vietnamese talking behind a hedgerow. They maneuvered through the hedgerow and observed two VC sitting on a rice paddy dike. The Marine/PF patrol issued a challenge, which was not heeded, and took the enemy under fire, killing one and wounding the other. Captured equipment included 1 US cartridge belt, 1 US compass pouch and ChiCom grenade.

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Mining activity picked up during this period in the north western portion of the TAOR, vicinity (AT8648 - 8650 - 9348 - 9350). In an area that had previously been mine free, mining incidents began to occur. On 24 May a member of a Company F patrol detonated an M-16 mine.

On 29 May, a combined PF, RF, Marine operation was conducted in the south western area of 1/7's TAOR vicinity (AT8749-8751-9149-9153). A PF unit swept northeast from (AT8750 to 9051), while the 369th RF Company swept in the same direction from (AT8749 to 9050). Company E provided a blocking force from 903020 to 905491. Again mines proved to be costly.

One mine incident resulted in one RF KIA and 3 RF wounded. Overall, however, the operation was highly successful, accounting for 4 VC KIA (Conf) and 1 VC WIA. The 369th performed well, making maximum use of the supporting fire available at the An Hoa Combat Base. It was noted that the 369th performance was greatly improved as a result of new aggressive leadership.

On 24 May a drill checking the An Hoa defense was conducted. The purpose was to check the warning devices as well as observe the reaction of the troops. Within 7 minutes after the siren sounded, all movement in the camp ceased, the Marines being in their fighting holes and ready. As calls went out from the combat operations center, attached and supporting units reacted quickly. On the word that the lines had been breached, a reaction platoon from Company F was quickly deployed to reinforce the lines.

When the red star cluster went up, signaling that internal defense fires commence, all movement in the camp stopped.

The drill indicated a need for a louder initial warning system. Steps are presently being taken to improve this one weakness in the defensive signaling system.

County Fair (S-16) held at Mau Chanh (2) (AT888471) from 25 to 27 May resulted in resounding success mainly because of the efforts of the S-5. A VIS team conducted speeches on both days and movies were shown both nights by and Audio Visual team. One thousand people were issued allegiance cards and 3,500 newspapers were distributed.

The III MAF Drum & Bugle Corps performance added greatly to the success of the Fair as did a highly successful Med-Cap which treated over 600 Vietnamese.

Company F provided the cordon force while GAC M-2 and the 2nd PF plt, provided the sweeping force. Visiting officials at the Fair included LtCol M.C. JACKSON, Bn Commander 2/5 and Major Ham, Duc Duc District Chief.

On 27 May, a Company H platoon sized patrol met with major success in the western edge of the Antenna Valley (AT869395). While moving to an ambush site voices were over heard in a house at the above coordinates. Marines entered the house and came face to face with 4 VC with weapons.

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The Marines opened fire on the VC as they attempted to escape. The action resulted in 2 VC KIA (Conf) and the capture of 5 weapons including 2 M-14's, 2 carbines and 1 M-1; 4 packs, 3 cartridge belts and 6 ChiCom grenades.

The patrol immediately set in an ambush near the two VC bodies. Early in the morning on 27 May, two VC entered the killing zone. The Marines opened fire killing 1 VC (Conf) and wounding the other who escaped into heavy brush. Although the unit was unable to find the body, large pools of blood were found, indicating one VC KIA (Prob). The action also netted the capture of 1 ChiCom rifle.

On 27 May, Company F chopped OPCON to 1/5 in conjunction with Operation Union (2). Company H remained at the Nong Son Combat Base. Company G provided An Hoa Perimeter security and Company E served as Maneuver Company at An Hoa.

- a. Morale is considered excellent.
- b. The Marine Corps Exchange located in An Hoa provides excellent service. Since the relocation of the PX there has been an increase in stock and a larger variety of items. All necessities are available.
- c. Chaplains Activities: Catholic and Protestant services were held during the month. Protestant Sunday Services totaled 10 with an attendance of 282. Holy Communion Services numbered 3 with attendance of 52. Catholic Sunday masses totaled 6 with an attendance of 223. The Chaplain held two lectures on religion in Vietnam with 50 personnel attending. 8 visits were made to companies in the field. The Chaplain made Hospital visits to 1st Medical Battalion, NSA and the USS Repose. 51 Professional counseling interviews were held during the month.

4. Intelligence:

- a. General. Routine intelligence processing during May was accomplished by processing intelligence from 1st Marine Division (G-2), 7th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Regiment, 1st CIT, 3rd ITT, Duc Duc District and the An Hoa Security Force. Routine debriefings of patrol leaders were also used.
 - (1) Patrol debriefing forms from 1st Recon Bn were also used.
 - (2) Dissemination of intelligence was made by Spot Reports, daily intsums, and daily briefings.
 - (3) Members of the S-2 gave four hours of classes to the new arrivals in the Battalion. The classes included History/Political Situation of Vietnam, Terrain, Weather, Enemy Situation and Capabilities, Detainees and PW's, Kit Carson Scouts, and weapons used by the VC. In addition, classes were given to the S-2 scouts on Prisoner Handling, Map Reading, Foreign Weapons, and the TFS-21.
 - (4) Liaison visits were made to Duc Duc District Headquarters, 1/7, and 1st Marine Division (G-2).
 - (5) Scouts were employed with the rifle companies during the entire month.
 - (6) Kit Carson scouts worked 25 days with the rifle companies.
 - (7) One new Kit Carson Scout joined the Battalion in the month of May.

b. Briefings

- (1) Briefings were held daily and as required. Those briefings are given by the Intelligence Officer or Intelligence

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Chief and cover intelligence matters received.

c. Reports

(1) Spot Reports, Daily Insums, Kit Carson Scout Reports, (Daily and Monthly), Weekly Special Agent reports, and the Reward Fund Report were submitted.

(d) Training Plans - A Staff NCO and Officer's training program was drafted during the month. The program, which includes all phases of the military, will be offered as tactical commitments allow.

6. Special Operations:

(a) The Nong Son company outpost (AT814383) security was effected through the use of platoon (+) and company (-) patrols and patrol base with particular emphasis on the western end of the Antenna Valley and the Ninh Binh Valley. River patrols were continued to suppress enemy movement near and on the river.

(b) Squad and platoon sized day light patrols around An Hoa Combat Base (AT875475) provided an effective recon/security screen.

(c) Ambush patrols, listening posts, and platoon sized patrol bases were employed around the clock, adjacent to both combat bases.

(d) Engineer sweep teams with security/combat units were employed daily on Liberty Road north to check point 3 (AT900490) and south to Nong Son to prevent mining and sniping incidents along that route.

(e) Companies E, G, H and Battalion Command Group (A) conducted an Unnamed Operation on 1 - 12 May.

(f) Company E was chopped OPCON to 1/1 on 15-17 May.

(g) Company F conducted a 3 day Search and Destroy operation in the northeastern portion of the TACR in that area known as the Alligator Lake area (AT970483).

(h) Company E was chopped OPCON to 1/7 on 19-25 May.

(i) Company F conducted County Fair (5-16) at Mau Chanh (2) (AT888472) on 25-27 May.

7. Nuclear, Biological, Chemical Warfare and Defense:

(a) CS Grenade M7A2 and CS-1 Grenade M25A2

(1) Used to clear tunnels, caves and bunkers.

(2) Used during operations and patrols to contaminate caves and tunnels to prevent re-entry and further use by the enemy.

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(b) A complete inventory of all NBC equipment within this Battalion was held with all shortages noted and ordered.

(c) For defense, the Battalion has ordered individual protective kits MSA3, Protective Rubber clothing and rubber gear.

8. Command and Control: Lt. Col M. C. Jackson, Jr. commanded the Battalion during the month of May. During the month of May, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment remained ADCON to 5th Marine Regiment, and OPCON to 1st Marine Division.

9. Close Combat:

a. Combat patrols from the Nong Son Combat Outpost and the An Hoa Combat Base made frequent contact with the enemy. Marines pursuit of the enemy resulted in close combat on numerous occasions.

b. Units deployed on an unnamed battalion (-) operation engaged in close combat with VC troops from 1 May to 12 May. (See Unnamed Operation, Commanders Narrative of Significant Events.)

10. Fire Support:

(a) Battery E, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines, stationed at An Hoa Combat Base, supported 2/5 units in the field during the month of May.

(b) 1st Plt, 3rd Eight-Inch Howitzer Battery, also provided artillery support during the month of May.

(c) Attachment (two 4.2" mortars) from Battery W, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines, located at the Nong Son Company Outpost (AT814383) supported company operations and patrols in the area.

11. Air Defense: None(a) Combat Close Air Support:

(1) Fixed Wing Support: During the month of May, the 1st Marine Air Wing provided air support for the Battalion (-) ten day Unnamed Operation and for other routine requests throughout the month. Eight (8) flights, four (4) FAC controlled and four (4) TACA controlled were utilized in support of the operation. All support was excellently controlled and produced good results. Three (3) Spooky aircraft were employed during the month.

(b) Helicopter Support: Helicopter support was provided by the 1st Marine Air Wing. Eighteen (18) emergencies, twenty-five (25) priority and twenty-one (21) routine med-evacs were completed for an average completion time of twenty-seven (27) minutes, fifty-nine (59) and seventy-seven minutes respectively. Logistically 10,545 lbs. and 108 passengers were moved on an emergency basis; 40,783 lbs. and 399 passengers on a priority basis; and 3,224 lbs and 118 passengers on a routine basis for a total of 54,544 lbs and 617 passengers. Nineteen (19) further logistics requests were made and cancelled for various reasons (weather, lack of helicopters, etc.)

(c) TAC (A): The 1st Marine Air Wing provided fourteen (14) TAC (A) during the month of May. The reconnaissance and artillery adjusting was generally excellent and allowed the Battalion to operate more safely and rapidly when utilized.

12. Logistics:

(a) During the month of May, there was only one operation in the field involving an S-4 representative. No significant problems areas were encountered in supporting units in the field.

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During the operation, a Battalion Forward Distribution Point was established at Nong Son with two S-4 representatives and two battalion supply representatives present to control the distribution of materials. The forward distribution point worked very well during the operation. Since the termination of the operation the tactical situation has dictated the ~~cessation~~ of the forward distribution point.

During this same operation, the Battalion employed five Helicopter Support Teams. HST teams were attached to each of the three companies in the field, one was attached to the Command Group and one was employed here at An Hoa Combat Base to coordinate all HST efforts with the Battalion S-4 and the LSU. During the first days of the operation a few difficulties were encountered in HST coordination but these difficulties were quickly corrected and all efforts were directed toward accomplishment of the mission.

During the month of May, fuel bladders were installed here at the An Hoa Combat Base which now gives this base the capability of refueling aircraft in this area during regular flights or regular operations. This is a great asset in that support aircraft do not have to return to DaNang to refuel during resupply/med-evac missions.

(b) Supply: During the month of May, Battalion Supply supported one operation within the TACR in addition to the normal activities. A total of 591 documents were submitted during the month. Of these 591 documents submitted, 34 were priority 2's with 12 completions. Another 28 were priority 5's with 4 completions.

(1) A new Battalion Supply (SOP) was published this month as BnO P4400.1.

(2) During this reporting period the Battalion participated in the opening of the Self Service Center at Fleet Stock Account.

(3) The only significant problem area in the supply field during this period was the usual shortage of blank forms and the continued short supply of medium size upper body armor.

(4) It has also been noted that a number of shipments received by this command were not complete. They were missing gear and some had improper shipping documents. These discrepancies have been referred to Division Supply.

(c) Motor Transport

(1) The initial performance of Motor Stables was conducted during the month of May with 25 drivers participating. Results were very good.

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(2) During a period of one week this month, three (3), M422A1 vehicles lost the reverse gear. It has been determined that the suspected cause is not due to drivers negligence but rather to wear and age of vehicles.

(3) The most significant problem area is still the second and third echelon deadlining of vehicles due to the lack of repair parts. M-274 tire tubes size 7.50x10 are an extremely critical item.

(d) Equipment

(1) Construction of the new messhall is completed and it is now in operation.

(2) The new well is at a depth of 70 ft. Casing is presently being installed and it is anticipated that the new well will be operational within two weeks.

(e) Engineers

(1) During the month of May, the engineer platoon supporting this command has participated in every operation involving units of this command.

(2) Engineers have swept Liberty Road to the north almost daily. They have swept the road to the outpost at Nong Son as required.

(3) During the period covered by this report, the Engineer Platoon has installed 2800 meters of double apron fence and 250 meters of zig zag, four strand fence in support of the An Hoa Combat Base defensive perimeter.

(4) An engineer demolition team is presently assigned to the company committed to Operation Union II.

13. Communications:

(a) General: Communication section participated in one major operation during May in support of 5th Marine Regiment. A unique field communications set-up was installed at Nong Son which provided telephone, radio and message center capabilities for the commander. Initial steps were taken to install a complete message center and technician repair facilities if Nong Son is utilized as a forward command post.

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(b) Message Center: Conducted regular teletype communications with 165 outgoing messages and 943 incoming messages.

(c) Wire:

(1) Relocation and the acquisition of a new 20KW generator now provides the Battalion with more efficient electrical power.

(2) A small generator, PE-75, was installed to provide continuous electricity for the COC and message center.

(3) Diagrams were submitted to Division for a new semi-dial telephone system for the An Hoa complex.

(4) Progress has been made to provide the Battalion with a MARS capability. Completion of this project is scheduled for next month.

(d) Technicians:

(1) The Tech shop worked completely around the clock to repair the essential radio equipment while the Command Group was at Nong Son.

(2) Close coordination with LSU has insured the Battalion of immediate response for 3rd Echelon Maintenance Repair Equipment.

(e) Radio:

(1) All equipment working properly with minimum amount of down time on radio vehicles and cryptographic equipment.

(2) Extensive use of the DY-8 installed in the MRC-109 proved to be very satisfactory.

(3) Handsets H-128 for the AN/PRC-25 continue to be a major problem. Twenty-six handsets are down and no immediate replacements available.

(f) Batteries:

(1) BA-30 flashlight batteries remain to be in sufficient supply.

(2) A critical shortage of BA-386 batteries for the AN/PRC-25 continues to be an acute problem. No immediate relief of this situation is foreseen, however, every effort is being taken to acquire a greater supply than present.

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14. Civil Affairs/Civic Action:

a. General: During this reporting period, Civic Action activities centered mainly on relocation of refugees from Operation Union, medical treatment given at 2/5 BAS, and at County Fair 5-16. There has been a great increase in activity of the Civic Action Program of 2/5. With daily visits to Hamlet and Village Chiefs, plus thrice weekly Med or Dent Caps. Due to the use of the Rewards Program, much information is being sent to this command on VC activities and mines. In addition a .45 Cal Pistol, has been turned in to us by a Vietnamese National. Plans are being made to increase Psy-Ops in this THOR.

b. Medical Assistance: The Battalion Aid Station has done a fine job in assisting the Civic Action Program during this month. The following is a breakdown of the treatment administered:

e. Public Improvements: During this reporting period, the Free Market at Ninh Binh (3) (AT825375) was completed and officially opened 17 May 1967. Approximately 800 merchants sold their produce on that day. Work is continuing on the Mau Chanh refugee settlement (AT885465), and enlarging of the school. Plans are to run water lines to Mau Chanh and the Thanh My refugee settlement (AT868475).

f. County Fair Activities. A county Fair was held at Mau Chanh Hamlet, Xuyen Phu Village, Duc Duc District (AT887472). The County Fair began at 250600H May 1967 and secured 270730H May 1967.

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Company F, 2/5 was used to establish security. The local PF unit checked out the people entering the perimeter. The District Chief of Duc Duc, Major Ham, arrived with National Police, VIS and Hanlet officials, at 250800H May 1967. The III MAF Drum and Bugle Corps arrived and performed for the people on 25 May. The people were in a highly receptive mood, and seemed very appreciative of the music provided. The Audio/Visual Team set up their equipment and the VIS spoke to the gathering periodically during the day. In the evening, Audio/Visual Team proceeded to show films until 2130. The following day, 26 May, LtCol Jackson talked briefly to the people. Clothing was then presented to those gathered. In addition, soap, newspapers, allegiance cards, and hand bills were given to the people. Medical and Dental teams were active both days, treating 460 medically and 200 for dental. Pictures were taken by S-5 2/5. Films were shown by Audio/Visual again the evening of 26 May until 2130. Due to other commitments, the Vietnamese Cultural Drama Team which was scheduled, could not participate. Over-all, the County Fair was considered very successful.

1. SITUATION

a. Enemy Forces

(1) The 3rd NVA Regiment also known as the 31st NVA Regiment is known to be operating in the Que Son Area SE of Antenna Valley. Pressure exerted by Marine/ARVN units during Operation Union is known to have forced the enemy to withdraw; one of the likely routes is through Antenna Valley.

(2) Recent Intelligence reports seem to indicate a sharp increase in enemy sightings within the Antenna Valley.

b. Friendly Forces

(1) 5th Marines (Rein) conducts S&D Opns SE of Area of Operations and is in position to block any enemy withdrawal through the Eastern Passage of Antenna Valley.

(2) 1st Recon Bn is in position on high ground East and West of the Valley to maintain surveillance over the entire Area of Operations.

(3) 1st Marine Air Wing supplies 2 helos each for Med-Evac and resupply missions; Aircraft to be prepositioned and remain at An Hoa throughout the conduct of the Operation - Fixed Wing available on call.

(4) E/2/11 direct support from positions at An Hoa.

(5) VN forces (PF, RF and District Security Police) provide assistance to refugees who desire to leave Antenna Valley.

(6) At 0700 D-Day Psy War Aircraft will broadcast a plea for VN to leave Valley. A collecting point will be set up on the western edge by the 5th Plt 29th Co Company.

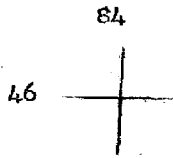

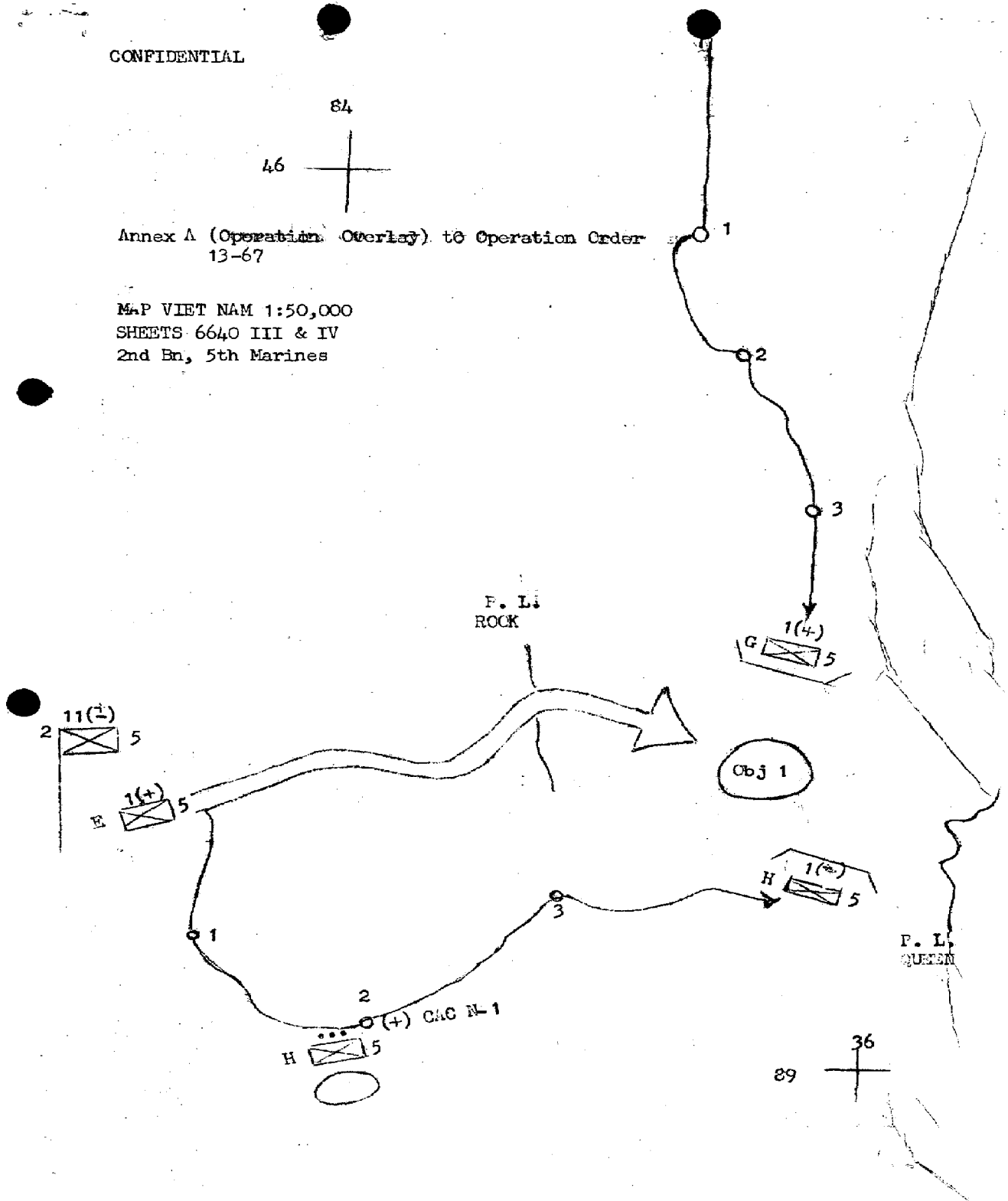

2. CHARACTERISTICS OF THE AREA OF OPERATION

(b) Terrain - - The operation area is generally mountainous, cut with steep ravines and interspersed with valleys. Antenna Valley runs generally in a NW to SE direction; from the SONG THU BON, vicinity AT8540, Southeast to AT9263. This valley is flanked by commanding terrain. Many smaller valleys emanate from the main valley. The valley is interspersed with small hills and ridges, but consists mainly of rice paddies bounded by dikes and hedgerows.

(1) Drainage - The valley floor is the main drainage for the surrounding mountains. Numerous streams, irrigation ditches, and canals run throughout the valley. After a prolonged rain the stream paralleling the road at the east end of the valley, and paralleling the road at the west end will become extremely difficult to cross. This should cause no problem this time of year.

(2) Man Made Construction - The most significant man made features are the hamlets and the road running completely through the long axis of the valley. The hamlet locations are depicted fairly accurate on the map. The road is raised 4 to 5 feet above the rice paddies, and is passible by foot traffic even after extensive rains. There are 5 bridges along the course of the road, which were still intact on 9 Jan 67. The bridges are constructed of rail road rails covered with runway matting. The bridges are in a bad state of repair and would probably have to be reinforced for vehicle traffic.

(3) Vegetation - The mountainous areas are thickly vegetated with shoulder high brush, and canopy extending to 50 foot in the higher elevations. Cross country movement is restricted almost exclusively to the existing trails in the mountainous areas. Long range observation is limited and fire control is limited due to the heavy vegetation. The low land area is under cultivation and offers fair observation except near inhabited areas. The inhabited areas are surrounded by large hedgerows and observation is restricted.

(4) Observation and Fields of Fire:- Because of surface irregularities and the dense vegetation on the high ground, observation and fields of fire are restricted except across the large rice paddies.

(5) Transportation: - At this time of year there should be no foreseen problems that would hamper most types of vehicles. Vehicles such as Mules and Mighty Mites should carry 2 heavy wooden planks for spanning partially destroyed bridges.

(6) Avenues of Approach: - There are two avenues of approach into the valley. The valley can be entered anywhere along its entire mouth at the west end. The approach into the valley from the east, is made via the road running thru the pass. This road is generally 10 to 12 feet wide. Caves are spaced every 20 meters along the road from AT935 366 to AT980 354. This entire pass is fortified and controlled by the enemy. There is strong evidence that the enemy uses the following trails as avenues of approach and exits from the valley. AT9337, AT9135, AT8537, AT9040, AT9240.

(7) Key Terrain Features - Nearly all of the high ground surrounding the valley could be considered key terrain, but there are several more that have more military importance.

(a) Hill 452 located AT835 377 controls the entrance to the valley, and permits observation east to grid line AT885. The hill also provides observation to the south along the river. The hill is a location of a permanent recon outpost.

(b) Hill 170 located AT887 382 provides observation both east, west and north into a smaller valley. The hill controls traffic along the road. The hill is covered with grass and scrub bushes.

(c) Hill 454 located AT903 413 permits observation over most of the valley and particularly into the smaller valley running to the north. This hill is not accessible by foot traffic and is often overcast reducing observation.

(d) Hill 90 located AT935 365. This hill controls the entrance to the pass, and allows observation over the valley floor in the Southeast portion of the valley.

(e) Hill 579 located AT946 345. This hill controls the pass and allows observation along most of the road from AT9735 to AT8939.

(c) Politics: The Antenna Valley area comes under the control of the District of Duc Duc. The district headquarters has virtually had no influence there since 1964. Refugees taken out of the valley in Dec 66 stated that the VC have completely controlled the area since 1964. Approximately 2500 civilians were helped to leave the valley in Dec 66, during operation "Mississippi". In Jan 67 during operation "Lincoln" only 29 civilians showed the desire to leave. It is felt that the remaining villagers are strongly VC orientated.

(d) Sociology: The civilians in the valley are predominately rice farmers, that are native to the valley. The religion is strictly Budist.

3. ENEMY SITUATION

(a) Strength and Composition: Enemy forces in and adjacent to Antenna Valley is believed to be the 105th Local Force Bn, supported by 150 to 200 local guerrillas. A battalion size unit of the 3rd NVA Regt has been constantly reported operating in the Quo Son area to the east of the valley.

(b) Strengths and Weaknesses: The primary enemy strengths are their familiarity with the area, resulting in greater overland mobility, and their ability to rapidly disperse or mass within the respective operating area. The enemy has developed a high degree of self sufficiency through their system of taxation, barter, and confiscation. They are able to extract from the people the man power money, shelter, and supplies required to sustain their operations. The enemy has an excellent intelligence system which provides them both political and military information. The enemies most significant weaknesses are their vulnerability to air and artillery, and their lack of supporting arms.

(c) Disposition: The enemy forces can be expected to be dispersed throughout their respected area. Intermingled with the civilian population. Concentrations of enemy troops, from squad to company size can be expected, throughout the entire valley area.

(d) Arms and Amament: The enemy can be expected to be armed with a variety of S/A, A/W, 60MM and 81MM mortars, 57MM recoilless rifles, and 12.7MM AA capabilities.

(c) Recent and Present Activities: The objective area has been completely VC controlled since 1964. Approximately 2500 civilians have been taken out of the valley during Dec 66 and Jan 67, as a result of Marine Operations.

It has been reported that a VC platoon operates in the general area of AT8739 with the mission of blocking the civilians in the valley.

The 105th Local Force Bn is believed to be operating in the general area of AT9135. Recon patrols recently discovered a 500 man base camp at AT885 343, and a smaller camp at AT912 339. Recon sightings also indicate a strong flow of enemy into the valley during the month of February.

(f) Reinforcements: Within 12 hours march of the valley, the enemy can reinforce with approximately 1 regt of unknown size. The reinforcing could come from the Que Son area or below the Nong Son area at AT7936.

4. ENEMY CAPABILITY

(a) Enumeration

- (1) To attack friendly forces within the Antenna Valley with a force of up to 1 battalion,
- (2) To defend at a time and place of their choosing, using the previously mentioned forces.
- (3) To conduct small scale ambushes, sniping, and harrassment.
- (4) Withdraw into the high ground leaving only a small screening force behind.

(b) Analysis and Discussion:

(1) Capability (1)

(a) Favored by the enemies knowledge and control of the area.

(b) The restricted movement allowed friendly units in the valley.

(c) Mitigated against by the control of favorable defensive terrain and the lack of heavy supporting arms.

(2) Capability (2)

(a) Favored by the enemies possession of favorable defensive terrain which is extensively fortified, and of his own choosing, and by his need to protect vital logistic and base areas. Mitigated against by his reluctance to stand and fight against superior supporting arms.

(3) Capability (3)

(a) Favored by the enemies familiarity with the terrain and the ability to quickly break contact, disperse, and mingle with the population. Often used as a delay tactic while the main unit withdraws. Mitigated against by his inability to defend vital logistic and base areas.

(4) Capability (4)

(a) Favored by the enemies usual reaction to friendly operations and his proximity to areas in which he can find a haven. Mitigated against by the necessity to protect vital areas.


5. CONCLUSION

(a) Enemy will probably execute capability (4) upon the initial entry of the marine forces, until the intentions of the attacking forces are determined.

(b) Enemy will resort to capability (3) and (4) when the intentions of the attacking forces are determined.

(c) Enemy will resort to capability (3) when he feels the attacking forces are leaving the valley.

(d) Enemy will resort to capability (2) only when his escape is impossible, or when an important logistic center is in danger.

AFTER ACTION REPORT "OPERATION MISSISSIPPI"7. Intelligence

a. Enemy strength in the area of operation was carried by 1st and 3rd Mar Divisions to include the 3rd NVA Regiment and elements of the 1st VC MF Regt.

b. Information obtained from suspects revealed that elements in the DAI PHONG (1) Hamlet were NVA/VC mixed. NVA and MF units were said to pass thru this hamlet regularly. The 90th BN of the 1st VC Regiment continued to appear in the interrogation of suspects.

c. Contacts were from 1 to 14 men. Tactics employed were small unit sniper fire, and ambushing the rear elements of march columns. With the exception of the ambush at AT985 354 where contact was held for three hours, all contacts were broken immediately by the enemy.

d. During the period from 29 October to 7 December the main VC activity centered in the area of Hamlet (1) SON DUC DUC District. This VC unit was believed to be in the strength of 40 men.

e. From the LZ (AT985 354) to AT937 365 the trail West was characterized by mountainous terrain with fighting holes about every 20 meters. These holes were cut into the side of the mountain and "L" shaped. The holes were freshly dug on the Western side of the pass. There were 5 streams in the pass. The streams were bridged with steel runway matting supported by railroad rails. The bridges ranged from fair to excellent for foot traffic. From AT937 365 to AT860 400 there are rice paddies on each side of the trail with the mountains to the rear of the paddies. The hamlets in the vicinity of AT9237 are characterized by fighting holes and trench lines with tunnels throughout. The mountains surrounding the valley are very steep and covered with extremely thick foliage. Movement into the mountain areas is extremely difficult.

f. Viet Cong influence has prevailed in this area since November 1964. Large numbers of the populace were willing to help the Marines with information. Over 2,000 people chose to relocate when given the chance.

g. Routes of communication were foot trails and paddy dikes. All of the trails and especially the main trail are excellent ambush sites.

h. There were no mines or booby traps encountered, and from the screening of suspects there were none reported in the area.

i. An ITT Team and CI Team were employed very successfully in the field. A large amount of use full information was gathered, 2 weapons found, and a large rice cache discovered due to their efforts.

7. Intelligence

a. Enemy strength in the area of operation was carried by 1st Marine Division G-2 and S-2, 2D Battalion, 5th Marines as 1 Local Force Battalion supported with an unknown number of guerrillas.

b. Information obtained from villagers indicated that a Local Force VC platoon generally operated in grid square 8739. Also, that a Main Force Battalion was operating in the Dai Phong area (AT9236).

c. Enemy contacts were from 1 to 20 men. Tactics employed were small unit sniper fire. Only one ambush was encountered, in which F Company received 400 rounds S/A fire at AT865 387.

d. During the operation the contacts were encountered in grid square AT8638, and along the road in grid squares 8739, 8640, 8540.

e. The hamlets in the valley are characterized by trenches, and fighting holes. The streams and rice paddies were extremely flooded and channalized movement.

f. Very few people were encountered in the valley. Most were unfriendly and uncooperative. Many of the hamlets were completely deserted. The hamlet at AT924 369 was completely deserted and appeared to have been destroyed by the VC.

g. Routes of communication were foot trails, paddy dikes, and the road running E to W through the center of the valley. Most of the trails and paddy dikes were under water and travel was extremely hampered. The river and high ground to the south of the road in grid squares 8938, 8839, 8739, 8639 offers excellent ambush sites.

h. An M-16 with a pressure type device was discovered and blown in place at AT859 389. RF's in the area claim that many low hills in the valley are mined both by VC and RF's.

Psychological Warfare

One leaflet drop was made on 080800H in the area bounded by grid squares 9040, 9340, 9036, 9336. The drop informed the villagers desiring relocation to contact the Marine units operating in the valley. A Kit Carson Scout and 14 RF's were also employed to talk with the villagers.
