5. CHAPLAIN

a. Sunday Services

(1) Catholic Services. A total of 4 Sunday Masses were conducted

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for 2/5 at An Hoa. The chaplain also held 16 masses for the Regiment and attached units. Total attendance was 326 and 326 received communion.

(2) Protestant Services. Four (4) Protestant Services were held for 2/5 at An Hoa by the Regimental Chaplain. Four (4) services were held at Liberty Bridge by the 3/5 chaplain.

b. Weekday Services

(1) Catholic Services. A total of 23 weekday services were held for 2/5 at An Hoa and for the companies in the field. A total of 790 attended and 740 received communion.

c. Non-Denominational Prayer Services. An evening prayer service was held daily at 1800 in the 2/5 chapel.

d. Red Cross Cases. During the month of April, ten cases were referred to the Red Cross for action.

e. Counseling Interviews. The 2/5 chaplain interviewed an average of five Marines daily. These interviews included personnel from Regiment and 3/5 as well as 2/5.

f. Memorial Services. During the month of April, one memorial service was held.

g. Battalion Chaplain. The 2/5 chaplain is responsible for all Catholic services for the Regiment and attached units, as well as his regular duties with 2/5. During the month of April, he also assumed responsibilities for conducting services for Combined Action Program (CAP) units 2-9-1 at Thong Duc and 2-9-2 at Duc Duc and the Combined Unit Pacification Program (CUPP) units in 3/5's area of operations.

h. Protestant Services. Four (4) Protestant Services were held for 2/5 at An Hoa by the Regimental Chaplain. Four (4) services were held at Liberty Bridge by the 3/5 chaplain.

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Activities for April 1970 took place in the expanded Regimental Area of Operations. They included security operations conducted along Liberty Road and at Liberty Bridge Combat Outpost, and company size Reconnaissance in Force operations in the Arizona and Goi Noi Island areas. Contact was scarce, although sightings and fire missions were frequent. Mines and boobytraps continued to plague the Battalion and accounted for most of the casualties. Emphasis was continuously placed on preventive measures.

On 1 April, Echo Company continued to provide security for Liberty Bridge, Hotel Company continued to provide security for Liberty Road, Fox Company continued Reconnaissance in Force operations in the Arizona Area, and Golf Company was the Regimental Reserve with a squad OPCON to the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion on Hill 119.

i. Memorial Services. During the month of April, one memorial service was held.

g. Battalion Chaplain. The 2/5 chaplain is responsible for all Catholic services for the Regiment and attached units, as well as his regular duties with

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On the night of 31 March and the early hours of 1 April, the VC/NVA attempted to destroy Liberty Bridge by floating a bamboo raft down river carrying a 250 pound bomb and explosives, rigged to entangle on the structure. Three men from Echo Company unhesitatingly entered the water and struggled with the raft, freeing it and pushing it further down river where it was destroyed.

On 2 April, a platoon of Echo Company conducted a tank/infantry operation resulting in 37 bunkers destroyed and 450 pounds of foodstuff captured.

On 4 April, a platoon from Hotel Company on patrol received small arms fire from a village. They returned fire and assaulted the village resulting in 7 VC/NVA KIA's. They captured a 60mm mortar tube, one AK-47, one SKS, one M-16 and assorted ordnance along with foodstuffs. Twenty-one villagers were detained for questioning.

From 5 April to 16 April, the Battalion took part in the Stack Arms Program, with a company at a time helilifting to Danang for the 48 hour in-country R & R. During this period, Bravo Company, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines became OPCON, and on 6 April, were helilifted to Goi Noi Island where they conducted Reconnaissance in Force operations until 16 April.

On 8 April, Golf Company assumed the security of Liberty Bridge.

On 9 - 10 April, in response to an intelligence report, a platoon from Delta Company, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines was chopped OPCON to this Battalion and was helilifted into a suspected enemy position. They received fire and sweep the area with negative results.

On 10 April, Echo Company assumed the security of Liberty Road.

On 14 April, Hotel Company was helilifted to the Arizona Area and began Reconnaissance in Force operations.

From 16 - 20 April, a search and clear operation was conducted in the Arizona area. Maneuver forces included the Battalion command group, Hotel and Foxtrot companies, a Reconnaissance platoon from the Due Due Regional Forces and four tanks from 1st Tank Battalion. This effort resulted in 9 VC/NVA KIA, one VC POW, 36 detainees, two weapons, assorted ordnance, equipment and over 5000 pounds of foodstuff captured.

On 21 April, Foxtrot Company began Reconnaissance in Force operations in the Goi Noi Island area. On 24 April, a squad was sent to Hill 119 to provide security for an armed propaganda team until 27 April, during which time they were OPCON to the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion on Hill 119.

On 27 April, Foxtrot Company returned to An Hoa and became OPCON to the 5th Marines as Regimental Reserve with a squad still OPCON to 1st Reconnaissance Battalion on Hill 119.

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PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

A. TOPICS1. Personnel and Administration

a. Strength. The Battalion strength at the beginning of April was 46 Officers and 1183 enlisted. At the end of the month, the strength was 44 Officers and 1062 enlisted. The Battalion joined 2 Officers and 2 enlisted. Four Officers and 122 enlisted were dropped from the rolls. Casualties sustained by the Battalion during the month of April were as follows:

b. Discipline, Law and Order. During the month, the Battalion legal officer processed four Special Court Martials, 15 Battalion Office Hours and 16 Company Office Hours. There were 11 Special Court Martials pending and two Marines were placed on legal hold because of trials or pending investigations. Eight Marines are confined in the III MAF Brig.

(1) One Marine was declared a deserter, and eight other Marines are in an unauthorized absence status.

c. Postal. During the month, the Battalion Mail room has experienced no uneven flow of mail. The Battalion Mail Room was moved to a new and more adequate facility. An inspection was conducted by the Division Inspector and a satisfactory rating was received.

d. Awards. The Battalion processed 8 awards. They consisted of 1 Navy Cross, 3 Silver Stars, 3 Bronze Stars and 1 Certificate of Commendation. A total of 9 awards were received; 3 presented; 6 readdressed and forwarded.

2. Intelligence

a. Enemy. During the reporting period, the enemy was elusive and contacts were small. Although elements of the 91st Sapper Battalion were reported in the area of operations, no confirmed contacts were made. One NVA prisoner was captured in the eastern AO who provided information about enemy logistic activity within the AO. Intelligence information predicted a period of high threat from possible enemy attack to begin on or about 1 May 1970.

b. Weather. The weather was not a significant factor. The average daytime temperature was 83 degrees while the average night temperature was 74 degrees. The only rain was received between the 25th and 29th of April when 1.47 inches fell. The precipitation hampered planned operations during that

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particular period by making movement very difficult.

c. Terrain. The terrain in the AO for the reporting period was primarily lowland rice paddies with patches of high ground covered with treelines and bushes.

3. Organization and Operations

a. The following units were attached or detached during the month of April:

(1) Golf Company was the Regimental Reserve from 1 - 5 April with a squad OPCON to 1st Reconnaissance Battalion on Hill 119.

(2) Bravo Company, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines was OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines from 5 - 16 April and conducted Reconnaissance in Force operations in the Goi Noi Island area.

(3) The 1st Platoon of Delta Company, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines was OPCON on 9 - 10 April for a helilift operation on an intelligence target.

(4) A reconnaissance platoon from the Duc Duc Regional Forces was OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines for a search and clear operation from 16 - 20 April.

(5) Foxtrot Company assumed the Regimental Reserve from 27 - 30 April with a squad OPCON to 1st Reconnaissance Battalion on Hill 119.

A search and clear operation was conducted from 16 - 20 April in the Arizona area. Units involved were the Battalion Command Post group, Hotel and Foxtrot companies, a reconnaissance platoon from Duc Duc Regional Forces and 4 tanks from Charlie Company, 1st Tank Battalion.

Numerous tank/infantry operations were conducted both east and west of Liberty Road during the month.

b. Supporting Arms

(1) Tactical Air Support. Air Support for the Battalion totaled 17 close air support missions. Gunships and A-1H's supported the Battalion on numerous occasions. Over 591 meters of treelines were destroyed along with 19 structures. A total of 338 bombs comprising 76 tons of ordnance were dropped on targets causing 3 secondary explosions.

(2) Helicopter Support. A total of 83 Marines and 20 Civilian casualties were evacuated during the month. The average time for emergency evacuations was 25 minutes. Priority evacuations averaged 48 minutes and Routine evacuations averaged 40 minutes. 920 personnel were helilifted to and from Stack Arms. Two Company sized lifts into insecure zones were accomplished during the month.

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(3) Artillery and 81mm Mortars. In April, artillery expended 3,051 rounds on 190 fire missions and 8,927 rounds for harrassment and interdiction fires. The 81mm mortars expended 6,618 rounds in direct support.

4. Schools and Training. During the month of April, two Marines attended Indoctrination Training. General Military Subjects Training was conducted every Saturday afternoon in the Battalion Rear at An Hoa, Rifle Companies,, when in the Battalion Rear area, took advantage of low activity periods for further training and indoctrination. During the period 8 and 9 April a Corpsman from the Division Inspector's Office gave lectures on Drug Abuse. One presentation was held in the Command Post at An Hoa, the other was held at the Liberty Bridge Combat Outpost. Training consisted of the following topics:

5. Logistics

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a. General. During the month of April, this Battalion achieved a C-1 rating in percentage of equipment readiness. The Battalion maintained this status throughout the month. Continued stress was placed on first echelon maintenance and improvement was noted in all commodity areas.

b. Administrative. During the month new Standing Operating Procedures (SOP) Orders were published for Ordnance, Fire Prevention and Motor Transport Maintenance.

c. Cantonment Structures and Facilities. Several minor projects were completed during the month. The shower decking was replaced and the shower area was enclosed. The BAS bunker was wired and the BAS administrative unit was moved to the bunker. Engineers installed a new grease trap in the Battalion messhall and all trash points were enclosed. During the month a new 100 KW generator was installed as a replacement for the old defective generator.

d. Mess Operations and Facilities. The messhall continued to provide excellent food service throughout the month.

e. Transportation. The deadline rate at the motor pool continued to improve during the month. During April six M-274A2's, three M-151A1's, and one M-37B1 were removed from deadline. Six new M-149 water trailers were received from Force Logistics Command during the month of April.

f. Supply. The main supply effort during the month was directed toward elimination of excesses. During the month all Table of Equipment items were inventoried and action was taken to eliminate those items found to be in excess. At present, Battalion supply has a program in effect to eliminate all excesses both T/E and non T/E. It is anticipated that all excesses should be eliminated in the near future.

g. Medical. The BAS remained at An Hoa Combat Base this reporting period. Again the physical setup changed slightly this month as the Health Record Office was moved into the newly constructed bunker behind the present BAS. The forward BAS no longer exists as such, because letter companies at the bridge now supply their own corpsmen for medical care and for daily Med-Caps at Phu Loc (6). Present strength of the BAS is one Medical Officer and 51 hospital corpsmen.

a. Malaria: Five (5) cases were reported.

b. Venereal Diseases: 13 cases: 13GC.

c. Rabies: Two (2) cases were reported.

d. Heat Casualties: No cases were reported.

e. Routine Medical Complaints: Dermatitis - 57, Gastroenteritis - 39, Orthopedic - 17, Ear Disorders - 26, Cellulitis - 59, Eye Disorders - 21, FUO - 36, Miscellaneous Disorders - 127, URI - 48.

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f. Statistics. A total number of 789 patients were seen for an average of 27 per day.

7. Communications

a. Radio Transmission. With increased emphasis on secure voice radio operation, the First Marine Division CEO authorized additional Nestor equipment to all infantry battalions which enabled 2/5 to cover TACP Local and 81's COF Nets. Fewer security violations are expected.

b. Wire Communications. The Battalion Wire Section has provided wire coverage to additional fighting positions assumed in the expanded defensive perimeter of the An Hoa rear. The Wire Section has installed new power lines to the 81's area, motor pool and Echo Company.

c. Equipment. The Battalion has gained additional equipment as a result of a redistribution from other units. They include a MRC-109, 2 KY-38's, 2 KYK 28's, and 4 PRC-77's.

8. Civic Action. All Civic Action Operations have been transferred to the Regimental S-5.

9. Statistics for the period

a. Through contacts and fire missions 10 NVA and 56 VC were KIA.

b. During the month 99 people were detained. ITT classified these detainees as 1 VC, 4 NVA, 83 Innocent Civilians, and 8 Civil Defendants. Three Hoi Chans rallied to Foxtrot Company in the Arizona area on 3 April 1970.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

1. Heading:

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

JOURNAL
