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7 June 19705. CHAPLAINa. Sunday Services

(1) Catholic Services. A total of 5 Sunday Masses were conducted for 2/5 at An Hoa. The chaplain also held 29 masses for the Regiment and attached units. Total attendance was 528 and 528 received communion.

(2) Protestant Services. Five (5) Protestant Services were held for 2/5 at An Hoa by the Regimental Chaplain.

b. Weekday Services

(1) Catholic Services. A total of 11 weekday services were held for 2/5 at An Hoa and for the companies in the field. A total of 315 attended and 315 received communion.

c. Red Cross Cases. During the month of May, four cases were referred to the Red Cross for action.

d. Counseling Interviews. The 2/5 chaplain interviewed 18 Marines during the month.

e. Memorial Services. During the month of May, four memorial services were held.

f. Battalion Chaplain. The 2/5 chaplain is responsible for all Catholic services for the Regiment and attached units, as well as his regular duties with 2/5. During the month of May, he also assumed responsibilities for conducting services for Combined Action Program (CAP) units 2-9-1 at Thung Duc and 2-9-2 at Duc Duc and Combined Unit Pacification Program (CUPP) units in 3/5's area of operations.

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Activities for May 1970 showed a considerable increase over the previous month. The Battalion continued to provide security for Liberty Road and Liberty Bridge Combat Outpost. Company size Reconnaissance in Force operations were conducted in the Arizona, Phu Nhuans, and Goi Noi Island areas. Contact was increased over the previous month as were sightings and fire missions. The Battalion employed cordon and search techniques with excellent success. A number of tank/infantry operations produced good results during the month also. Mines and boobytraps continued to plague the Battalion and accounted for most of the casualties. Emphasis was continuously placed on preventive measures.

PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

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On 1 May, Golf Company continued to provide security for Liberty Bridge. Echo Company continued to provide security for Liberty Road. Hotel Company continued Reconnaissance in Force operations in the Arizona Area, and Fox Company was the Regimental Reserve.

On 5 May, two platoons from Echo Company conducted a tank/infantry operation in the Phu Nhuan which resulted in 5 VC/NVA KIA, 3 detainees and 14 bunkers destroyed.

Exploiting a high priority intelligence report concerning locations of members of the 91st Sapper Battalion, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines requested a Pacifier Operation on 6 May. Alpha Company, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines Pacifier became OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines and was inserted southwest of Le Bac Island resulting in 8 VC/NVA KIA.

On 7 May, Echo Company (-) conducted a tank/infantry operation employing Hotel Company (-) as a blocking force in the Phu Nhuan area. The activity accounted for 8 VC/NVA KIA, 1 detainee, 12 bunkers and 5 boobytraps destroyed and 1 AK-47 captured.

On 8 May, at 0145H Golf Company at Liberty Bridge received stand off by fire attack and ground assault from an unknown size enemy force. The incoming, consisting of 60mm mortars, 82mm mortars, B-40 rockets and small arms fire, inflicted 21 friendly WIA's, 12 of which were non-evacs. Enemy casualties were 10 KIA's. Weapons and ordnance captured included 4 AK-47's, 4 RPG rounds, 2 sachel charges and 20 Chinese Communist grenades. It was believed that the enemy's route of withdrawal would be to the foothills to the south of the Bridge. Reacting to this possibility the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines directed a platoon from Echo Company to block the enemy withdrawal route and called in the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines Pacifier. The enemy were located and the pacifier accounted for 10 VC/NVA KIA's.

On 13 May, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-) with four tanks conducted a cordon and search operation of Le Nam (1) south of Le Bac Island. Maneuver forces included the Battalion Command Post, Hotel and Fox Companies, a reconnaissance platoon from Duc Duc Regional Forces and four tanks from 1st Tank Battalion. The village was cordoned by first light and a detailed search commenced employing the Marine platoon in cooperation and coordination with the reconnaissance platoon from Duc Duc Regional Forces. The VC/NVA were routed from numerous well concealed spider holes which laced the village. The activity resulted in 2 VC/NVA KIA, 24 VC/NVA POW's, 3 of whom were NVA doctors, and 65 detainees. Assorted weapons and gear captured included one AK-47, three 9mm pistols, numerous documents and clothing, and great quantities of medical gear including stethoscopes, forceps and surgical tools, enough equipment to staff a forward field hospital. A Pacifier reacted to enemy evasion tactics resulting in 8 VC/NVA KIA's.

On 14 May, Hotel Company returned to An Hoa and became the Regimental Reserve until 17 May with one squad reinforcing Hill 119 until 18 May.

On 16 May, Fox Company assumed security of Liberty Bridge and Golf Company took over security of Liberty Road.

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On 17 May, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-), consisting of the Battalion Command Post, Hotel and Echo Companies and a Popular Force platoon from Duc Duc Regional Forces conducted a cordon and search of Le Nam (2). Acting on intelligence gained from interrogation of POW's captured on 13 May, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-) conducted a helilift assault from An Hoa. Minutes after the units were landed the cordon was closed and surprise had been achieved. A methodical search by district forces and Marine units followed, routing the enemy from spider holes and tunnel complexes. The results of the action were 6 VC/NVA KIA's, 18 POW's and 21 detainees. Weapons and gear captured included 3 AK-47's, 3 SKS's, 1 M-16, 2 mortar sites, 2 Chinese Communist grenades, 1 Chinese Communist K-63 radio, and miscellaneous documents and medical gear. There were no Marine casualties inspite of intense enemy fire during the initial landings.

On 18 May, a temporary cessation of offensive operations was observed from 181200H to 191200H. On 19 May, Echo Company began Reconnaissance in Force in the Phu Nhuan area and Hotel Company became Regimental Reserve in An Hoa.

On 19 May, a platoon from Echo Company, a platoon from Golf and a Popular Force squad from Duc Duc Regional Forces guided by a Chieu Hoi, conducted a tank/infantry operation in the Phu Nhuan area to exploit intelligence information. The Chieu Hoi led the units to numerous enemy spider holes which resulted in 8 VC/NVA POW's and 1 AK-47 captured.

On 21 May, a platoon from Hotel Company escorted by four tanks was led into the La Thap area east of Liberty Road by a Chieu Hoi. Once again the Chieu Hoi led them to numerous spider holes which were subsequently destroyed. One SKS weapon was captured.

On 23 May, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-) conducted a cordon and search of the Thon Bon area south of Le Bac Island. The maneuver elements included the Battalion Command Post, Echo and Hotel Companies and a Popular Force platoon from Duc Duc District. No enemy were found; however, one AK-47 and one SKS were captured. Eighty detainees were interrogated by CIT and ITT and a psyops program was executed.

On 23 May, a beacon flight was conducted east of Liberty Road at grid AT917459 which resulted in more than 50 secondary explosions. Five additional beacon flights were conducted during the month.

On 25 May, Hotel commenced Reconnaissance in Force on Goi Noi Island, and Echo Company became the Regimental Reserve until 28 May.

On 27 May, a tank/infantry operation was conducted in the Phu Nhuan area with two platoons of Echo Company, two Regional Force platoons from Duc Duc District, and four tanks from 1st Tank Battalion. The enemy was observed twice at long range in groups of three. The VC were fired upon by the tank and infantry units and the area was swept with negative results.

On 27 May, Liberty Bridge received two 82mm rounds 300 meters south of the Bridge and two lob bombs south of Phu Loc (6). No casualties or damage resulted.

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On 28 May, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-) conducted a cordon and search of My Hiep (1) in the northern Arizona area reacting to intelligence reports that My Hiep (1) was a VC/NVA staging area. With the Battalion Command Post, Echo and Hotel Companies and the National Police Force unit from Dai Loc as maneuver elements, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-) was helilifted into My Hiep (1) at first light. The first wave received intensive small arms fire when entering the zone; however, contact was light once on the ground. Three VC/NVA were killed and 290 Vietnamese villagers were screened by IFF, CIT and the National Police Forces from Dai Loc. Ten were classified as Viet Cong. Marine units detonated two booby-traps, one a daisy chain of M-26 grenades resulting in one KIA and 4 emergency medevacs.

On 30 May, Echo Company commenced Reconnaissance in Force in the Arizona in the vicinity of Football Island and Hotel Company began moving overland from Liberty Road to Goi Noi Island to conduct Reconnaissance in Force.

On 31 May, Hotel Company operating east of Liberty Road observed 18 enemy moving south. Hotel Company set up a blocking force and immediately called in the Pacific from 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. Employing gunships and a ground assault the Pacific accounted for 5 VC/NVA KIA's and 5 detainees.

A. TOPICS

1. Personnel and Administration

a. Strength. The Battalion strength at the beginning of May was 44 Officers and 1061 enlisted. At the end of the month, the strength was 38 Officers and 1089 enlisted. The Battalion joined 3 Officers and 104 enlisted. Nine Officers and 76 enlisted were dropped from the rolls. Casualties sustained by the Battalion during the month of May were as follows:

b. Discipline, Law and Order. During the month, the Battalion legal officer processed one Special Court Martial, 16 Battalion Office Hours and 21 Company Office Hours. There were 15 Special Court Martials pending. Eight Marines are confined in the III MAF Brig.

(1) Two Marines were declared deserters.

c. Postal. During the month, the Battalion Mail room has experienced no uneven flow of mail.

d. Awards. The Battalion processed 20 awards. They consisted of 2 Silver stars, 1 Legion of Merit, 7 Bronze Stars and 10 Navy Achievement Medals. A total of 11 awards were received; 4 presented; 7 readdressed and forwarded.

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2. Intelligence

a. Enemy. During the reporting period, enemy contacts were both friendly and enemy initiated. Enemy activity was generally light and scattered. The enemy has been primarily concerned with logistical and reconnaissance activity. Spread throughout the month of May, four Battalion (-) sized Operations were held, each lasting two to three days. Overall success was experienced by initiating surprise attacks on areas known to be heavily populated with VC and NVA or enemy sympathizers. The capture of several VC and NVA during these operations has and will further assist in locating enemy units within the AO. The majority of the friendly initiated contacts were with small groups of two to six enemy. The enemy usually fled after such contacts were made. The enemy was primarily local VC guerrilla; however, recent intelligence extracted from POW's captured this month indicated that several NVA units are operating in the AO.

b. Weather. Comparing this month to last month, rainfall has slightly increased. The average daytime temperature was 93 degrees for the month, and the average low of 75 degrees was experienced during the hours of darkness. The weather did not constitute any problems for the tactical maneuvers of the Battalion.

c. Terrain. The terrain encountered in the AO for the reporting period was primarily lowland rice paddies with patches of high ground, covered with tree-lines and bushes.

3. Organization and Operations

a. The following units were attached or detached during the month of May.

- (1) Fox Company continued as Regimental Reserve from 1 - 12 May with a squad OPCON to 1st Reconnaissance Battalion on Hill 119.
- (2) On 6, 8 and 13 May, the Pacificer from 1st Battalion, 5th Marines was OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines and was employed east of Liberty Road.
- (3) On 14 May, Hotel Company became the Regimental Reserve until 17 May, during which time one squad was OPCON to 1st Reconnaissance Battalion on Hill 119.
- (4) From 17 to 19 May, a Popular Force platoon from Duc Duc District was OPCON for a cordon and search operation in the Le Nam area.
- (5) On 19 May, Hotel Company once again became Regimental Reserve until 23 May. During this time Hotel again provided a squad OPCON to 1st Reconnaissance Battalion on Hill 119.
- (6) On 19 May, a Popular Force squad from Duc Duc District accompanied a tank/infantry operation into the Phu Nham area.

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(7) From 23 - 24 May, a Popular Force Platoon from Duc Duc District was OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines participating in a cordon and search operation of the Thon Bon area south of Le Bac Island.

(8) On 27 May, two Regional Force platoons from Duc Duc District were OPCON for a tank/infantry operation in the Phu Nhuan.

(9) On 28 May, a National Police Force unit from Dai Loc was OPCON for a cordon and search of My Hiep (1) in the Northern Arizona.

(10) On 31 May the Pacificer from 1st Battalion, 5th Marines was OPCON and was employed east of Liberty Road.

During the month of May, six tank operations were conducted east and west of Liberty Road utilizing tanks from Charlie Company, 1st Tank Battalion.

Six beacon flights were conducted during the month.

b. Supporting Arms

(1) Tactical Air Support. Air Support for the Battalion totaled 13 close air support missions. Gunships and AC's supported the Battalion on numerous occasions. Over 600 meters of tree lines were destroyed along with 24 structures. A total of 280 bombs comprising 69 tons of ordnance were dropped on targets causing 63 secondary explosions.

(2) Helicopter Support. A total of 48 Marines and 7 Civilian casualties were evacuated during the month. The average time for emergency evacuations was 27 minutes. Priority evacuations averaged 27 minutes and Routine evacuations averaged 52 minutes. Three Company sized lifts into insecure zones were accomplished during the month.

(3) Artillery and 81mm Mortars. In May, artillery expended 2,206 rounds on 83 fire missions and 4,458 rounds for harassment and interdiction fires. The 81mm mortars expended 8,157 rounds in direct support.

4. Schools and Training. During the month of May, 98 Marines attended Indoctrination Training. General Military Subjects Training was conducted every Saturday afternoon in the Battalion Rear at An Hoa. Rifle Companies, when in the Battalion Rear area, took advantage of low activity periods for further training and indoctrination. Training consisted of the following topics:

5. Logistics

a. General. During the month of May the Battalion remained in a C-1 category both in equipment on hand and equipment readiness. Four Battalion (-) field operations were supported during the period with no major logistical problems.

b. Administrative. During the past month one significant order was published. Battalion Order 5100.2A "Battalion Safety Program" has aided in the administration of the Battalion's safety program.

c. Construction Structures and Facilities. No major construction was required during the past month. The generator shed was repaired and minor construction was accomplished at Liberty Bridge.

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d. Mess Operations and Facilities. The messhall continued to provide excellent food and service.

e. Transportation. Five excess water trailers were delivered to Force Logistics Command for assignment to units out of country. The only significant shortages were two M5141's. The only significant excesses were two M718's (ambulances). Action has been taken to correct the preceding overages and shortages. During the month, two M37B1's were sent to Okinawa for repair. The motor transport deadline rate was satisfactory throughout the month.

f. Supply. The supply section provided excellent support throughout the month. The only major shortages were certain sizes of boots and a few items of general supply. All shortages are in the process of being filled. The excess program continued and is near completion.

g. Medical. The BAS remained at the An Hoa Combat Base this reporting period. No major changes were made in the physical set up of the BAS. Present strength of the BAS is one Medical Officer and 44 hospital corpsmen.

a. Malaria: Six (6) cases were reported.

b. Venereal Diseases: 3 cases: 3GC.

c. Heat Casualties: No cases were reported.

d. Rabies: No cases were reported.

e. Routine Medical Complaints: Dermatitis - 105, Gastroenteritis - 70, Orthopedic - 44, Ear Disorders - 16, Cellulitis - 31, Eye Disorders - 17, FUO - 25, Miscellaneous Disorders - 351, URI - 16.

f. Statistics. A total number of 777 patients were seen for an average of 31 per day.

7. Communications

a. Radio Transmission. Security violations have been greatly reduced during this period; however, continued emphasis will be necessary to further reduce violations. Due to increased operations with the Battalion Command Post in the field, radio equipment has been utilized to its greatest extent. At present there are no spare cipher units within the Battalion. In addition, two cipher units are still being employed at Duc Duc District Headquarters. The Division GEO indicates that some 52 additional cipher units will be invoiced to the Battalion in the near future for use down to and including platoon levels.

b. Wire Communications. The Wire Section continued to improve the existing land line, with placing emphasis on laying cable to all bunkers within the cantonment.

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8. Civic Action. All Civic Action Operations have been transferred to the Regimental S-5.

9. Statistics for the period

a. Through contacts and fire missions 103 VC/NVA were KIA.

b. During the month 296 people were detained and 73 were sent into ITT. ITT classified these detainees as 4 VC, 2 NVA, 22 Innocent Civilians, 15 Civil Defendants and 30 unclassified. Two Hoi Chans rallied to Fox and Hotel Companies respectively on 30 and 31 May 1970.

1. Heading:

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) **Unit Journal.** Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) **Section Journal.** Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) **Unit Journal.** Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) **Section Journal.** Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTC: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
