5. CHAPELAINa. Sunday Services

(1) Catholic Services. A total of 11 Sunday Masses were conducted for 2/5 at An Hoa and Landing Zone Baldy. The chaplain also held six masses for the Regimental attached units. Total attendance was 104 and 87 received communion.

(2) Protestant Services. Two Protestant Services were held for 2/5 at An Hoa and Landing Zone Baldy by the Regimental Chaplain.

b. Weekday Services

(1) Catholic Services. A total of 30 weekday services were held for 2/5 at An Hoa and Landing Zone Baldy and for the companies in the field. A total of 263 attended and 210 received communion.

c. Red Cross Cases. During the month of September, seven cases were referred to the Red Cross for action.

d. Counseling Interviews. The 2/5 chaplain interviewed 22 Members during the month.

e. Memorial Services. During the month of September, one memorial service was held.

## PART II

## NARRATIVE SUMMARY

As a result of the Battalion being fragmented by having various units under operational control of the 1st Marines, 5th Marines, 7th Marines and 11th Marines; offensive activities conducted by the Battalion were significantly reduced during the month of September.

During the month two Battalion (-) operations were conducted in cooperation and coordination with Duc Duc District Forces; one on 6 September and, the other on 14 September. These operations were deemed successful by the units involved.

Company size reconnaissance in force and cordon and search operations were conducted both northwest and southeast of Liberty Road. These operations successfully disrupted enemy foodstuff gathering activities.

Operational Control of the Battalion (-) was passed to the 1st Marines on 20 September with the mission of providing security for the engineer effort to dismantle An Hoa Combat Base, security of Liberty Road, and Liberty Bridge.

The 11th Marines assumed OPCON of four squads from Company H on 11 September for the purpose of providing security for the observation posts located on Hill's 119 and 425. OPCON of Company F (-) was passed to the 11th Marines on 26 September to provide security for Fire Support Base Ryder.

Operational Control of Company G was passed to the 7th Marines on 5 September for the purpose of assuming the mission of Combined Unit Pacification Program (CUPP) Company. OPCON was subsequently passed to the 5th Marines upon stand-down of the 7th Marines on 20 September.

Preventive countermeasures to enemy mine and boobytrap activities were stressed to all personnel especially during the Battalion (-) and company size operations.

### PART III

#### SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

#### 1. TOPICS

##### A. Personnel and Administration

(1) Strength. The Battalion strength at the beginning of September was 40 officers and 1169 enlisted. At the end of the month, the strength was 43 officers and 1277 enlisted.

(2) Replacements. During the month, the Battalion gained 9 officers and 282 enlisted personnel, and dropped 6 officers and 144 enlisted personnel from the rolls.

(3) Discipline, Law and Order. During the month, the Battalion Legal Officer processed 7 Special Court Martials, 13 Battalion Office Hours and 16 Company Office Hours. At the end of the period there were 9 Special Court Martials pending, 13 Marines on Legal Hold and 7 Marines confined in the USAFV Installation Stockade, DaNang. Three Marines were declared deserters and one is presently in an unauthorized absence status.

(4) Prisoners of War. During the reporting period, 13 individuals were detained and sent to the 13th Interrogation/Translation Team (ITT) for further processing. The ITT classified these detainees as 10 innocent civilians, two civil defendants and 1 prisoner of war.

(6) Morale and Personnel Services

(a) Postal. Effective 19 September 1970, this service displaced from An Hoa Combat Base to Landing Zone Baldy. Mail continued to be processed to An Hoa Combat Base without significant difficulty, however; a supplemental post office was established at An Hoa to increase efficiency.

(b) Awards. The Battalion processed 22 awards consisting of two Legion of Merit Medals, one Silver Star Medal, three Bronze Star Medals, four Navy Commendation Medals, 11 Navy Achievement Medals and one Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry. A total of five awards were received and two were presented while three were readdressed and forwarded to the individual's new duty station.

(c) Special Services. Beer and soda made available to the companies as funds allowed. For recreation, several volleyball and basketball courts are situated around the Battalion area and a movie is shown nightly. A library is also maintained.

(d) Rest and Recuperation. Seventy-two personnel were granted Rest and Recuperation during the reporting period.

(7) Personnel Procedures

(a) As a result of incidents involving violence and threats of violence, an order for investigating, and for detecting and apprehending those implicated in acts or threats of internal violence was published. See Annex A.

(b) Promotions. During the reporting period 111 persons were promoted; 10 to Private First Class, 63 to Lance Corporal, 1 to Corporal, 29 to Sergeant, 10 to 1st Lieutenant. Of these 8 were Meritorious Combat Promotions.

(8) Civilian Employment. Civilian Employment was used by the S-4. (See paragraph C(5) below)

B. Intelligence

(1) During the reporting period, contacts have been both friendly and enemy initiated. There have been a total of seven enemy initiated contacts and nine friendly initiated contacts. Enemy activity has been generally light and scattered. The average contact numbered 5 - 10 enemy, with most of them probably on rice gathering missions. The enemy relied heavily upon the use of mines and boobytraps to inflict friendly casualties.

(2) Weather. The weather for the month was normal for this time of the year. The average high temperature was 94 degrees and the average low was 77 degrees. There were 5.15 inches of precipitation received during the month, most of which fell during the night, thus having little effect on the Battalion's daytime activities.

(3) Terrain

(a) An Hoa. The terrain around An Hoa Combat Base is characterized by predominately wet rice paddies with scattered treelines surrounding the majority of the villages and hamlets. The Song Thu Bon River which forms the northern AO boundary is the principal drainage system for the surrounding terrain and is fed by intermittent streams which flow through the AO.

(b) Landing Zone Baldy. Approximately one half of the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines AO surrounding Landing Zone Baldy is characterized by low, wet rice paddies with treelines surrounding the populated areas. The Song Ly Ly River which forms the northern and western boundary is the principal drainage system for the AO and is fed by several small streams which drain the land. The AO is divided in half by rolling foothills which rise to form the Queson Mountains. The mountains are steep, rocky and are covered by dense triple canopy.

C. Logistics

(1) General. During the past month the Battalion (-) conducted a move from An Hoa Combat Base to Landing Zone Baldy. The movement of equipment and supplies began on 19 September. The logistical portion of the move was completed without loss or damage to equipment. The complete logistical support base was in operation on 21 September and resupply to Battalion units commenced on 22 September.

(2) Supply. Battalion Supply was the first section to displace from An Hoa to Landing Zone Baldy. The move was made in good order and the Battalion received adequate supplies throughout the month. Supplies were delivered from Landing Zone Baldy to the following positions:

- (a) Liberty Bridge
- (b) Liberty Road
- (c) Hill 34
- (d) An Hoa Combat Base
- (e) Hill 119
- (f) Hill 425
- (g) Fire Support Base Ryder

(3) Medical. The BAS moved from An Hoa Combat Base to Landing Zone Baldy during this reporting period. Sick Call, Medical Records and Medical Supply and the Administration Section are located in separate hard back offices. A forward BAS is located with the Battalion Command Post at An Hoa, staffed by an E-6 and E-3 hospital corpsman. Rifle companies are given medical support by six corpsmen and Company G (CUPP) is staffed by ten corpsmen. Present strength of the BAS is one Medical Officer and 54 hospital corpsmen.

(a) Blood Bank: The blood bank is located at the Regimental Aid Station.

(b) Veneral Diseases: 16 cases: 12 GC and 4 recurrent GC.

(c) Rabies: There were no cases reported.

(d) Malaria: Malaria diagnosis is now done at 1st Medical Battalion. Confirmed cases are reported to this command monthly by Division Report.

(e) Routine Medical Complaints: Dermatitis - 192, Gastroenteritis - 31, Orthopedic - 28, Ear Disorders - 31, Cellulitis - 45, Eye Disorders - 26, FUO - 33, Miscellaneous Disorders - 299, URI - 6, Dressing Changes - 87, Immunizations - 188, Discharge - Physicals - 82, Urinary - 27.

(4) Transportation. Trucks from 11th Motors were used to move the Battalion's equipment to Landing Zone Baldy from An Hoa Combat Base. Trucks from 1st Motors provided assistance to the Battalion while at An Hoa Combat Base. Organic transportation continued to provide internal support.

(5) Service. Barber and Laundry facilities were provided by civilian employees. They also handled Sanitation and Garbage disposal.

(6) Cantonment Structures and Facilities. At An Hoa the Battalion area was prepared for the turnover to Vietnamese units. The turnover of the cantonment was accomplished on 20 September 1970. At Landing Zone Baldy the Battalion commenced work to improve the messhall, COC bunker, offices and living areas. The main effort was directed toward preparing the cantonment for the forthcoming monsoon season.

(7) Mess Operation and Facilities. The mess section operated two messhalls most of the month. The An Hoa messhall was closed on 20 September. The Baldy messhall was opened on 18 September and a field mess was set up and in operation at An Hoa on 25 September. Several sanitation problems were encountered in the Landing Zone Baldy messhall, i.e. all water had to be transported by a M-149 water trailer. Also there were problems with the water drainage. By the end of the month most problems had been corrected.

(8) Support of Operations. The Battalion logistical element supported one Battalion (-) effort and many small unit activities throughout the month.

#### D. Organization and Operations

(1) Passage of control of the following units was effected during the month:

(a) On 5 September, 7th Marines assumed OPCON of Company G for relief of Company A, 1st Battalion, 7th Marines; to operate as the Combined Unit Pacification Program (CUPP) Company.

(b) Four squads from Company H were OPCON to 11th Marines from 11 - 30 September for security of Hill's 119 and 425.

(c) From 1 - 20 September, two men from 13th Interrogation/Translation Team (ITT) were assigned in direct support of 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines.

(d) From 1 - 20 September, one platoon of trucks from the 1st Motor Transport Battalion provided direct support to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines.

(e) On 20 September, Company G became OPREP of the 5th Marines Regiment.

(f) A search and clear operation was conducted in

cooperation and coordination with two platoons from Duc Duc District Regional Forces on 6 September. Football Island was the target of this Battalion (-) operation.

(g) On 14 September 1970, a search and clear operation was conducted by 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-) in An Tam (2) which is located in the eastern area of operations. Again two platoons from Duc Duc District Regional Forces worked in cooperation and coordination with 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-).

(h) On 26 September, Company F (-) was "chopped" OPCON to the 11th Marines for security of Fire Support Base Ryder.

(2) Supporting Arms

(a) Tactical Air Support. Air operations for the Battalion included a total of 29 close air support missions. Helicopter gunships and aerial observer aircraft supported the Battalion on numerous occasions. Over 1,470 meters of treeline were destroyed along with seven bunkers, one staging area, and five secondary fires were started. A total of 40 tons of ordnance were dropped on targets resulting in 11 secondary explosions. Nine Beacon flights were conducted during the month.

(b) Helicopter Support. A total of 48 casualties were evacuated during the month (Total includes 10 non-military personnel). The average time for emergency evacuation helicopters to arrive was 24 minutes. Priority evacuations averaged 38 minutes and routine evacuations averaged 51 minutes. Nine troop lifts were accomplished during the month.

(c) Artillery and 81mm Mortars. In September, artillery expended 2,056 rounds on 90 fire missions while 5,481 rounds were expended on intelligence targets. The 81mm mortars expended 6,619 rounds in direct support of Battalion operations.

(3) Schools and Training. During the month of September, 47 Marines attended Indoctrination Training. General Military Subjects Training was conducted every Saturday afternoon in the Battalion Rear at An Hoa. Rifle companies, when in the Battalion Rear area, took advantage of low activity periods for further training and indoctrination. Training was conducted in the following subject areas:

(2) The forward Command Post remains at An Hoa Combat Base.

Civic Action. All civic action operations in the An Hoa and Baldy Areas were assumed by 2nd Battalion, 5th Marine.

2. ENTRIES

On September at 2100H in anticipation of possible enemy action directed against Liberty Bridge, a practice emergency reinforcement of Liberty Bridge (Code word "BLACKBOARD") was smoothly executed utilizing artillery and air support. Reference: 5th Marines Frag Order 032-70. 5th Marines Message 270858Z Aug 70.

On 2 September a squad from Company E, while establishing a night ambush in the vicinity of AT916514, initiated contact with four VC/NVA resulting in one VC/NVA KIA, the finding of two separate blood trails, the capture of one AK-47 and the finding of several packs and assorted documents. See Annex C.

On 3 September at 1430H, An Hoa Combat Base received a standoff attack of five 122mm rockets resulting in negative friendly casualties or damage. See Annex C.

On 5 September, an OP from Company E, initiated contact with two VC/NVA, wounding one of them. While checking out the area a platoon from Company E detained three suspected enemy. See Annex C.

On 5 September, Operation Control of Company G was passed to the 7th Marines. Reference: CG, 1stMarDiv Message 031056Z Sept 70.

On 6 September 1970, in response to an intelligence report, the Battalion (-) with maneuver elements consisting of Companies H and F and in cooperation and coordination with Duc Duc District Forces, conducted a search and clear operation of Football Island. This operation resulted in the capture of four tons of rice and three suspected VC/NVA were detained. See Annex C.

On 7 September, Company E controlled an air strike on a suspected enemy position (grid AT925464) which resulted in one secondary explosion. See Annex C.

On 7 September, an air strike was conducted on a suspected enemy staging area (grid 895432) netting two secondary explosions. The 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines Command Post controlled the air strike. See Annex C.

On 7 September, Company G effected relief of Company A, 1st Battalion, 7th Marines and assumed control of the Combined Unit Pacification Program (CUPP). Reference: CG, 1stMarDiv Message 031056Z Sept 70.

On 11 September, the 11th Marines assumed operational control of four squads from Company H, for the purpose of providing security for the observation posts located on Hills 119 and 425. Reference: 5thMar Message 081330Z Sept 70.

On 13 September, Company E patrol found a rice cache containing 500 - 600 pounds of rice in vicinity of grid AT915497. With the concurrence of Duc Duc District Headquarters the rice was given to the Buddhist Hospital and Orphanage. See Annex C.

On 14 September, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-) with maneuver elements of Company F and Company H and two platoons of Duc Duc District Forces helolifted into An Tam (2) (grid AT961504) in the eastern area of operations for a cordon and search operation, resulting in 37 Vietnamese being detained and questioned, one PRC-25 radio, and 300 pounds of rice captured, and 10 boobytraps destroyed. See Annex C.

During the period 15 - 20 September, elements of 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines displaced to Landing Zone Baldy. (BT131454) See Annex C.

On 16 September, Company M (-), while conducting a cordon and search operation of the Khu Nham (4) (AT927497) area in the eastern area of operation, initiated contact with two VC/NVA resulting in one VC/NVA Nurse WIA and the capture of six RPG rounds. See Annex C.

On 16 September, Company F (-) reacted to a Duc Duc PF Platoon contact within 45 minutes using the mission 80 package (Pacifier). Negative results were obtained, however, coordination and reaction by Marine air/ground team were considered outstanding. See Annex C.

On 20 September, the formal responsibility for the defense of An Hoa Combat Base was passed from the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines to the 1st Battalion, 51st ARVN Regiment. An appropriate ceremony was conducted. See Annex C.

On 20 September at 1600H, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (-), consisting of Company E (Rein) and Company H (-) (Rein) along with the Battalion jump Command Post passed Operational Control to the 1st Marine Regiment. Company H (-) (Rein) provided security for Liberty Bridge and Liberty Road. Reference: 5thMar Message 2004004Z Sept 70. See Annex C.

On 20 September, Company F (-) displaced from An Hoa Combat Base to Landing Zone Baldy to become the Regimental Reserve. Reference: 5thMar Message 200930Z Sept 70.

On 26 September, Company F (-) displaced to Fire Support Base Ryden as a security force. Operational Control was passed to the 11th Marines.

Subj: Standard Operating Procedure for Investigation of Acts of Violence  
towards members of this command when such acts occur in Camp or  
Cantonment

Ref: (a) Force Order 3120.4

1. Purpose. Pursuant to provisions contained in reference (a) this order sets forth procedures for controlling the investigation and for detecting and apprehending those implicated in acts or threats of internal violence to this Command.

2. Background. Incidents involving violence and threats of violence have occurred within this Command and it is important to have a plan for reaction thereto if the security and safety of the Command is to be maintained. The Commanding Officer is determined to use all the resources at his disposal to detect, isolate and identify those who employ or threaten violence or who from within any cantonment or camp seek to injure persons or property.

3. Action.

a. Phase I. Preparation of area and people. (P-R-E-D-E).

(1) Close the exterior gates to the Cantonment. This includes the front gate and the road leading to the LL adjacent to the cantonment and will be accomplished by M&S Company HQ's.

(2) The area in which the act took place will be cordoned by the reactionary force and remaining M&S Area M&S Company. The Battalion Officer of the Day will assume immediate command of the reactionary cordon.

(3) The Battalion Legal Officer will contact HIS and CID.

(4) Each company will conduct a roll call to ascertain who is missing and who is in the area who should not be. Any personnel not indigenous to the particular organization will be taken into custody and reported to the Battalion Legal Officer.

(5) Each company will conduct a search of the general area to discover any items of ordnance or items of potential evidentiary value.

b. Phase II. Control of Personnel. (N-O-N-I-T-O-R).

(1) If discoverable, the intended "target" of violence or those who have been threatened will be removed from the area immediately by the Battalion Officer of the Day to a place of safety.

(2) All Sergeants and below will be ordered to their living quarters and directed to remain there until called.

(3) Company Executive Officers, First Sergeants and Staff NCO's will insure that movement and discussion of the event is kept at a minimum within each company area.

(4) Each set of living quarters will be searched by a team headed by the Company Executive Officer.

(5) The only information given in answer to any questions will be, "We are here to find the guilty".

(6) Company Executive Officers will report to the Battalion Executive Officer on a continual basis as to progress.

c. Phase III. Interrogation Phase. (I-D-E-N-T-I-F-Y).

(1) The Battalion Legal Officer will designate an interrogation area to be set up in a building out of sight of the restricted area.

(2) Each man within the cordoned area will be escorted by MP's from his living quarters to the interrogation area.

(3) The Battalion Legal Officer will conduct the interrogation pending the arrival of NIS and CID.

(4) Suspects will be turned over to and supervised by the Headquarters Commandant to insure that they are not allowed to converse.

(5) Company Commanders will initiate immediate legal action against those who are identified as involved in violence or attempted violence.

(6) The Battalion Legal Officer will prepare a complete narrative summary of the incident for submission to this Headquarters.

**1. GENERAL**

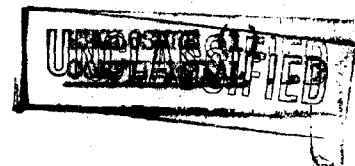
a. This is the first CUPP progress report for Golf Company, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines. (OPCON Fifth Marines)

b. Golf Company relieved Alpha CUPP, 1st Battalion, 7th Marines, in place on 7 September 1970. The CUPP Company Areas of Operation consist of nine Hamlets. Relief in place and integration of USMC, PF Forces were effected smoothly. Approximately 55% of Alpha CUPP personnel were transferred to Golf Company, thereby providing a measure of continuity.

c. The tempo of contacts and enemy actions significantly increased during the period 7 September to 11 September 1970. The 5th Marines CUPP Company, augmented with the additional strength equivalent of one platoon from Alpha CUPP transferees, aggressively undertook their basic mission of hamlet security. Marine CUPP NCOs continued to emphasize on-the-job training (OJT) for their counterparts.

**6. REMARKS**

**a. Operations**

(1) Averaging nine daylight patrols, two observation post, and 25 ambushes a day, Golf CUPP continues to provide hamlet security in its nine Areas of Operation. Platoon and company size operations, conducted on the basis of enemy activity and from current intelligence makes it very difficult for the enemy to stage or concentrate forces for attacks on CUPP hamlets. Rice Denial Operations continue to be emphasized.

On 17 September 1970, the 3rd Platoon conducted a search and clear operation in Phuoc Chi (1) Hamlet, (BT120408), on the basis of a 3rd CIT source. The operation netted three detainees.

On 24 September 1970, two units of 2nd Platoon with closely coordinated artillery support, swept Phu Dien Hai, (BT115482), and destroyed numerous bunkers. Simultaneously the 1st Platoon, with the 3rd Platoon blocking, conducted a search and clear operation through Kuan Tay (BT115389), the reported location of a VC Company.

On 28 September 1970, based on intelligence furnished by a 3rd CIT source, CUPP 2 searched for a high level espionage cadre woman. Negative results.

CUPP units provided blocking forces for four Pacification Operations.

**b. Coordination**

Daily coordination with Hoc Bai District, Que Son District, and RF/PF is achieved by both direct liaison and liaison teams.

**c. Support for District RVNAF**

(1) Golf CUPP has called/adjusted artillery support on seven occasions for RF/PF compounds under attack.

(2) Golf CUPP has medevaced 5 RF soldiers seriously wounded as a result of enemy attacks on their compounds.

**d. Training**

(1) QVT for RF counterparts began within two weeks of Golf CUPP's insertion in assigned hamlets. Immediate Action Drills, Ambush and Basic Patrolling Techniques, Medical Corporman, Rifle Marksmanship, and Care and Cleaning were taught in informal classes. In addition the example and supervision of CUPP Marines on patrol and in a defensive night perimeter reinforces basic military skills such as dispersion, movement, fire control, and noise, light, and fire discipline.

(2) Marines received training in Vietnamese Customs and Language from their Popular Forces Counterparts.

(3) Training in the use of supporting arms for CUPP Squad Leaders was accomplished. Recent experience has demonstrated that each CUPP unit is competent in requesting timely supporting arms.

e. Military Civic Action

(1) Golf CUPP engages in civic action projects only when:

- (a) Projects useful and desired by villagers.
- (b) Majority of project is planned and built by villagers.
- (c) Project is protected by local inhabitants.
- (d) Project augments GVN institutions.
